

#### **REGISTER FOR FREE COURSE ON MENTAL ILLNESS**

The NAMI Family-to-Family Education training. Course will be offered by the Union County Chapter of NAMI (National Alliance on Mental Illness). The course will start on Thursday evening, March 9, 2023 and meet each Thursday over a consecutive 9-week period. It is free-ofcharge, with all necessary materials furnished at no cost.

The course is offered specifically to the parents, siblings, spouses, teen-age and adult children, and significant others of individuals with severe and persistent mental illness. The program is not appropriate for individuals who, themselves, suffer from one of the major mental disorders. This course is taught by NAMI members who have completed intensive

Curriculum topics include: schizophrenia, bipolar disorder (manic depression), clinical panic depression, disorder, obsessivecompulsive disorder, etc., the clinical treatment of these illnesses, and how caregivers can learn to cope more effectively. Attendees will learn about new research, medications, skills needed to successfully communicate with a relative, and how to deal with critical periods.



# GARWOOD DID YOU KNOW?

#### The Garwood Historical Committee

Garwood presently has 3 churches, St Anne's Catholic Church on 2nd ave; the Unitarian Liquid Church on Center St (formally St Paul's Episcopal); and The Garwood Presbyterian Church on Locust Ave. But did you know we also had 2 other churches in town for a total of 5 at one time?

St. Mark's Episcopal Church built in 1907 was originally located at 431 Locust Ave. near the corner of West St and then in the mid-1920's the building was physically moved to 400 Beech Ave. It was shuttered and demolished in the late 1950's. The Pillar of Fire Christian Church with origins from Zarapath, NJ was built by the parishioners at 146 Willow Ave in 1929. It was active into the late 1950's but sadly closed and was demolished by mid-1960's. Homes now occupy both of those properties. Our little boro was certainly blessed. And now you know!




