IFPN SPRING GALA "SUSTAINING HOPE"

The Interfaith Food Pantry Network (IFPN) will be holding its annual Spring Gala, Sustaining Hope, on April 21, 2023, at the Birchwood Manor, Whippany. IFPN will be honoring Barclays, a British universal bank, as its Outstanding Service Award recipient for its partnership in the execution of IFPN's strategic efforts; the Margaret A. Darrin Charitable Trust will receive the Pantry Partner Award for funding the expansion and renovation of its Healthy Choices Marketplace and Resource Center; and Chris & Jim MacDonald will be the recipients of the Neighbors Helping Neighbors Award for their long-term commitment and support of the IFPN over the last 20 years especially as volunteers and Chris's dedication as a Board Trustee. "The individuals and organizations being honored have made significant contributions to our organization, in time, talent and treasure, and have impacted the lives of thousands of people in our community, improving their health, financial stability and well-being", said Carolyn Lake, Executive Director.

The evening will highlight IFPN's current goals as well as its achievements over the last year, including the expansion of its cold storage units by 550% and the distribution of 1.7 million pounds of nutritious food, including 673,000 pounds of fresh produce. Through the pantries they operate and their mobile network partners, the IFPN accommodated more than 31,000 household visits. The event will also celebrate IFPN's future plans to welcome its clients back into its newly expanded and renovated Client Choice Marketplace this summer for the first time since the onset of the Covid-19 pandemic. "Our new marketplace will feature an expanded and updated waiting area for providing client resources and a client-choice pantry that empowers our guests to choose healthy foods that they know their families will use and enjoy", Lake said.

Proceeds from Sustaining Hope will be used to fund IFPN Healthy Choices Marketplaces and Mobile Network programs providing healthy food to the ever-growing number of families facing food insecurity and hunger throughout

Morris County. The IFPN is currently experiencing a 49% increase in client visits in January 2023 as compared to January 2022 and this trend will likely continue as clients face high inflationary costs while concurrently, many SNAP (Food Stamp) recipients are facing a decrease in their benefits as federal emergency allotments reach an end this month. Pantry clients include low-income working families, seniors living on fixed incomes, people with disabilities and those suffering from illness or job loss.







The Florham Park Rotary was pleased to learn about all the wonderful things nourish.NJ does for Morris County residents when they recently received a presentation during a recent meeting.

Nancy Rudgers, Director of Development at nourish.NJ, shared that the Mission is to create lasting solutions to the problems of hunger, homelessness and poverty. “We offer food, housing, work readiness, medical, social and educational services 365 days a year in a warm, safe and caring environment, free of charge, no questions asked.”

The Non-Profit organization has worked for about 40 years to create lasting solutions. They began their mission serving chicken noodle soup and peanut butter and jelly sandwiches to guests in the mid-1980s. They have expanded their offerings since then to include a variety of dynamic relief services and programs.

As the name of the nonprofit organization would imply, food is the starting point of engagement for many who engage in their community outreach services. Details of where and when people may seek free take-out meals and free Farmers Markets and assistance can be found on nourishnj.org, or call the Outreach Center Phone Number: 973-294-8576.

More community outreach services beyond hunger include housing, medical, mental, and employment.

The Florham Park Rotary will now explore ways in which the Club can help. Individual citizens in Morris County are also encouraged to check the nourish.nj.org website for ways in which they may pitch in – as there are both on-site and off-site volunteer opportunities to help:

Minimum age is 16 to volunteer and all On-site volunteers must be fully vaccinated (including a booster).

Off-site opportunities include: Pack and donate purple “Apron Meal Kits” providing four healthy, easy to prepare meals with new recipes designed by a nutrition counselor every season. Pack and donate “Purposeful Acts of Kindness” containing every-day essential items to promote

guests’ health, wellness, and cleanliness. Pack and donate and “Rise and Shine Breakfast” kits provides local children with a nutritious breakfast

IMAGINE SEEKS LOVING LISTENERS

You may be familiar with Imagine and know that the non-profit provides free peer support groups for children, youth, young adults and parents/guardians who are grieving. Did you know that the groups are facilitated by an amazing team of volunteer facilitators? Imagine’s volunteer facilitators come from all walks of life and no special background is required other than a willingness to listen, a heart inclined to serve, and the ability to be with children and adults in grief without trying to fix, solve or give advice. No prior experience is necessary.

Volunteers must be 18 years or older. Spanish-speaking volunteers are needed as well. Volunteers serve as companions and loving listeners for those who are grieving and help create a safe space where participants can share tears and embrace the joys of life.

Here’s how some of our current volunteer facilitators have described their experience:

“Being an Imagine volunteer has been the most fulfilling and worthwhile volunteer experience I’ve ever had. I feel that the model is just what it should be, and I love being a part of it. I think being an imagine volunteer helps me fulfill my desire to be a good person.” Aimee-6+ years as Imagine Facilitator

“People outside of Imagine are always supportive when they hear that I volunteer at a grief support center. But I know it can be a little confusing to hear that volunteering at a grief support center is the best night of my week. And that’s the magic. That as a volunteer, the joy is not in what we bring, but what we take home from our participants.” Rob-4+ years as Imagine Facilitator

“I have found the people at Imagine to be among the best that I have ever met.” Diane-6 months as Imagine Facilitator

If you’d like to join Imagine’s amazing team



of volunteer facilitators, there is a training planned for June 2 - 4. Each training is held from 9 a.m. – 5a.m. each day over 3 days at Imagine’s Mountainside center. Imagine asks that you plan to attend the entire training. Participants in the training will have an opportunity to learn companionship and facilitation skills while sharing stories with one another and providing each other with support. Many of Imagine’s facilitators come away from the training feeling truly connected to one another and describe the experience as “life changing” Participants also come away better prepared to support those at Imagine, and those in their lives who have experienced a loss.

EAGLE SCOUT KATELYN CANNON WINS STATE-WIDE ESSAY CONTEST

Eagle Scout Katelyn Cannon of Scouts BSA Troop 19 from St. Rose of Lima Church, Short Hills, was unanimously selected as New Jersey's 2022 Sons of the American Revolution (SAR) winner of the Arthur M. & Berdena King Eagle Scout Award for authoring a patriotic themed essay titled "The Legacy of the Revolutionary Frontiersmen".

Katelyn's essay focused on racial tensions of the "Bloody Year" of 1782, where she highlighted the spike in racially motivated slaughters and vengeful attacks of both Native Americans and western Pennsylvania frontiersmen. Katelyn research discovered that she was a revolutionary descendant of Captain John "Miller" Hardin, who served under Colonel William Crawford in the Sandusky Plains as a member of the Westmoreland County Pennsylvania Militia. Colonel Crawford led his unit of approximately 500 men deep into Indian territory; however, he and dozens of his men were ultimately captured. Colonel Crawford was tortured and burned at the

stake by American Indians. Fortunately, Captain Hardin was able to return home to his family shortly thereafter.

Katelyn's essay presented a brave argument that "the revolution of frontiersmen, including her ancestor John Hardin, left an important, if not always positive, legacy".

Katelyn, who is also a senior at Millburn High School, was presented an Eagle Scout trophy and scholarship check by the national SAR President General C. Bruce Pickett. "Katelyn's essay has now been submitted to the national competition where the top Eagle Scout award recipient will receive a ten-thousand-dollar scholarship to be awarded at the national headquarters in Louisville, Kentucky this summer.", said SAR West Fields Chapter President Julien Hershey.
