SIXTEENTH ANNUAL INTERFAITH THANKSGIVING SERVICE

The sixteenth annual New Providence-Berkeley Heights Interfaith Thanksgiving Service occurred on Monday evening, November 21, 2022, at Faith Lutheran Church in New Providence.

The participating worship communities were the Congregation Ohr Shalom-Summit Jewish Community Center, Faith Lutheran Church, Church of the Little Flower (Roman Catholic), New Providence United Methodist Church, St. Andrew's Episcopal Church, and Summit's Temple Sinai.

The service began with a welcome by Rev. Jane McCready, pastor of Faith Lutheran, which was followed by a greeting from Mayor Al Morgan of New Providence.

The Thanksgiving homily was offered by Rabbi Avi Friedman of Congregation Ohr Shalom/Summit Jewish Community Center.

The liturgy of the service consisted of prayers and readings led by each of the interfaith clergy. The music featured an interfaith choir, led by Shea Velloso, Minister of Music at Faith Lutheran. Three hymns were sung by the congregation.

Regarding the offering, the canned goods were given to the StarFish Interfaith Food Pantry in Plainfield, which is supported by an ecumenical group of religious organizations. Financial gifts were given to the Community Hope for Veterans, a program that serves our veterans at Lyons Hospital and is supported by the Islamic Society of Basking Ridge.

An open letter from the New Providence-Berkeley Heights Interfaith Clergy to the Community was included in the program of the service and was distributed to all.

\$32,700 OF FOOD COLLECTED FOR THE NEEDY

On Saturday, November 19, over eighty-five members of Faith Lutheran Church and the New Providence community gathered at Faith to sort and pack into boxes an estimated \$32,700 of canned and packaged food designated for the needy.

The food had been collected from New Providence residences by Boy Scout Troops 1 and 63 and Cub Scout Packs 99, 263 and 363. The prior Saturday, the scouts had left empty bags at the residences with requests to contribute food for pickup on November 19.

The eighty-five volunteers prepared over one hundred forty boxes of food for twenty-five families who live in New Providence. The boxes were distributed to the local residents by the New Providence Community Service Association, under the direction of Nancy Valerio. The Community Service Association added turkeys and pies to the boxes.

More than two hundred additional boxes were packed in a truck and delivered on Saturday, November 26 by Faith to StarFish Pantry, a combined Jewish/Christian organization in Plainfield. The delivery was coordinated by Chris Melhuish and seventeen other volunteers from Faith. StarFish Pantry provides emergency aid to about 9,000 people in the Plainfield area, twothirds of whom are children. While the resources of the Pantry were almost depleted, the new food will meet the needs of the Pantry throughout the winter and early spring.

Summit resident Cheryl Bock, a parishioner of Faith Lutheran Church, was the chairperson of the Fall Food Drive. For more than twenty years, Ms. Bock has fulfilled this significant responsibility.

Just like CPR, QPR (Question, Persuade, Refer) is an emergency response to someone in crisis. These are three steps anyone can learn to help prevent suicide.
