ELMORA YOUTH LEAGUE CELEBRATES 50TH SEASON

In one simple word, phenomenal. No one could have imagined back in 1974 when Elmora Youth league was inaugurated that we would still be here and thriving. For the past 50 seasons Elmora Youth League (EYL). Has taken pride in serving the surrounding communities which include Eizabeth, Roselle, Roselle Park, Hillside, Union, Linden, and Rahway.

Looking back, In 1974, a group of parents set out to provide recreation activities for the youth in the City of Elizabeth. Eugene Ahearn is credited as the league founder. First to join him in his venture to start the organization were Jim Dembeck and Tony Saluccio. By distributing flyers and holding the first meeting for Elmora Youth League in School 21, they recruited more parents to come out and volunteer. The first executive board was formed with Gen Ahearn as the League President and 13 other parents.

The very first games were played at Kiawameh Field in Union, NJ. A few games were also played in Cray Park in Union, NJ but that was short lived. At this point in time the KEAN family leased some of their property located on North Ave to the league, now known as the Phil Rizzuto Park today. This location became home to many memories for 12 years.

Fast forward the clock to 1998, the City of Elizabeth dedicated the fields on Westfield Ave in honor of one of our town's hometown heroes. He lost his life in the line of duty on April 2nd , 1992 while serving as a member of the NJ State Police. Trooper Thomas Hanratty spent many years growing up and playing baseball on the fields that bear his name.

The year that stands out for everyone in Elizabeth and around the world was 2019. This is the year that our 12 yr Boys team went on a tear and won every tournament level that granted them entry in the holy grail of little league baseball, the Little League World Series, in Williamsport, PA. Our boys were thrown into the spotlight and became Suto rockstars overnight. Thanks to their coaches, family, and fan base they stayed grounded. I remember game one like it was yesterday, EYL was representing the Mid-Atlantic region and they were going up against the winners from the NorthWest Region. Multiple buses were packed taking people from Elizabeth NJ to Williamsport PA. The chants in the stadium for "Let's Go Troopers" pierced your soul and injected a bolt of energy that kept everyone on the edge of their seat. When the game was over the Elizabeth boys were victorious. That's when I came to realize that we were in the middle of something that was bigger than all of us. The entire state of NJ rallied behind us and it showed as watch parties were popping up all over the state. These memories will last a lifetime and I can see them being topics of conversations around family dinner tables for years to come.

Now we can't forget about our marvelous softball program and their great accomplismnets. In 2021 the Elmora Senior League team captured the NJ State Championship title for the first time in Elmora's history. This was a goal the girls set out to achieve and worked extremely hard to accomplish. They were undefeated in their fight for the State Title. This monumental moment served as inspiration for the younger girls that looked up to many of the players. So in 2022 the younger Junior League division team took on the mantra, " not us?". The girls learned by example and

worked extremely hard to also capture the NJ State title for the first time in this division. By winning the title, the girls were now onto the next round where they competed for the regional title in Connecticut. While they didn't win the regional title, they did solidify that softball in Elmora is here to stay.

Truth be told, Elmora Youth League, has been very successful since it became affiliated with the Little League organization in 1999. In the past 23 years, Elmora has now won titles in both Baseball and Softball 61 times. A replica of all these banners will be on display at the Hanratty Complex for all to see and enjoy. The league is planning a huge opening day celebration on March 25th 2023. All of the players will be wearing our 50th Season logo across their chest this year. We ask all our friends, families, past players, & Coaches to come out and enjoy the parade with us as we celebrate the past 50 Seasons and many more to come.
