## **CHINESE NEW YEAR PARTY FOR COUNTY SENIORS**

Somerset County seniors were invited to join the fun of a free Chinese New Year celebration held at the Somerset County Senior Wellness Center in Bridgewater on Wednesday, Jan. 25. Entertainment included line dancing, Tai Chi, a martial arts demonstration, a musical performance, and educational information about the Chinese New Year.

Participants had the opportunity to practice Tai Chi and dance the Mayim-Mayim, which is an Israeli dance adopted by Asians. The Hulusi (gourd flute) solo performance and a sword-drawing demonstration will captivate any audience. Seniors will also learn fascinating facts about the Chinese New Year.

A lunch with an Asian Flair was served. Including: Chicken & Vegetable Dumplings, Vegetable (edamame) Dumplings, Roast Beef with Provolone Cheese Sandwich, Tomato, Arugula, Cheddar Cheese & Pesto Sandwich

All senior centers offer a nutritionally balanced lunch at noon, Monday through Friday. The menu choices include both hot and cold lunches, with and without meat. Lunch reservations should be made by 10 a.m. the day before attending. There is a suggested lunch donation of \$2.50 for anyone ages 60 and above. #### **ABOUT THE CHINESE NEW YEAR**

The Chinese New Year is a 15-day festival that Chinese communities celebrate globally. The holiday is often called the Lunar New Year because it follows the phases of the moon. This year it begins on Jan. 21 and ends on Feb. 20, or until the next full moon.

This year is called "Year of the Rabbit because the Chinese New Year coincides with the Chinese Zodiac sign the rabbit. There is a repeating zodiac cycle lasting 12 years, with each year representing a zodiac animal that has special attributes. In the Chinese culture, the Rabbit is a symbol of longevity, peace, and prosperity. People born in the year of the Rabbit are called "Rabbits" and are believed to be vigilant, witty, quick-minded, and ingenious.

# LIBRARY PROVIDES ADAPTIVE KEYBOARD FOR COMMUNITY USE

The Somerset County Library System of New Jersey (SCLSNJ) Somerville branch has a new resource available for customers to use for free - with or without an SCLSNJ library card. This device is an adaptive keyboard called a Maltron Keyboard.

An adaptive keyboard fits the shape of hands and the different lengths of fingers to reduce movement and tension, has tilted keys and pads to further reduce muscle tension, has straight vertical key columns to eliminate tens of thousands of finger and wrist twists in a day's work, and much more.

"We - as a branch, as a System - wanted to look at helping anyone that walks into the branch," said Rebecca Crawford, branch manager. "This keyboard is designed for anybody with mobility issues in their hands. This gives us the option to say, 'you know, we have this special adaptive keyboard that we can plug in, that you can use anytime you're here at the library.' We want to have something that you're comfortable with and something that you can use to make your digital traveling easier."

Continued Crawford, "We want to make the branch welcoming to everybody who walks in the door. And, we want to make sure that every

The keyboard was purchased with funds that the branch was awarded in 2022. The PLA Digital Literacy Workshop Incentive, supported by AT&T, provides support to libraries of all sizes to conduct digital literacy training in their communities and help close the digital divide.

"We want to try to do everything we can to help someone in the best way that we can," said Rachel Bohach, adult services library assistant. "Once we received the magnifier donation, then we started thinking of all the things that could be possible and what we were missing."

The Maltron keyboard is available to all customers of the Somerville branch during open branch hours. The keyboard is easy-to-use, and both Crawford and Bohach urge customers to not hesitate to ask for the device.

"Please don't come in and say, 'we don't want to bother you'," said Crawford. "It is no bother. This is easy for us to set up. We want to set it up for you!"

## ORGAN DONATION IN NJ REACHED NEW ALL-TIME HIGH IN 2022

NJ Sharing Network

Carolyn M. Welsh, President and CEO of NJ Sharing Network, the federally-designated nonprofit organization responsible for the recovery of donated organs and tissue in the state, announced the number of organ donors (283) and organs transplanted in a single year (670) reached all-time highs in 2022.

These unprecedented totals mark significant increases over the previous records of 233 organ donors and 613 organs transplanted. This also marked the fourth consecutive year NJ Sharing Network has reported new records in the number of organ donors, underscoring the clear trend of increased support for organ donation in the Garden State.

"Thanks to the generosity of New Jersey organ donors and their families, more lives were saved last year than ever before - ensuring

others now have more time to share special moments with their loved ones," said Welsh.

In 2022, the 670 organs transplanted included 350 kidneys (all-time high), 170 livers (all-time high), 71 hearts, 58 lungs, 20 pancreata and one intestine. In addition, 40,000 eye and tissue gifts enhanced the quality of life for those in need. Tissue donations include corneas, heart valves, skin grafts, bone grafts, saphenous veins, ligaments, and tendons.

According to United Network for Organ Sharing (UNOS), nearly 4,000 people in New Jersey are on the organ transplant waiting list. One organ donor can save eight lives, and one tissue donor can enhance the lives of over 75 people.
