HIGH SCHOOL OFFERS EXPANDED ELECTIVES IN TECH, ARTS & MORE

Kenilworth Public Schools

Classes in graphic design, ceramics and Esports might sound like niche activities that students participate in after school.

But David Brearley High School offers these courses as part of a varied mix of electives.

Esports was introduced at the start of the school year, as were Digital Sound Engineering, Dance, Sports & Entertainment Marketing, and Exploring College and Career Opportunities. Another new entry, Young Adult Literature, begins in the second semester.

Brearley develops electives that encourage innovation and exploration, according to Principal Jeremy Davies.

"We want students to have the opportunity to take classes in their interests," he said. "And classes that emphasize technology are right in line with our district's goal of preparing futureready students."

A successful October bond referendum permits the district to make building additions and renovations that expand science and technology instruction.

Brearley's current electives in tech-centered subjects also include:

- Video Game Design
- Advanced Placement (AP) Computer Science Principles
- Introduction to Computer Programming
- Web Design I and II
 Students in the new Digital Sound Engineering

class have quickly embraced the opportunities to create music, Davies said.

"I heard from a student who recorded her voice, laid her voice over tracks and she's just come alive with that and is really proud of it," he said.

Students will met with their counselors before selecting their courses for the 2022-23 school year in February.

Brearley offers a rich variety of classes for every interest, including art, writing and business. Students who might have difficulty focusing in a typical classroom setting have thrived in handson classes such as ceramics, Davies noted.

Course selections also include more traditional electives such as journalism, public speaking and graphic design, all of which help students develop important career skills.

"When students are selecting their classes, they should consider where they see themselves after high school," Davies said, noting that electives could even rule out some potential career paths. "A student could think, 'I might want to go into business, so it might be good for me to try out accounting. If I hate accounting, I won't want to go into business."

WHAT WHERE AND WHEN IN OLD KENILWORTH

VISITING SHALLCROSS POND — 60 YEARS LATER

treasure. Fairly well known to townspeople, knowledge of it has slipped away over the decades from others not living here.

At one time the pond was readily visible to occupants of numerous vehicles daily passing by along old Springfield Rd at the end of N. 14th and 15th streets. Over the decades trees and underbrush grew along the roadway and into Black Brook Park where the pond is situated. In time the view of this Kenilworth gem from the road became nearly totally hidden from sight.

The pond's waters spill over the sluice of its stone dam and drop below creating the headwaters of the Black Brook. The brook bed has become filled with debris from dead and growing brush. But Shallcross Pond itself remains as serene as its earliest beginnings, whose creation is attributed to gullies and lowlying areas formed during the Ice Age.

The pond is located in Black Brook Park which is part of the Union County Park system created by voter referendum in 1921. The park is nearly 19 acres and includes lands that once were part of the old Upsala College campus and portions of the Shallcross farm and private airfield. The Shallcrosses were a founding family of Kenilworth arriving in 1898. According to Ruth Shallcross Powers (1928-2015), her grandfather,

Shallcross Pond is somewhat of a hidden local businessman and philanthropist Joseph Shallcross (1878-1951), donated the pond and the area around it to the Park Commission. In 1978 Union County government officially named it Shallcross Pond to honor him and the family.

> The pond is known for winter ice skating, fishing for catfish that once were rather prolific there, and waters especially stocked for local fishing derbies. Years ago, the area around the pond was known as Frog Hollow due to countless tiny frogs in the grasses surrounding the pond.

> As brother and sister, Arthur and Shirley Vitale, now senior citizens, often visited the pond area when children and climbed Water Tower Hill. A 1954 photo of them standing atop the dam reveals the pond, a fully exposed water tower, and a hill not fully covered with trees. A few years ago, they revisited the site where another photo was taken. Shirley recalls picking blackberries there as a child and Arthur remarked about the trails he followed. Many things have changed in the more than 60 years since they played around Shallcross Pond, but the pond remains serene and welcoming. It's worth a visit.

TEEN HELPS RAISE MONEY FOR FAMILIES FACING PEDIATRIC CANCER

up with retired NFL Coach Tom Coughlin to raise money for local families facing pediatric cancer on October 21 at Cipriani 42nd Street, New York. In a speech to a crowd of nearly 500 professional athletes, celebrities and supporters at the Tom Coughlin Jay Fund's annual Champions for Children Gala, Swandrak shared his own journey of being diagnosed and treated for acute lymphoblastic leukemia and his subsequent relapse earlier this year. The Jay Fund, the nonprofit founded by the two-time Super Bowl winning coach of the New York Giants, marked its 17th year of providing financial, emotional and practical support for families tackling pediatric cancer in the New York/New Jersey Metropolitan area.

Swandrak knows all too well the challenges families face when a child is diagnosed with cancer, and he is passionate about raising awareness and funds to support them. He has spent much of the last four years enduring grueling cancer treatments and being isolated from his friends due to his immunocompromised condition. His family, like all families who have a child with cancer, has faced expensive medical bills coupled with rising inflation and recordhigh food costs.

Swandrak and his family have been supported by the Jay Fund throughout his treatment.

"The Jay Fund covered our mortgage

In a speech to a crowd of nearly 500 payments when our bills became overwhelming and has given me experiences that I will never, ever forget," Swandrak told the crowd of current and former New York Giants, business leaders and Jay Fund families and supporters.

Swandrak's emotional words captivated the audience, and his speech was one of the highlights of a night that raised \$1.25 million for the Jay Fund and the families it serves in the New York/New Jersey Metropolitan area.

"Nick is a remarkable young man and a current Jay Fund scholarship recipient," said Mary Jane Pulzello, Managing Director of the Tom Coughlin Jay Fund in NY/NJ. "He received a standing ovation, as many were deeply moved by this young man's courage and tenacity in fighting cancer for more than four years."

Swandrak thanked his medical team who continue to help him through this fight, as well as his friends and family who have lifted him up from day one. He saved his most heartfelt appreciation for his parents, stating their love and support have been everything to him.

"As of today, I've had 126 chemo shots, 28 spinal taps, and over 200 days sleeping on scratchy hospital sheets," Swandrak told the crowd. "Fighting cancer is tough. You're in bed, and sick a lot of the time. There are days that are a real struggle. But I'm looking forward to ringing that bell for the second time this December and being back in remission."




