The weekly Our Lady of Peace Sandwich Drive, organized and run weekly by Michael Savage of New Providence, had some extra help on Martin Luther King Day from the New Providence Diversity Committee, New Providence Mayor Al Morgan, New Providence Councilwoman Nadine Geoffroy and Councilman Alex Kogan, many volunteers, and young student helpers in honor of the National Day of Service. 732 sandwiches were made with donated sandwich supplies. An additional 797 sandwiches were donated from local friends and neighbors and the Newark Academy. Together over 1500 sandwiches were donated to New Providence CSA and LINC as well as food pantries in Newark and Paterson.

This on-going weekly mission is held every Monday beginning at 1 p.m. in the kitchen at Our Lady of Peace Catholic Church, located at 111 South Street, New Providence. Anyone can come help assemble the sandwiches and/or donate sandwich supplies, fresh fruit, and individually packaged snacks. You can also donate pre-made and individually wrapped sandwiches between 1-2 p.m. every Monday at the OLP kitchen or at the rectory Sunday through Monday.

The Sandwich Drive began over 148 weeks ago during the first week of the COVID pandemic to help feed local and neighboring community residents in need, making over 168,000 sandwiches and counting.





> Since 1961, the SAGE Eldercare Workshop has offered the public fine-quality furniture repair. The volunteers will consider repairing any piece of furniture that can be carried into the workshop. The Workshop has a reputation throughout Union County and beyond for its fine reweaving of caned and rushed chairs. Our artisans are all highly trained volunteers. Proceeds from the Workshop benefit SAGE programming. Prices are reasonable and depend upon the condition of the chair or furniture item and the materials required in the restoration process.

> The Workshop started out over fifty years ago as a place for older men who no longer had access to a home workshop. Dozens of women have worked in the historically male enclave. Most volunteers are former professionals including investment bankers, college professors, physicians, and scientists. Over the years, they have taught each other caning, rushing and a

aging furniture brought to them for restoration.

The Workshop is in the basement of the SAGE building located at 290 Broad Street, Summit and is easily accessible. Shop hours are Mondays through Fridays, 8:30 a.m. – 11:30 a.m. For more information about the service, or to schedule an appointment to bring in furniture, call 908-598-5531.



NEWARK PASTOR PREACHES AT FAITH LUTHERAN

On Sunday, January 8, 2023, Rev. Moacir Weirich, pastor of St. Stephan's Grace Community Church, a Lutheran church in the Ironbound section of Newark, preached and assisted with the liturgy at the 8 a.m. and 10 a.m. services of Faith Lutheran in New Providence.


St. Stephan's is an historic church at the heart of the Ironbound section on Ferry and Wilson Streets. The church has been a hub for the Ironbound's immigrant community, since the church was built by German Lutherans in 1874.

Led by Pastor Weirich, St. Stephan's is a center of worship, advocacy and hope for the new and continuing persons of the community. The church members speak English, Spanish and Portuguese. Worship is conducted in each language.

Pastor Weirich led the Educational Forum for Faith's members. He discussed the membership and programs of his congregation as well as the issues the members and others in the community encounter.

While the problems are complex and uncertain, Pastor Weirich continues to be impressed with how well St. Stephan's members and their friends respond to difficult circumstances. He attributes this motivation to the work of the Holy Spirit. While the members of the audience agreed with Pastor Weirich, they observed that his determined leadership was influential.

Faith Lutheran has enjoyed a partnership with St. Stephan's for many years. Members of Faith tutor children of the first through high school grades, as well as give lessons in English to their parents. Each summer, Faith conducts a backpack collection, which results in Faith donating prior to school more than fifty backpacks, filled with

school supplies, to needy children of the Ironbound community. From its Christmas Sharing Tree, Faith provides gifts for the children of St. Stephan's. The Knit, Purl and Pray group of Faith has made Magic Reading Blankets, scarf sets and slippers for the children.

In the spring, Faith has invited St. Stephan's confirmands to join the Faith confirmands at a retreat.



The Friends of the New Providence Library would like to thank the community of New Providence for a wonderful 2022, and give you a preview of 2023 activities!


If you've been to our Library recently, you know that it is a busy place, filled with people of all ages with varied interests. Patrons of the Library come for many different reasons: to take in an art exhibit, attend a musical program, use a computer, work on a craft, research a homework project, attend a book club or of course, or browse for their next great read. No matter what brings you to the Library, the Friends have played a part in your top-notch Library experience.

Here are some highlights of 2022 activities and programs that were sponsored by the Friends. We were as excited as everyone else to emerge from COVID restrictions and return to in-person

activities. Beginning in the spring the Friends put fun. up new art displays on the walls of the Conti Family Community Room, the Reading Area, and the glass cabinet. After three years, the Craft Fair returned in October to a happy crowd who got a head start on their holiday shopping. The Friends curators renovated the children's area dollhouse and moved in a new "family of homeowners" celebrated with a Ribbon Cutting Ceremony with Mayor Al Morgan and the family of the original dollhouse creators. The Friends sponsored various programs for adults, kids, and teens (bubble party, Fit 4 Kids, computer coding classes, animal shows, crafts, etc.). Also back in person were movie and documentary screenings and speakers (Where the Crawdads Sing, Navajo Code Talkers, Downton Abbey, Encanto, Holiday movie shorts for kids, and many more). The Friends provided "goodies" for Books & Bagels and The Little Book of Hygge book clubs.

A significant donation was made to the library from the Friends for the track lighting in the Reading Area and towards the Conti Family Community Room's updated Audio/Visual system. JR LEAGUE AWARD NOMINATIONS SOUGHT

The Junior League of Summit (JLS) is now accepting nominations for its Jean Hudson Gano Award program for 2023. This award recognizes special volunteer achievement by either an individual or a nonprofit organization. It is given in memory of and in tribute to Jean Hudson Gano, a JLS member who died of breast cancer in May of 1997. Jean's exemplary and extraordinary commitment to voluntarism, community service, and particularly to issues regarding women and children, was an inspiration to all those who were touched by her efforts.

Nominees from the communities of Berkeley Heights, Chatham, New Providence, and Summit are eligible for the award. Individual nominees should be of high school age or above whose dedication and excellence in leadership has served their community through their volunteer efforts, either within the preceding year or as a long-term, on-going commitment. Organizations nominated should be those that benefit women and/or children within the past year and must supply verification of 501c3 status.
