MENS' CLUB HOLDS RECORD SETTING BOXING FUNDRAISER

After a 3-year hiatus due to COVID, the College Men's Club of Westfield (CMC) held a record-setting "Friday Night at the Fights" fundraiser to benefit the CMC Scholarship Fund. On Friday, February 10th, a sold-out crowd of more than 260 attendees assembled at the Kenilworth Veterans Center to watch 11 amateur bouts refereed by officials of the NJ Association of USA Boxing. The evening generated gross proceeds of more than \$63,000 for the club's scholarship fund from ticket sales, a 50/50 raffle, a live auction, and sponsorships by two local businesses. These results vastly exceeded all previous years' totals.

CMC President Dave Germond noted that, "the CMC is thrilled to see return of this long-standing fan favorite event, which has traditionally been a critical element of our annual fundraising". Germond further highlighted that "the CMC is extremely grateful to our Platinum Sponsor, Ray Catena Mercedes Benz of Union and our Gold Sponsor, Rumble Boxing of Westfield for their generous support."

Also in attendance was Gerry Cooney, professional boxing legend, multiple-time Heavyweight contender, and Fanwood resident who donated for auction a boxing glove autographed by himself and former world Heavyweight champion Larry Holmes. The signed glove raised \$2,300 during the live auction. The CMC also announced it will be donating to New Jersey Give a Kid a Dream, an organization led by NJ Boxing Hall of Famer, Jackie Atkins which provides school support, counseling and nutrition for kids in economically challenged communities "We are thrilled to expand our partnership with Jackie Atkins. We have been working together for almost 15 years and our collaboration is a force for good across the community" remarked Shawn Hanna, CMC Boxing Chair and past President.

Some highlights from the 11 bouts held that evening include in the 114-lb weight class, ranked #2 nationally Jessica Herrera of True Warriors Boxing prevailed over challenger Yasmin Lopez in a three-round decision. Later in the evening, Jean-Pierre Valencia brought the crowd to its feet with a fusillade of body blows to score a riveting decision over former Golden Gloves champion Abedallah Eliawiah in the 165-lb weight class. "Our Boxing Night is always highly anticipated among our donors, we are thrilled to simultaneously support our scholarship fund and also provide a platform for these young boxers to showcase their skill and hard work, and take their boxing careers to the next-level." Germond continued.

The College Men's Club of Westfield was founded in 1922

and over the past century has helped hundreds of Westfield young men by providing college tuition assistance and funding standardized test preparatory courses. Since its founding, the CMC has raised and distributed over \$1.3 million in higher education assistance to young men of the Westfield community. In 2022 the CMC awarded \$61,500 in four-year scholarships and one time grants to Westfield High School graduating seniors.

Scholarship applications are currently available online at the CMC's website and are evaluated by a committee of CMC Trustees in late Spring. This year's application deadline is May 15th. Funds for scholarships come from fund raising events like the annual Boxing Night, donations, membership dues, endowment investment income, and legacy bequests.



STUDENTS HEAR IMPACTFUL PRESENTATIONS ON THE HOLOCAUST

Westfield Public Schools

In recognition of International Holocaust Remembrance Day, students in the Westfield Public School District participated in a series of impactful classroom and schoolwide experiences that provided meaningful context to the school district's Holocaust and Genocide curriculum.

During a visit via a remote live feed to 7th grade social studies classes at Edison Intermediate School on January 30, Holocaust survivor Eva Safier Wiener - who was 10 months old when she and her parents escaped Nazi Germany - recounted her family's harrowing journey.

The Safiers were among 900 Jewish passengers to board the M.S. St. Louis, a German transatlantic liner docked in Hamburg and bound for Cuba in May 1939. Denied permission to dock in Cuba, the United States, and Canada, the ship's captain vowed not to return his Jewish passengers to Germany, instead finding four countries - Holland, Belgium, France, and England - who were willing to divide up the passenger manifest and welcome the asylum seekers. Despite having relatives in the Netherlands, Wiener said her father chose to put his family on the list for England "to get as far away from Adolf Hitler as possible." The family eventually settled in the United States after World War II.

Many of the passengers who went to the other three countries, Wiener said, were eventually sent to concentration camps as the Nazis continued to invade their neighbors.

"When you see someone in the next 24-hours, I want each of you to repeat the story you hear

today," Wiener told the 7th graders, whose virtual visit was arranged in coordination with the Holocaust Council of Greater MetroWest New Jersey. "You will become the voice of the survivors."

As part of a Historical Fiction unit, 5th graders read "Number the Stars" by Lois Lowry, a historical fiction novel that follows a friendship between a Jewish girl and a Christian girl in Copenhagen and their journey to freedom during World War II.

Eighth grade students experienced a two-week interdisciplinary unit titled "The Holocaust: What Hate Can Do." The unit was held simultaneously in language arts and social studies classes.

"The theme 'why we remember' was common across all of these experiences," says K-12 Supervisor of Social Studies Andrea Brennan. "Reading novels, listening to survivor stories, and experiencing dramatic performances helped

students learn and understand the varied experiences people had during the Holocaust."

At Edison and Roosevelt Intermediate Schools, students in each grade level also attended a special assembly from the Seattle, Washington-based company "Living Voices," which combines live performances, archival film and sound, and discussion. Through the accomplished storytelling of a solo performer, the students listened to "Through the Eyes of a Friend" which is told from the viewpoint of a fictional "best friend" of Anne Frank.

Superintendent Dr. Raymond González thanked Mrs. Wiener and all who shared these special learning experiences with the students.

"The opportunity to provide real-life context to our Holocaust curriculum is invaluable," says González. "We hope our students come away from these lessons with a renewed determination to always speak out against hate."

the willingness to risk for what he or she believes is right; absolute acceptance of others; respect for diversity;


great personal integrity; deep caring and willingness to listen; the strength and ability to lead by example.


