DEER FENCE INSTALLED ALONG FAMILY-FRIENDLY TRAIL

Chatham Township and Scout volunteers have installed a deer fence along a municipal hiking trail so that residents can see a one-acre portion of forest regenerate, free from the heavy overbrowsing by deer populations.

The newly-enclosed area can be seen while hiking along Chatham Township's half-mile Shunpike Trail, which is accessible from the second gravel overflow parking lot of Shunpike Fields (along Shunpike Road between Castle Park and Long Hill Chapel). The family-friendly trail is marked at the back of the gravel lot by a brown welcome sign and white-diamond blazes.

White tailed deer populations are known to be approximately 7-10 times the land's carrying capacity in parts of northern and central New Jersey, according to Dr. Jay F. Kelly, Associate Professor of Biology and Environmental Science at Raritan Valley Community College. They lack natural predators nowadays, and they thrive on the "edge habitat" created by development.

As a result of excessive deer herbivory, native trees and shrubs struggle to regenerate, leaving large gaps and invasive plant species in many of our forests, where there used to be a lush forest understory. Without the essential native plants, hundreds of species of birds, butterflies, moths, bees and other animals are now absent, so forests can't purify water, store carbon, clean the air or help our gardens pollinate as effectively.

Utilizing its Open Space Fund, Chatham Township purchased fence posts and 800 feet of eight-foot steel fencing. Fourteen Boy Scouts from Troop 8 and four BSA Scouts from Troop 280 worked as a team to unroll and install the fence on January 16th, Martin Luther King, Jr. Day. They were advised by Dr. Emile DeVito, Manager of Science and Stewardship at the New Jersey Conservation Foundation. The Chatham Township Open Space Committee also advised on the project.

Scouts titled the volunteer project, "Regrow a Forest." "I loved working on this project," said Troop 8 Scout Koen Vonderahe of Chatham Township. "Maybe we can come back with more fencing one day to make the protected area even bigger!"

"The deer-fenced area is yet another way that families and residents of all ages can enjoy our very special town," added Mark Lois, a member of the Chatham Township Committee.

Hikers along the trail will be able to see many species of native trees and shrubs regenerate in the coming years. Oak trees, for instance, have been shown to support over 500 species of moth and butterfly caterpillars, which most native birds desperately need to feed their young. Research by Dr. Douglas Tallamy of the University of Delaware found that a single pair of birds usually needs over 5,000 caterpillars to raise one clutch of eggs into fledgelings. Without the oaks and other native trees, bird populations will continue to decline across the world, he says.

Seniors will not need a ticket to attend the show on Wednesday.





CHATHAM EMERGENCY SQUAD RELOCATES OPERATIONS

It's an exciting time in the life of the Chatham Emergency Squad. For the first time in over 40 years, CES is embarking upon a major renovation of its buildings. Effective February 5, all operations have shifted from the Township building at 45 Spring Street to the Borough building at 31 North Passaic Avenue. The move is in anticipation of construction starting this spring.

The renovation, which addresses space and modernization updates, was carefully studied for over four years and was overwhelmingly approved by the membership. With the support and professional cooperation of the Chatham Township Planning Board members and the Township Administrator, Ziad Shehady, CES received its final approvals in early February. Local contractor Red Rock Construction will complete the work designed by Eric Baker Architects.

In anticipation of the major overhaul of the Township building at 45 Spring Street, the CES Operations team announced its plans to ensure a seamless operational response that maintains both the safety of its members and the high-quality delivery of medical response for which CES is known. CES Captain Nicole DiMaggio said "By planning for and minimizing the challenges of operational complexity, CES will continue to respond quickly, efficiently and effectively to every 911 call it receives. No compromise in quality or outstanding patient care will be expected or accepted despite the move from one building to the other."

The building at 31 North Passaic Avenue now holds two ambulances and is where all duty crews are stationed. CES' third ambulance is parked at the Chatham Township Volunteer Fire Department's station at 172 Southern Boulevard.

Having one ambulance in the Township is particularly convenient for responding to second, third or overnight calls where the Township location may offer a more efficient response.

CTVFD's Chief, Matt Chase said "The Chatham Township Fire Department is excited to have the opportunity to share our space with Chatham EMS while they undergo renovations. We are fortunate enough to have room in our Southern Boulevard firehouse to not only house one of their ambulances but enough space to hold a crew of EMTs during inclement weather events. We are looking forward to continuing to build our relationship with CES and working together for the duration of the building renovations."

CES Operations Lieutenant Bryan McGookin reports that "the Operations Team has examined every aspect of the move all the way down to the smallest detail. Regular rig checks, fire rehab

equipment, and middle-of-the-night response are just three of the myriad factors the team has planned for."

All administrative functions have also relocated from Spring Street. Although many aspects can be handled from members' homes during construction, larger space for Trustee and Members' meetings have been graciously supplied by The Library of the Chathams. Additionally, the trustees of the Stanley Church building offered space for training, storage, and small meeting space for the entire length of the project. Phone numbers and US mail will be forwarded to the N. Passaic building.

This move is only the first step into an extremely exciting future for the Chatham Emergency Squad. CES looks forward to sharing more details with the community as the project develops.



HOPE STUDENTS' PROJECT STICKER SHOCK TARGETS UNDERAGE DRINKING

The HOPE (Healthy Outreach using Peer The stickers are placed on the products Education) Youth Peer Leadership Group and Chatham liquor stores have partnered to remind adults over the age of 21 what the risks of providing alcohol to minors are. The Sticker Shock campaign brings awareness towards underage drinking, one of the priorities of HOPE.

throughout the store and act as "warning" labels to inform the public of the consequences they can face if they provide or purchase alcohol for minors. The message comes in loud and clear when minors are the ones spreading the word and taking action. Many are often unaware that they

themselves can get into trouble along with the individual that is not of age for providing alcohol to minors.


Five HOPE students, along with their advisor, Amy Lewis, Coordinator of the Municipal Alliance Committee of the Chathams (MACC) which funds HOPE, placed stickers on alcohol bottles and boxes in Cottage Deli and Wine on South Passaic Ave. and Bottle King on Watchung Ave. in Chatham. The stickers remind customers that providing alcohol to those under age 21 is illegal and that they could face up to 6 months of jail time or \$1,000 fine.

According to SAMHSA (the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration), adults who had their first drink before the age of 15 were 7 times more likely to experience alcohol problems than those who had not started drinking before the age of 21.

Kathleen Havens, is a long time Chatham Township resident, founding member and 20-year board member of the Art League of the Chathams.


For the past few years, Kerner won first place in the annual international photo competition of Block Drug of Jersey City, where he worked as an engineer.


Historical Online Project Dedicated on National Vietnam War Veterans Day


"Welcome Home: Morris County's Vietnam Vets," an online collection of data, photographs and facts about the Morris County men and women who served in the Vietnam War, was launched through the official Morris County website on March 29, 2022 in honor of National Vietnam War Veterans Day. The day observes when the last U.S. combat troops departed Vietnam on March 29, 1973.

The project is a collection of names, service narratives, historical information and photographs compiled by the county Office of Planning and Preservation, and it remains a work-in-progress. It is a chapter in a series of online projects known as the Morris County Veterans Compendium, in which the Office of Planning and Preservation has documented the military service of Morris County residents throughout history.

"The Morris County Veterans Compendium was inspired by a WWII veteran in 2009, who expressed that history would forget veterans' service. In order to allay that concern, Morris County works to list veterans in all conflicts," said Jan Williams, a cultural and historic resources specialist with the county.

Prior to U.S. military involvement in Afghanistan, the Vietnam War was the longest

conflict in American military history and became the focus of a social and political divide in the nation that never fully healed. Returning military service members were often left unheralded and mistreated, an experience the nation and veterans continue to reckon with to this day.

"In communicating with Vietnam veterans, I was surprised to learn from several that our American soldiers were busy 'winning hearts and minds' in Vietnam, long before we became aware

of the phrase. They cared for orphans, villagers, and worked tirelessly to leave Vietnam a better place. Although the veterans mentioned a lingering bitterness about the way they were treated upon return, they choose to focus on the honorable service they rendered during Nam," said Williams.

The public is urged to continue reviewing the downloadable Vietnam collection to offer updates, additions and particularly photographs that will enhance the experience of those, particularly veterans, who view the webpage. The Office of Planning and Preservation has reached out to the public in the past to build webpages memorializing Morris County residents who served in the nation's armed forces during other eras. An accounting of Civil War men of color affiliated with Morris County was initially launched in 2018, and the office continues to update its list of more than 3,000 residents who were part of The Greatest Generation – Morris County in WWII.

A page dedicated to veterans of the Spanish-American War and Philippine War was launched in 2021.

For the Vietnam page, a Vietnam veteran who was born in Morris County or has been a resident of the county for ten years is welcome to be recognized by submitting his or her information. The families of Vietnam vets who have passed on also may submit their information.

If a veteran has retired out of state, they qualify for listing, too.

The type of information needed for the project includes the names of the Vietnam veterans, their Morris County municipality, their service branch, battles or incidents participated in, and awards or citations issued. Of course, photographs are always appreciated.






