FIRE ACADEMY CELEBRATES FIRST GRADUATION CEREMONY

Somerset County held its first Fire Academy Graduation on Friday, January 27th, adding 38 new firefighters to 24 Central Jersey departments that protect the public during home fires, floods, and other life-threatening situations. The graduation Ceremony was the first since COVID arrived in 2020 and was a celebration not just of the accomplishments of the graduates, but of the gift of safety and hope firefighters and other first responders give the public every day.

"It is no small thing to commit to enter a burning building, to carry dozens of pounds of gear on your back into unfamiliar spaces, to be ready to save someone else's life at a moment's notice," said Commissioner Deputy Director Doug Singleterry at the celebration. "You give us all the faith that our homes and loved ones are protected at all times, and that when disaster strikes there are highly skilled, highly trained, highly motivated neighbors ready to come give us the help – and hope -- we need to recover."

Founded in 1991, the Fire Academy is part of Somerset County's Emergency Services Training Academy in Hillsborough, NJ, as part of the Office of Emergency Management. The Academy is tasked with providing educational training and certification for fire, EMS, CERT, Law Enforcement, Emergency Management, search and rescue, amateur radio testing, hazardous materials handling, and other public safety personnel in Somerset County and throughout the state.

"This is an exciting day. This is our first live graduation of the Somerset County Fire Academy since before COVID, so a nice round of applause for a little return to normal," said Somerset County Office of Emergency Management Director Lisa Werner, who oversees the Emergency Services

Training Academy.

The Somerset County Emergency Services Training Academy has classes for aspiring and experienced firefighters, EMTs, CERT members and other first responders schedule throughout the spring and summer of 2023. A MESSAGE FROM POLICE REGARDING RESIDENTIAL BURGLARY AWARENESS

There has been a recent increase in residential burglaries that have occurred in Green Brook Township and throughout the entire state of New Jersey. The Green Brook Police Department would like to take this opportunity to provide some information to our residents to help reduce the possibility of becoming a burglary victim.

- Report ANY and ALL suspicious activity you may see in your neighborhood.
- Install quality door locks and dead bolts to all exterior doors of your home.
- If you do not have one or both, install an alarm system and surveillance cameras on the exterior and interior of your home. Make sure the alarm is monitored by a central station that will immediately notify the police first when there is an activation. Additionally, when you install cameras ensure that the system has a views of the street, driveway, all door entrances, and perimeter if possible.
- If you already have these systems, make sure you activate them and ensure that they are working properly. We suggest you have a battery/cellular backup installed and your system has remote monitoring capabilities.
- Install motion lights on the perimeter of your property and make sure the exterior of your home is always well lit during all nighttime hours.

- Communicate with your neighbors. Advise them when you are going on vacation or extended weekend trips so they can monitor your home. Have them take in your mail, package deliveries, garbage/recycle cans, and report any activity that may be out of the ordinary.
- DO NOT post on any social media sites that you are on vacation and for how long. We advise that you post any pictures/events from your trip after you return home.
- Fill out a vacation house check form at the Green Brook Police Dept. if no one is available to check on your residence when you go on vacation or extended weekend trips. Once the form is submitted, your home will be specifically checked by the patrol division in your absence.
- Keep any valuables and or cash in a home safe that is secured to the floor or wall. In the event you do not have a safe, secure these items in a well hidden location that is not in your office or bedrooms, including your safe.

The Green Brook Police Department takes all investigations and the safety of our residents seriously. We encourage you to report any suspicious incidents no matter how minor it may seem to 732-968-1188. For any emergencies, please dial 911.

Children will experience different losses in life: divorce, moving, friendships ending, sports injuries or the death of a friend or family member. Imagine, A Center for Coping with Loss is working to create grief informed communities where children will be surrounded by adults who are able to provide support as they cope with these losses.

On Tuesday, March 21st from 7:00–8:30 p.m., Imagine will offer a webinar on Supporting Children Coping with Loss for anyone who wants to learn how to support a child who is grieving. While loss due to death will be the primary focus of this webinar, the concepts that will be presented are applicable to all types of loss. It is especially important for parents and grandparents, guardians, teachers, members of community organizations, coaches, therapists, counselors, and social workers to attend this program. The webinar will be offered in both English and Spanish.

THOSE WHO ATTEND WILL BE ABLE TO:

- 1. Define the terms "loss," "grief," and "mourning"
- 2. Understand the different types of loss and the impact of those losses
- 3. Identify similarities and differences on how children, teens, and adults experience their grief
- 4. Learn how to support someone who is grieving

Diane Fleming of Westfield will be honored as 2023 featured quilter. Known for creating one-of-a-kind king-sized works of her own design, Fleming's 13-year journey as a quilter will be explored through 20 spectacular themed quilts. "My interests in art history and watercolor

painting influence my fabric and design choices," said the avid gardener and mother of three grown sons, who will also display examples of her painting and needlework.

Linda Blauvelt, artist-in-residence, will exhibit original oil paintings. A quilter for many years, she has branched out into this second art form, recently displaying her work at the Westfield Public Library.

A memorial tribute will be on display for Peg Foy, coverlet expert and prolific miniature quilter. Late Harvest Quilters founder Ann Eelman will also be remembered.

In addition to viewing a full array of modern, traditional bed-sized, art and wall hanging quilts, attendees can participate in viewer's choice awards, kid's scavenger hunt, vendor area and a tearoom for snacks or lunch.



FLINTLOCKS SCOUTER GROUP LIVES BY THE SCOUT LAWS

The group includes some tradesmen, but also professionals and volunteers of every background. 

provide approximately 5,000 hours of volunteer skilled labor every year, saving the Council close to \$250,000 of labor costs.

In the past, the Flintlocks have built cabins, picnic tables, painted the dining hall, built the archery range, built all the structures at the waterfront, financed, built and equipped the STEM Lab at Allamuchy Scout Reservation, financed and built an addition to the Wink Dousa Cabin, and repaired damage to camp structures. In addition to building structures and doing repairs and maintenance, they also volunteer at many Council programs throughout the year. One popular program for Cub Scouts for which the Flintlocks volunteer is called "For the Birds". The children learn about birds and build birdhouses and bird feeders.

FREE TAX-AIDE PROGRAM FOR SOMERSET COUNTY RESIDENTS

Somerset County's Volunteer Services and AARP are teaming up again to provide the Tax-Aide program to help residents prepare their taxes. The free tax-counseling service is available to all county residents, but designed specifically for older adults, residents with disabilities, and lower-income residents who need help preparing federal and New Jersey income tax returns.

Tax counselors will review and prepare residents' New Jersey and federal tax documents and file their documents electronically. To ensure they are up to date on current tax laws and forms for both the federal and state governments, volunteer counselors receive annual training and are tested and certified by the Internal Revenue Service and have had their backgrounds checked by Somerset County Sheriff Darrin Russo's office.

This year, there will be approximately 57 volunteers providing direct support to residents at six sites in Somerset County, including Montgomery, North Branch, Manville, Bridgewater, Franklin, and Green Brook.

Tax returns are filed electronically, enabling taxpayers to obtain a more rapid refund if they are eligible. Taxpayers will receive a paper copy of their federal and state returns. Volunteers also can assist with preparing Property Tax Reimbursement (PTR) forms for homeowners ages 65-years or older who meet eligibility requirements.

APPOINTMENT GUIDELINES

Residents must schedule an appointment to receive tax assistance. Appointments are available through April 17. Residents are required to bring the following items to their appointment:

- 2022 W-2 forms
- Bank, broker, and Social Security Statements from tax year 2022
- Total of all medical expenses and all other deductible expenses from 2022
- Copy of 2021 tax returns
- Property Tax Reimbursement (PTR) forms for homeowners ages 65-years or older who meet eligibility requirements. Please bring the following to complete your PTR:
- The blue booklet received in the mail and prior year's tax return
- Documentation for property taxes paid and other deductible expenses.


