ROTARIAN CLUBS JOIN IN TO HELP VETERANS

Four New Jersey Rotary Clubs, together with General Needs, Inc., delivered needed winter clothing to 164 veterans living at Lyons VA Hospital and nearby Valley Brook Village on Saturday, December 3, 2022. This coalition does a distribution almost every month.

It is estimated that 22 veterans commit suicide every day. Many veterans are suffering from PTSD, alcoholism, or drug addiction, and some end up homeless. Military veterans put their lives and health on the line to protect our freedom. Rotarians feel that it our responsibility to help them live a decent life, with respect, and to give them support and hope.

The four Rotary Clubs cooperating in the program are The Rotary Clubs of Hillsborough, Morristown, Somerset Hills, and Westfield.

The Rotarians who volunteered are: from The Rotary Club of Westfield: Burim Regjaj, Dio Regiai, Mary Ellen O'Boyle, President Tony LaPorta, and Secretary Dr. Michael Hart; from the Rotary Club of Morristown: Ray Wenzel, Paul Nelson, and Bill Weiss; from the Rotary Club of Hillsborough: Rich Salem and Jim Machut; and from The Rotary Club of Somerset Hills: Lauren Carpenter. The staff from General Needs attending are Lonnie Sherman (who is also a Rotarian), his wife Susan Sherman, and Greg Goldstein.

Lyons VA Hospital in Bernard's Township, NJ, accepts homeless veterans. Lyons gives them a

bed and meals and some clothing, but not everything they need. The VA system offers counseling and career advice. The veterans stay at the hospital a few months, and once stable, they are moved to a more permanent facility, such as Valley Brook Village. Currently 44 homeless veterans are living at Lyons VA Hospital and 120 veterans are living at Valley Brook Village. Both facilities were built by the Federal Veterans Administration. The Hospital is administered by the VA and Valley Brook is administered by an independent private company.

General Needs is an organization dedicated to supporting veterans to help prevent suicides. The Rotary clubs raise funds to supplement the items being provided by General Needs. This month General Needs donated boots to all 164 veterans in both facilities; the Rotary clubs provided additional funds to purchase socks, and winter coats.

Rotarians have raised funds for an additional distribution of wrapped gifts containing winter hats, gloves and scarves to all 164 veterans. These will be distributed as part of a holiday party.



STUDENTS EXPERIENCE POWERFUL IMMERSIVE HOLOCAUST EXHIBIT

Westfield Public Schools

It is Period 5 at Westfield High School and students in an American Studies class are seated on the floor of a replica of a World War II cattle car as the door rolls shut. What begins in the darkness is a powerful immersive educational experience designed to help students better make connections to the history of the Holocaust and to encourage them to work together to fight discrimination and hate.

Entitled "Shadowlight: The Cattle Car -Stepping In and Out of Darkness", the traveling exhibit was set up on the high school's front lawn on December 6, with 11th and 12th graders in social studies and humanities classes cycling through the multimedia presentation during the school day. Other students and staff were invited to visit the cattle car exhibit in the afternoon.

"This experience had a profound impact on students and staff. I was fortunate to listen in on the discussions following the exhibit," says K-12 Supervisor of Social Studies Andrea Brennan. "Students asked interesting questions and provided their ideas about how to respond to hate today. They also discussed how social media platforms spread propaganda easily and have an immense impact on those that are targeted."

Inside, on the wooden flooring, are 100 sets of footprints, representing the approximately 100 Jewish men, women, and children who would have been packed into the cattle car, standing for as long as a week with a bucket of water and a few loaves of bread to barely sustain them in extreme heat or cold until disembarking at other Auschwitz-Birkenau and concentration camps.

The stories of Jewish suffering as told by Holocaust survivors accompany stark images projected onto the cattle car walls during the presentation. A generous donor provided funding to Temple Emanu-El of Westfield to bring the exhibit to the temple and the high school.

"This exhibit is so important to bring to our

community, as Holocaust awareness is diminishing and Holocaust denial is increasing," says Rabbi Ethan Prosnit of Temple Emanu-El. "I'm so proud that the Westfield High School community was able to witness this exhibit and my hope is that it will inspire our students to promote a more tolerant and understanding community."

After leaving the cattle car, each class gathered in the high school library to discuss their feelings about the exhibit and to view genuine artifacts including published Nazi propaganda, Jewish identification cards, the yellow star that Jews were forced to wear throughout Germanoccupied Europe, and the uniforms worn by Jewish and other prisoners in Nazi concentration camps, often referred to as "the striped pyjamas."

"We are extremely grateful to Rabbi Prosnit and Temple Emanu-El for sharing this incredible educational experience with our students," says Westfield Public Schools Superintendent Dr. Raymond González. "The immersive nature of the exhibit expands on the district's Holocaust curriculum, giving our students the chance to hear from Holocaust survivors and to better understand the horrors and suffering that took place."

On December 2, the "No Place for Hate" Committee at Westfield High School conducted a schoolwide signing of a Pledge Against Hate, with students, staff, administrators, and members of the Board of Education sharing the ways they are committed to living the pledge every day.

"BUILD WESTFIELD" IN LEGO

Historic Preservation Commission and Recreation Department Team Up for Workshop

"Build Westfield," a workshop where families recreate iconic Westfield buildings out of LEGO, will be held on Saturday, February 11, from 1 to 3 p.m. in Cafeteria B of Westfield High School, 550 Dorian Road. Working from photographs, fifty teams are invited to build models of commercial, institutional, and residential buildings representing a variety of architectural styles, periods, and uses. Organized by the Historic Preservation Commission (HPC) in collaboration with the Westfield Recreation Department, the program celebrates civic pride while fostering appreciation of Westfield's rich historic and architectural heritage.

"We are delighted to join forces with the Recreation Department to present this fun, interactive program that encourages families to learn about a wide variety of buildings spanning three centuries of Westfield history," said Jennifer Jaruzelski, HPC vice-chair. "After observing the level of energy this program generated in Montclair, we knew we had to bring it to Westfield and are grateful that another town entity was willing to help make it happen in its inaugural year."

"Build Westfield" is conducted by Stephen Schwartz, AIA, of Building Blocks Workshop, who has over 15 years' experience running architectural heritage programs for communities such as Princeton, Morristown and Summit. Participants will choose from among 55 photographs of notable historic structures to recreate within a two-hour timeframe using over 60,000 LEGO bricks, and then position them on a giant floor map of the town. A variety of familiar and lesser-known structures including schools, residences, houses of worship and municipal and downtown buildings will be selected on a first-come basis. Each family will take home an architectural "treasure map" describing all the historic buildings featured.

Registration for "Build Westfield" is \$40 per team (up to four people including at least one

adult) and is limited to 50 families. The program is ideal for ages 6 and up. Enrollment will open on January 4 at 10:00 a.m. at secure.rec1.com/NJ/westfield-nj/catalog. For additional information, contact Westfield Recreation at recreation@westfieldnj.gov or 908-789-4080.




