Many smiles were shared at families posed with the winter wonders.

Some of our teens were busy helping Santa at the Little Flower Cocoa and Crafts event on December 10th. They wore their finest 'ugly sweaters' and danced along with Santa during the evening.

Funds raised will be used to feed the homeless through our partnership with Bridges Outreach in Summit. Our teens will make sandwiches and fill bags with fruit, granola, and more that will be distributed in Newark, NJ.

#### **CELEBRATING ANNIVERSARY OF LIFE-SAVING HEART TRANSPLANT**

Craig Clark, 61, is taking time to reflect on the gift of life and the miracle of organ and tissue donation and transplantation as he recently celebrated four years since his life-saving heart transplant. With his health and strength now restored, Craig is living each day to its fullest by enjoying life's precious moments and spending time on his favorite hobbies, including home improvement projects, day trips and travel.

"Each day that I get to travel and spend time with extended family and friends or special events like our children's weddings or the birth

of a grandchild, I remember that it was made possible thanks to my organ donor and the care of Susan Pardi, NP, and the amazing transplant team at NYU Langone who kept me alive through heart failure," said Craig.

Now four years post-transplant, Craig is filled with energy and spends as much time as possible with his grandchild. He is also forever mindful of his organ donor who gave him the gift of life. "The only thing that I know about my donor is that he was 51 years old when he passed," said Craig. "My donor or his family's decision to be a donor has essentially given me a new lease on life."

Craig has also made it a priority to advocate for NJ Sharing Network, the nonprofit organization responsible for the recovery and placement of donated organs and tissue in the Garden State. By sharing his story with others, Craig hopes to encourage more people to register as organ and tissue donors. "One organ and tissue donor can save eight lives and enhance the lives of over 75 others," said Craig.

At the age of 17, Craig enlisted in the U.S. Marine Corps. He earned bachelor's degrees in Criminal Justice and Art History from Seton Hall University before returning to active military duty as an Artillery Officer. At that time, doctors detected that Craig had a heart murmur, and he was soon diagnosed with cardiomyopathy. Despite his critical health challenges, Craig and his wife, Anna, raised their three children, Adam,

Rachel and Nathan, and he enjoyed a successful career in transportation and supply chain management.

As years passed, Craig's heart disease grew progressively worse. He suffered a stroke and his heart stopped beating twice in a two-week period. Craig had a defibrillator implanted, but he was later diagnosed with congestive heart failure (CHF) in 2017. He was added to the heart transplant waiting list. On August 25, 2018, while admitted at NYU Langone, Craig's prayers were answered when he received "the call" from NYU Langone cardiologist Alex Reyentovich, MD that a heart was available for transplant.

"I remember answering the phone was basically the only thing that I had enough strength to do at the time," said Craig. "The next day, I had my transplant. I recovered quickly in the immediate days and weeks after transplant. I was out of the hospital in just seven days!"

Currently, there are over 100,000 Americans – nearly 4,000 of whom live in New Jersey – waiting for a life-saving transplant, according to United Network for Organ Sharing (UNOS). However, the generosity of those in the Garden State is providing hope for the future. Organ and tissue donor registrations in the Garden State continue to increase thanks to strong community education and outreach efforts and simplified ways to register. #### **BERKELEY HEIGHTS WOMAN THANKS HEROES WHO SAVED HER LIFE**

2022, the Fanwood Borough Council and Mayor Colleen Mahr honored the people they called true heroes for intervening during an October automobile accident in which the driver suffered cardiac arrest.

Bridget Keyes, a nurse from Berkeley Heights, went unconscious on October 25, 2022, and crashed her car into a fire hydrant on Martine Avenue. Rose Budka, a radiology technician who happened to be driving by, stopped to assist, assessed that Keyes had no pulse, and began CPR. Another passerby, Scotch Plains Fire Battalion Chief Dennis Hercel, also stopped and joined the life-saving effort by taking over CPR. Additional Scotch Plains Fire and Fanwood Fire units responded.

At its final regular December meeting of Ultimately, Ms. Keyes was transported to a hospital with a pulse. She recovered and had a defibrillator implanted and made a full

> "It was determined by hospital staff that the quick reaction by Ms. Budka and Battalion Chief Hercel, along with other responders, is the sole reason the victim survived the incident," read Mayor Mahr from the proclamation.

> Keyes, Budka and Hercel were reunited at the Council meeting, each receiving a copy of the proclamation. Ms. Keyes had hugs for Ms. Budka and Mr. Hercel and expressed gratitude during brief remarks. She told the Council that doctors are still unsure why her heart stopped as she had no apparent underlying condition or previous history of heart problems.



#### **CONTINENTAL MATH LEAGUE**

Berkeley Heights Public Schools

At Hughes and Mountain Park Schools, a new club is being offered to students in grades 3-5: the Continental Math League. Over 120 students are participating between the two schools. Students meet twice a month at each school and participate in different activities/challenges that activate their problem solving and critical thinking skills. For example, at a meeting in the fall, the students created different logic puzzles using pictures to represent numbers. In another example, the students were challenged to create a tower using only construction paper. There are also 'competition' days where students compete with other schools around the nation virtually.

The program is led by Math Specialist Joseph Reel who splits his time between Thomas P. Hughes and Mountain Park Schools. He told us. "I am so thrilled with the turnout and the feedback that we have gotten from the Continental Math League. Aside from the problem solving/critical thinking skills that the students are being exposed to, I think the biggest benefit of the program has been the opportunity to teach perseverance when faced with a difficult word problem. I look forward to continuing this club each year!"

Mr. Reel has been with the BHPS for 13 years. Prior to his current role as Math Interventionist at Hughes and Mountain Park Schools he was a special education teacher at William Woodruff School.




