### COLLEGE CLUB WILL HOST SPF STUDENT SCIENTISTS ON FEB. 27TH

Sanveei Suresh, Madeline Marcovecchio, Sophia Seith and Audrey Ricks, the winning team in NASA's TechRise Student Challenge, will present their experiment, the current status of their project and what they have learned working with NASA researchers, at a meeting hosted by the Fanwood/Scotch Plains College Club on Feb. 27th.

The team's vision was to create a futuristic, hydroponic farming technique that could possibly be used to explore food production in a non-gravitational environment and could become a possible food source for astronauts.

NASA's (National Aeronautic & Space Administration) TechRise Student Challenge invited teams of sixth to twelfth grade students to design, build and launch science and technology experiments on high altitude balloon flights during 2022-2023. The challenge offers hands-on insight into the design and test process used by NASAsupported researches.

The College Club of Fanwood-Scotch Plains holds monthly meetings that include informative and entertaining programs that are free and open to the public. The club also offers its members interest groups, community outreach activities and fundraising projects to generate funds for annual scholarships that are awarded to young women in our community.

# **FANWOOD LIBRARY BUILDING DEMOLISHED**

Borough of Fanwood

The Fanwood Memorial Library, a center of community activity for more than 70 years, was reduced to rubble in early January, the most visible sign yet of the planned construction of a modern new facility.

Library Director Dan Weiss stood under an umbrella in a driving rain, watching his home away from home be demolished.

"It's bittersweet, for sure," he said as an excavator operated by Messercola Company reached into the roof and walls of the building and tore it apart. It took a full day to reduce the building to piles of steel beams, dry-wall and

concrete, all of which will be cleared in the days that follow. Tree stumps were removed earlier in the day.

Construction on the new library is expected to begin in the spring of this year. Completion of the new \$8.2 million dollar facility is expected in early 2024. In the meantime, library operations have moved to Fanwood's historic train station and museum on North Avenue. Most services offered at the old building still available to the public including an expanded catalog, free WiFi and computer use and many reading programs. The library is open six days a week. The Scotch Plains-Fanwood Scholarship Foundation is currently accepting applications for high school seniors graduating in 2023 who reside in Scotch Plains or Fanwood, and residents currently attending college or other post high school institutions for scholarships. # **SECRET SERVICE AGENT SPEAKS TO SENIORS ABOUT IDENTITY FRAUD**

The first meeting of the Fanwood Seniors Club for 2023 launched Monday, January 9, 2023, with a strong message about identity fraud from the U.S. Secret Service.

Special Agent Scott Keenan, invited by Fanwood Police Director Mike Bramhall, provided a detailed presentation on the many hats worn by Secret Service agents. In addition to protecting the President, Vice President, and various VIPs, the Secret Service also investigates scams against senior citizens - the theft of personal and financial information

through email, texts, phone calls, regular mail, and in-person visits.

"Eighty percent of losses through these types of fraud occur among those 65 and older," Keenan told a very attentive audience. Seniors live alone or are lonely, they have savings, they have good credit, and are often unlikely to report the incident out of fear of embarrassment.

His message to prevent being victimized apply not only to seniors but to anyone:

- Never click on email links, even if the email looks legitimate (phishing)
- Never give passwords, usernames, social security numbers or other personal info to anyone over the phone, via text or email
- Anyone claiming to be from your bank should

raise suspicions; call the bank yourself at a number you know and trust to confirm

• Requests for you to act "urgently" should be regarded suspiciously

The Fanwood Police Department urges are easy targets, he explained, because many vigilance against identity theft and will respond to any complaint of identity theft or fraud. At its final regular December meeting of 2022, the Fanwood Borough Council and Mayor Colleen Mahr honored the people they called true heroes for intervening during an October automobile accident in which the driver suffered cardiac arrest.

Bridget Keyes, a nurse from Berkeley Heights, went unconscious on October 25, 2022, and crashed her car into a fire hydrant on Martine Avenue. Rose Budka, a radiology technician who happened to be driving by, stopped to assist, assessed that Keyes had no pulse, and began CPR. Another passerby, Scotch Plains Fire Battalion Chief Dennis Hercel, also stopped and joined the life-saving effort by taking over CPR. Additional Scotch Plains Fire and Fanwood Fire

units responded. Ultimately, Ms. Keyes was transported to a hospital with a pulse. She recovered and had a defibrillator implanted and made a full recovery.

"It was determined by hospital staff that the quick reaction by Ms. Budka and Battalion Chief Hercel, along with other responders, is the sole reason the victim survived the incident," read Mayor Mahr from the proclamation.

Keyes, Budka and Hercel were reunited at the Council meeting, each receiving a copy of the proclamation. Ms. Keyes had hugs for Ms. Budka and Mr. Hercel and expressed gratitude during brief remarks. She told the Council that doctors are still unsure why her heart stopped as she had no apparent underlying condition or previous history of heart problems.
