### ST. BARTHOLOMEW CELEBRATES 75 YEARS OF SERVICE

After many years of not having a place of worship within their own town, Roman Catholic Scotch Plains and Fanwood residents turned to the Archdiocese of Newark hoping for a parish to be established within their hometowns. On July 10, 1946, intense efforts began to establish a Roman Catholic parish in Scotch Plains beginning with a "Letter of Appeal" to the Most Reverend Thomas Joseph Walsh, the Archbishop of the Newark Diocese at that time. Nearly two years later, on June 4, 1948, Archbishop Walsh granted their request and issued a "Letter of Establishment". On June 16, 1948, Reverend John S. Nelligan was appointed as the church's first pastor. About 5 months later, on November 21, the "groundbreaking ceremony" took place, and the rest is history. Local Roman Catholics have had a hometown place of worship for 75 years.

Current pastor, Reverend John J. Paladino was appointed pastor on May 1, 2005. Through his vision and dedication for the past 18 years, St. Bartholomew the Apostle parish continues to expand and spread the Good News of Jesus Christ.

Since 1948, St. Bartholomew's parish has celebrated many religious holidays, sacraments, and events with their parishioners. Religious ceremonies performed to date include11,389 Baptisms, 10,694 First Holy Communions,

10,091 Confirmations, 2,876 weddings and 3,858 funerals and countless masses and other services and sacraments.

The celebrations for this diamond jubilee of the inception of St. Bartholomew Church and 75 years of service to the Scotch Plains-Fanwood community have begun. The festivities kicked off Friday, March 3rd with their "First Friday" Mass. The Mass was celebrated by Bishop Elias Lorenzo, OSB of the Archdiocese of Newark along with Fr. Matthew Gonzalez and Deacon Bob Gurske both of St. Bartholomew's Church. Scotch Plains Mayor Josh Losardo and Township Manager Al Mirabella were in attendance and presented the parish with a proclamation for this milestone. After Mass, over 110 guests attended The Prime Timers luncheon which was organized by parishioner and 75th anniversary committee member Gail Iozzi.

The festivities continued on Sunday, March 5th, with the Knights and Dames prayer service concelebrated by Bishop Lorenzo, Fr. John Paladino, Fr. Matthew Gonzalez and Deacon Bob Gurske. ### GROUNDBREAKING FOR THE NEW FANWOOD MEMORIAL LIBRARY

### Borough of Fanwood

Mayor Colleen Mahr, joined by members of the Borough Council, library trustees and others, broke ground in February for a new Fanwood Memorial Library, a project in the planning for almost a decade.

The project, currently budgeted at just over \$8.2 million, is funded partially by a grant from the NJ Library Construction Bond Act which was made possible by a voter referendum in 2017. Fanwood applied for and was awarded \$3.5 million of that money thru competitive application process. The Borough is funding the remainder.

"We have spent a lot of time and energy focusing on the transformation of our downtown and now it's time to focus our resources on our public buildings," said Mayor Mahr. "This is the first, brand new public building in close to 50

years. Today we acknowledge that our library plays a critical role in promoting education and knowledge and will serve as an important community hub benefitting everyone."

The current timetable calls for construction to be completed in the spring of 2024. In the meantime, library operations continue at the historic Fanwood train station.

The new library will replace a building that stood at the same spot at North Avenue and Tillotson Road for 71 years and suffered from significant infrastructure issues. It was also not

compliant with ADA regulations. It was demolished earlier this year.

Among those attending the groundbreaking were NJ State Librarian Jennifer Nelson, Fanwood Council president Jeff Banks, Council members Anthony Carter and Gina Berry, library director Dan Weiss, library trustee president Ann Minski and Friends of the Library president Carol Campbell.




