AUTOGRAPH SIGNING EVENT FOR HIGH SCHOOL CAST

The Chatham High School cast of Beauty and The Beast was rehearsing "The Mob Song" scene on stage earlier this month, but the atmosphere out in the lobby was just as energized.

The bustling activity was the result of a donation by Greg Dailey, owner of Chatham's Legends Gallery @ Frames on Main, of Beauty and the Beast posters for the cast to sign.

"Best autograph event ever," Dailey commented, as he guided the students through their first organized autograph signing. He's hosted many athlete signings, think Mets, Jets, and Rangers players, to name a few.

Proceeds from the sale of the posters will go toward supporting the performing arts in the district.

While some students were rehearsing on stage, others were lined up in the lobby waiting for gold-ink markers to sign their names.

"I'm only a napkin," said sophomore Elena Latorre, featured dancer, surprised that the entire cast was included in autographing the posters. She is playing one of the dancing napkins in the Beast's household staff.

Some students signed quickly, some took their time. Some signed in cursive, others printed – the better to be legible and recognizable.

"Thanks so much for doing this," said senior Tommy Nonnenmacher, who plays Lumiere, the enchanted candelabra, as he considered how to fit his lengthy 12-letter last name on the poster.

He quickly came up with a solution: Tommy Nonny.

Dailey shared signing pointers learned the hard way during autograph sessions with famous athletes. Lefties should sign near the bottom, he said. Otherwise, they'll inadvertently smudge other signatures if their arms drag across the posters when signing higher up.

He brought his colleague, Tonia Lofaro, to the event to keep things moving along—having 48 kids sign 48 posters in between rehearsing their scenes is no easy feat.

A supporter of the Chatham Performing Arts Boosters' events such as the holiday-themed Night of Music that was held downtown, Dailey also wanted to support Chatham High School's production of Beauty and Beast. He noted that it is his daughter's favorite Disney movie.

"It's not lost on me the amount of time and effort kids put into their extracurricular activities," said Dailey, a father of three whose kids all played sports." So when I see an opportunity to help them feel great about what they're doing, I go for it."

The support is very much appreciated. "At the beginning of the past school year, our organization had begun an effort to connect the school district's performing arts program with the greater community, bringing our events downtown and encouraging families to visit stores and restaurants," said Janine Vecciarelli, CPAB president. "What we did not anticipate was the amazing response in return from our local businesses for our schools' performing arts programs. Greg has been a constant champion of our organization's efforts. We are so grateful for his positivity and his support."

Outside, food trucks Twelve Truck and Eddie Dee's Global Eats served hot food to the chilly crowd.

A mobile coffee trailer slated for the event was incapacitated but drinks from Dunkin' on Main Street came to the rescue. Freshmen Key Club members Summer Tedesco and Lacey Polychronopoulos helped set up a pop-up coffee station and ably filled the need for coffee and hot chocolate.

> Baird-Hassell was planning to do a food drive for the pantry, but learned that there was also a need for pre-made lunches.

> Every Wednesday, 30 to 50 cars—containing from one person to entire families – line up in the church's driveway, sometimes spilling onto Main Street, to receive groceries.

> It is nice to offer them a ready-made meal, too, said senior pastor, Rev. Jeff Markay. Most of the recipients are from Chatham and neighboring towns.

> The physical pantry, which is located in two sheds behind the church, is accessible 24 hours a day, seven days a week. It was organized in the early days of the Covid-19 pandemic to help neighbors in need. The pantry's motto is, "Take what you need, leave what you can."

> "Troop 8 has helped collect food for the pantry in the past", said Bob Weber, assistant Scoutmaster, who helped with the service project.

> The pantry is always in need of pasta, all canned proteins, boxes of cereal, baking mixes, dried and canned beans, baby wipes, diaper cream and personal care items.



"Summit College Club is more than a hundred years old," said Lynne Rogerson, president, "and we have been holding the Book Sale for more than fifty. It is one of the largest book sales in the area and our major fundraising event. We believe in it! The Book Sale recycles used books, it provides new reading to people at very low cost, and the profits we derive are all used to fund scholarships for deserving local students. As in the past, Summit College Club's Book Sale will fill the American Legion Post 433 building at 357 Elkwood Avenue (right next to the town library) in New Providence. People with books to donate are asked to bring them to that building on four days only: Friday, April 14, from 1 to 7 p.m., and Saturday through Monday, April 15, 16, and 17, from 9 a.m. to 7 p.m.

The sale accepts a variety of media in good condition: books, CDs, DVDs, etc. It does not accept encyclopedias, magazines, manuals, textbooks, or VHS tapes.

Volunteers go to work, rapidly sorting and arranging the books into about 50 categories, from astronomy to zoology, with fiction, children's books, cookbooks, history, and biography among the largest.

"We are always surprised," said Rogerson, "at the number and variety of books that we receive. Our area is rich in readers."

SALE

The actual sale starts about 40 hours after donations end: April 19 through 23. Nearly all the items will sell for 50 cents, one, or two dollars. On opening day, April 19, from 9 a.m. – 2 p.m., the sale has a \$25 admission charge. Although everyone is welcome, the customers on that day are traditionally book sellers from the tristate area.

Admission on the next four days, April 20

through 23, is free of charge. Hours are: Thursday and Friday, 4/20 and 4/21, from 9 a.m. to 8 p.m.; Saturday, 4/22, from 9 a.m. to 7 p.m., and Sunday, Bag Day, 4/23, from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. On Sunday, the final day, readers may fill a grocery bag with printed books for \$5 or with electronic media for \$10.


Masks are recommended in the hall during donations and the sale.
