FLINTLOCKS SCOUTER GROUP LIVES BY THE SCOUT LAWS

The Flintlocks, BSA, Inc. are a group of retired scouters who dedicate their time and talents to building and maintaining the scout camps of the Patriot's Path Boy Scout Council in northern New Jersey.

The group includes some tradesmen, but also professionals and volunteers of every background. Most are retired, but some still work full-time, and occasionally people volunteer to help for a day here or there. It is a very friendly group with great camaraderie and a good sense of humor. When one member reached age 100, they designated a parking spot reserved for "all Flintlocks over 100 years old". Two other members are 90 years old, but they will have to wait a while before parking in that spot.

The Flintlocks met for their Fall General Meeting on Thursday, October 20, 2022, at their workshop at Camp Winnebago in Rockaway, NJ. They reviewed the accomplishments of the previous year and discussed future projects the Council needs to have done. Some of the future projects include installing new windows in the dining hall, building a pavilion near the trading post, collecting Toys for Tots; and making craft kits and Pinewood Derby cars for special needs children.

The Patriot's Path Council of the Boy Scouts of America encompasses 5 counties in central and northern New Jersey: Middlesex; Morris, Somerset, Sussex, and Union. The Council website is ppcbsa.org. There are 11,000 scouts who use the camps in this council.

In spite of their name, the Flintlocks have nothing to do with antique firearms, although some of the old guys are considered "antiques". They meet every Thursday at Camp Winnebago, Rockaway, NJ, all year round, and guests are always welcome. They are organized as a 501c3 nonprofit corporation. All of the members are registered with the BSA, take CPR and AED training, and are vaccinated for COVID.

More than half of the Flintlocks have been

awarded the prestigious Silver Beaver Award, which is the highest National Award for a volunteer in the Scouting Program. They usually provide approximately 5,000 hours of volunteer skilled labor every year, saving the Council close to \$250,000 of labor costs.

In the past, the Flintlocks have built cabins, picnic tables, painted the dining hall, built the archery range, built all the structures at the waterfront, financed, built and equipped the STEM Lab at Allamuchy Scout Reservation, financed and built an addition to the Wink Dousa Cabin, and repaired damage to camp structures. In addition to building structures and doing repairs and maintenance, they also volunteer at many Council programs throughout the year. One popular program for Cub Scouts for which the Flintlocks volunteer is called "For the Birds". The children learn about birds and build birdhouses and bird feeders.

To date, the Adele DeLeeuw Scholarship Fund, a fund of the Plainfield Foundation, has provided over 1.4 million dollars in scholarships ranging from \$1,000 to \$5,000 over a twenty-seven year period. The awards are made in accordance with the terms of a bequest from Ms. DeLeeuw, author of 75 books, journalist and arts activist.

The Plainfield Rotary Scholarship Foundation, headed by Michael R. Townley, acts as selector for the scholarships. 

Imagine, A Center for Coping with Loss

Over 30 Imagine participants and staff gathered in the Tribute Meadow at Fairview Cemetery in Westfield held on Saturday, October 22. It's a lovely spot near the weeping willows, pond, and fountains. They came together for a Butterfly Release Ceremony arranged by Imagine staff member, Kristin Imbimbo and Sharon Rossman and Rick Ralph of Fairview Cemetery.

The ceremony included poetry, music and

reflections on grief and loss followed by the release of the butterflies. As it was a cool night, many of the butterflies chose to stay close to the warmth of the children and adults releasing them sitting on hands, shoulders and jackets as they warmed themselves before flying off. It was an intimate ceremony of remembrance and Imagine and Fairview plan to partner again in the spring to provide another opportunity for families to participate.

Imagine offers free year-round grief support groups for children ages 3-18 and young adults 19-30 who are coping with a loss due to death. Concurrently, support groups are available for the parents and guardians of the children in the groups and are offered in English and Spanish. Imagine also offers grief and loss education and training to the community.

FRIENDS OF THE WATCHUNG LIBRARY

You could have heard a pin drop in the packed room at the Watchung library as Dr. Bruce Ruck, Managing Director of the New Jersey Poison Control Center, shared inside information on the thwarting of serial-killer nurse, Charles Cullen. Cullen, now serving 11 consecutive life sentences, is believed to have killed up to 400 people in hospitals and medical centers in New Jersey and Pennsylvania.

Dr. Ruck was invited by the Friends of the Watchung Library to describe the growing suspicion around the deaths at Somerset Medical Center as 13 patients were poisoned by Cullen. It was Ruck who first told Somerset Medical management, "You have a murderer."

Ruck's fascinating, informative, and disturbing talk coincided with the opening of the movie "The Good Nurse," based on the nurse who befriended and later helped law enforcement arrest Cullen. The Friends of the Watchung Library have invited Dr. Ruck to return to the library with more stories of true crime from the Poison Center.

CRISIS LINE VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITY

Have you ever been told you are a good listener? Do you have a yearning to really make a difference? Caring Contact, a Westfield, NJ based crisis hotline, will be offering its 102nd volunteer crisis counselor training beginning March 14th through June 13th. The training will run once a week on Tuesdays from 6:30 - 9:30 p.m. and will be a combination of in-person training and via Zoom.

Participants receive 52 hours comprehensive training by nationally certified instructors in active listening and Applied Suicide Intervention Skills Training. Volunteers develop the ability to listen actively, assess the needs of someone in crisis and provide empathy and

"This training and volunteer opportunity is ideal for people of varying backgrounds retirees, empty-nesters, stay-at-home parents, and full-time professionals" said Mary Claire Givelber, Caring Contact's executive director. "Many of our listeners were looking for something meaningful to do after they retire or their children leave home. Full-time professionals also participate finding the flexible volunteer hours work well with their work obligations."

Following training new volunteer crisis counselors are supported by seasoned listeners during 24 hours of internship before they take calls on their own. Even once a volunteer is a certified listener, Caring Contact provides a range of support and training opportunities to allow them to keep honing their skills.

NEW JERSEY'S OUTSTANDING PROFESSIONAL PLANNER OF 2022

Somerset County

Walter C. Lane, Director of Somerset County's Office of Planning, Policy, and Economic Development received the prestigious "Outstanding Professional Planner" award for 2022 from the New Jersey Chapter of the American Planning Association.

In awarding Mr. Lane the 2022 Budd Chavooshian Award for Outstanding Professional Planner, the Association selected him from among 2,100 professional planners in New Jersey for his leadership expertise and "unwavering belief in the value of county planning."

Describing Mr. Lane as a "champion and change-maker in Somerset County for over two decades," the association credited him with leading Somerset County to become "the first county in New Jersey to be designated as an 'Age Friendly County' by the American Association of Retired Persons and the World Health Organization, and most recently, developed a comprehensive Somerset County Preservation Plan, which is the first of its kind in New Jersey coordinating all aspects of preservation programs including open space, farmland and historic."

Somerset County's new Preservation Plan, adopted in 2022, has received awards from Preservation New Jersey and the New Jersey

Planning Officials Association. A short video provides highlights of the plan, which was officially announced last September at the Stoutsburg Sourland African American Museum in Montgomery Township.

"Walter Lane has been an incredible asset to Somerset County throughout his entire career," said County Commissioner Paul Drake, himself a professional planner and liaison to the Somerset County Planning Board. "His foresight has helped prepare us for a strong rebound from the COVID-19 pandemic, and ensures we remain a great place to live, work, and play."

During his tenure as President of the New Jersey County Planners Association in 2020, Mr. Lane initiated a task force during the height of the pandemic to develop a long-range recovery plan entitled "Creating a Healthier, Prosperous and More Equitable Future for All New Jersey's Residents."

In its announcement of the award, the planning association looked back on a decade of achievement. "Since 2014, Mr. Lane's efforts have successfully preserved nearly 1,000 acres of open space, preserved over 820 acres of farmland, and provided over \$7.8 million in funding for historic preservation projects," the association said.

CERT MEMBERS ARE VITAL TO LOCAL DISASTER RESPONSE

Somerset County

Somerset County's Office of Emergency Management graduated another seven local residents during the November 2022 Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) Basic Training. These volunteers spent twenty-six hours over seven days learning how to support their community and first-responders when disasters strike through a coordinated, team effort at the municipal or county level.

"The expansion of our CERT volunteer base means that our municipalities and Somerset County will be more prepared to respond to disasters in the future, including those caused by the increasing frequency and severity of storms here in Central Jersey," said Commissioner Doug Singleterry, liaison to the Office of Emergency Management. "We all owe a debt of gratitude to these volunteers who give their time and expertise preparing our communities to respond in crisis, and being the foundation of our response when crises strike."

November's CERT class included residents of Branchburg, Manville, Bernardsville, Warren, South Bound Brook and Peapack Gladstone and are eligible to join their local CERT programs. Local CERTs train and organize teams of volunteers to assist their families, neighbors, coworkers and other community members during emergencies when professional responders may not be immediately available to provide assistance.

Following their full week of training in Disaster Preparedness, CERT Organization, Light Search and Rescue, Disaster Psychology, Terrorism, Fire Safety, Medical Operations and Sheltering Operations each participant must complete a written exam and practical exercise to graduate. The practical excises include "cribbing" to remove a person trapped under a heavy object using leverage, and a search and rescue simulation.

Before, during, and after disasters, CERT volunteer teams perform basic response activities, including checking in on neighbors, distribution of information to the public, supporting emergency operations centers, and helping to manage traffic and crowds. The deployment of CERT volunteers to perform these activities frees up professional responders to focus efforts on more complex, essential, and often life-saving tasks. CERT volunteers also support their communities by organizing, promoting, and participating in emergency preparedness events, activities, and projects.




