

SIGNS THAT SPOUSAL CAREGIVING MAY BE COMING TOO RISKY FOR YOU

"Will you still need me, will you still feed me, when I'm sixty-four."

-- The Beatles, "When I'm 64"

Times have certainly changed since Lennon and McCartney penned and sang those words in 1967. Medical and healthcare strides are allowing people to live well into their 70's and 80's. Despite those health advances, the fact remains that caring for a spouse in need, regardless of their age, is very demanding, stressful and could threaten your own health.

One study from The Journals of Gerontology showed that caregivers suffered more psychological distress and fatigue than non-caregivers, and the length of service made a pronounced difference. Long-term caregivers had much higher rates of physical symptoms like headaches, body aches and abdominal discomfort.

Spousal caregivers experiencing caregiver strain have also been shown to have mortality risks that are 63 percent higher than non-caregivers.

As a caregiving spouse, you may begin to feel very isolated from friends and feel tremendous guilt about your own unmet needs. There can also be a sense of loss, especially if your spouse is

living with dementia or Alzheimer's disease.

So how do you know if caregiving is becoming too risky for you? Examine the list below and see how many apply to you.

RISK FACTORS FOR SPOUSAL CAREGIVER PHYSICAL STRESS

- Delaying your own doctor appointments/ignoring your own health
- Not eating a healthy diet for lack of time
- Losing sleep and energy
- Giving up exercise routines for lack of time
- Overusing tobacco and alcohol when you feel stressed

RISK FACTORS FOR SPOUSAL CAREGIVER EMOTIONAL STRESS

- Losing connections with friends for lack of time to socialize
- Bottling up feelings of anger and frustration and then being surprised by angry, even violent, outbursts directed at your spouse, other family members, co-workers - even strangers
- Feeling sad, down, depressed or hopeless
- Lacking interest in things that used to give you (and your spouse) pleasure
- Feeling resentful toward your spouse (blaming your spouse for the situation)
- Feeling that people ask more of you than they should

• Feeling like caregiving has affected family relationships in a negative way (annoyed by family members who don't help out)

GET HELP IF YOU NEED IT

All caregivers who feel overextended are at an increased risk for physical and emotional stress. Even if you are only experiencing two or three of the risk factors above, it is important to get help and support. The truth is your spouse/partner will be in better hands if you are healthy.

If you are facing some of the signs listed above, consider talking with a healthcare professional to help you evaluate your situation. Try these self-care tips that will reduce caregiver stress, as well as the associated risks of ongoing stress.

Most importantly, don't be afraid to ask for help if you need it. One of the best ways to avoid becoming overstressed is to enlist the help of siblings, other family members and friends.

Respite care, which is simply a short break from caregiving, is another viable option. The care can occur at home and, when used over time, respite has been found to help caregivers continue to care for their loved one at home, preventing or delaying the need to move to a care community or facility.

IMAGINE SEEKS LOVING LISTENERS FOR JUNE TRAINING

You may be familiar with Imagine and know that the non-profit provides free peer support groups for children, youth, young adults and parents/guardians who are grieving. Did you know that the groups are facilitated by an amazing team of volunteer facilitators? Imagine's volunteer facilitators come from all walks of life and no special background is required other than



a willingness to listen, a heart inclined to serve, and the ability to be with children and adults in grief without trying to fix, solve or give advice. No prior experience is necessary.

Volunteers must be 18 years or older. Spanishspeaking volunteers are needed as well. Volunteers serve as companions and loving listeners for those who are grieving and help create a safe space where participants can share tears and embrace the joys of life.

Here's how some of our current volunteer facilitators have described their experience:

"Being an Imagine volunteer has been the most fulfilling and worthwhile volunteer experience I've ever had. I feel that the model is just what it should be, and I love being a part of it. I think being an imagine volunteer helps me fulfill my desire to be a good person." Aimee-6+ years as Imagine Facilitator

"People outside of Imagine are always supportive when they hear that I volunteer at a grief support center. But I know it can be a little confusing to hear that volunteering at a grief support center is the best night of my week. And that's the magic. That as a volunteer, the joy is not in what we bring, but what we take home from our participants." Rob-4+ years as Imagine Facilitator

"I have found the people at Imagine to be among the best that I have ever met." Diane-6 months as Imagine Facilitator

If you'd like to join Imagine's amazing team of volunteer facilitators, there is a training planned for June 2 - 4. Each training is held from 9 a.m. – 5a.m. each day over 3 days at Imagine's Mountainside center. Imagine asks that you plan to attend the entire training. Participants in the training will have an opportunity to learn companioning and facilitation skills while sharing stories with one another and providing each other with support. Many of Imagine's facilitators come away from the training feeling truly connected to one another and describe the experience as "life changing" Participants also come away better prepared to support those at Imagine, and those in their lives who have experienced a loss.

EAGLE SCOUT KATELYN CANNON WINS STATE-WIDE ESSAY CONTEST

PRINCETON, NJ – Eagle Scout Katelyn Cannon of Scouts BSA Troop 19 from St. Rose of Lima Church, Short Hills, was unanimously selected as New Jersey's 2022 Sons of the American Revolution (SAR) winner of the Arthur M. & Berdena King Eagle Scout Award for authoring a patriotic themed essay titled "The Legacy of the Revolutionary Frontiersmen".

Katelyn's essay focused on racial tensions of the "Bloody Year" of 1782, where she highlighted the spike in racially motivated slaughters and vengeful attacks of both Native Americans and western Pennsylvania frontiersmen. Katelyn research discovered that she was a revolutionary descendant of Captain John "Miller" Hardin, who served under Colonel William Crawford in the Sandusky Plains as a member of the Westmoreland County Pennsylvania Militia. Colonel Crawford led his unit of approximately 500 men deep into Indian territory; however, he and dozens of his men were ultimately captured. Colonel Crawford was tortured and burned at the stake by American Indians. Fortunately, Captain Hardin was able to return home to his family shortly thereafter.

Katelyn's essay presented a brave argument that "the revolution of frontiersmen, including her ancestor John Hardin, left an important, if not always positive, legacy".

Katelyn, who is also a senior at Millburn High


School, was presented an Eagle Scout trophy and scholarship check by the national SAR President General C. Bruce Pickett. "Katelyn's essay has now been submitted to the national competition where the top Eagle Scout award recipient will receive a ten-thousand-dollar scholarship to be awarded at the national headquarters in

ORGAN DONATION REACHED NEW ALL-TIME HIGH

NJ Sharing Network

Carolyn M. Welsh, President and CEO of NJ Sharing Network, the federally-designated nonprofit organization responsible for the recovery of donated organs and tissue in the state, announced the number of organ donors (283) and organs transplanted in a single year (670) reached all-time highs in 2022.

These unprecedented totals mark significant increases over the previous records of 233 organ donors and 613 organs transplanted. This also marked the fourth consecutive year NJ Sharing Network has reported new records in the number of organ donors, underscoring the clear trend of increased support for organ donation in the Garden State.


"Thanks to the generosity of New Jersey organ donors and their families, more lives were saved last year than ever before - ensuring others now have more time to share special moments with their loved ones," said Welsh.

In 2022, the 670 organs transplanted included 350 kidneys (all-time high), 170 livers (all-time high), 71 hearts, 58 lungs, 20 pancreata and one intestine. In addition, 40,000 eye and tissue gifts enhanced the quality of life for those in need. Tissue donations include corneas, heart valves, skin grafts, bone grafts, saphenous veins, ligaments, and tendons.

According to United Network for Organ Sharing (UNOS), nearly 4,000 people in New Jersey are on the organ transplant waiting list. One organ donor can save eight lives, and one tissue donor can enhance the lives of over 75 people.


to continuing this celebration with our NJYS alumni and carrying on Barbara's legacy of excellence in music education."



DONATIONS

As in the past, Summit College Club's Book Sale will fill the American Legion Post 433 building at 357 Elkwood Avenue (right next to the town library) in New Providence. People with books to donate are asked to bring them to that building on four days only: Friday, April 14, from 1 to 7 p.m., and Saturday through Monday, April 15, 16, and 17, from 9 a.m. to 7 p.m.

The sale accepts a variety of media in good condition: books, CDs, DVDs, etc. It does not accept encyclopedias, magazines, manuals, textbooks, or VHS tapes.

CHRIST CHURCH FESTIVAL CHOIR, SOLOISTS AND ORCHESTRA TO PERFORM

Christ Church in Short Hills will present a Special Concert of Remembrance featuring Gabriel Fauré's Requiem and Cantique de Jean Racine on Sunday, April 23, 2023 at 4:00 p.m. The signature performance at Christ Church in Short Hills commemorates its 140th Anniversary and honors those lives lost during the COVID-19 pandemic.

The Concert to be held at Christ Church in Short Hills, will feature the Christ Church Festival Choir, Orchestra, Organ and vocal soloists conducted by guest conductor and Christ Church parishioner George Mathew. The Christ Church Festival Choir, under the direction of Christ Church Organist and Choirmaster, Dr. Andrew Moore, will include choristers from the Community Congregational Church in Short Hills, St. Stephen's Episcopal Church, Millburn, Temple B'Nai Jeshrun and other area institutions. The Festival Orchestra will comprise distinguished artists from major New York orchestras including the Orchestra of St. Luke's, Metropolitan Opera Orchestra and Orpheus. Short Hills resident and soprano Tharanga Goonetilleke, and baritone Charles Schneider will be the featured soloists for this performance of the Fauré Requiem.



The Rev. Bowie Snodgrass, Rector of Christ Church in Short Hills, will introduce the concert. This performance is presented as a memorial to those lives lost during the pandemic, as well as those who have passed away in the church and community during the church's 140-year history. The Concert is presented free of charge. Free will donations are welcome. A Reception will follow the performance in Parish Hall.

ABOUT THE PROGRAM

Fauré's Requiem, often described as a gentler, more meditative and peaceful rendering of the Mass for the Dead, and its companion piece, the Cantique de Jean Racine, are particularly meaningful vehicles for this occasion. These works simultaneously honor the great musical, poetic and liturgical traditions of the past, those of the Medieval, Renaissance, Baroque and Romantic eras. They also invite listeners to immerse themselves in an ancient mystical tradition of trance-like repetition, which underlies much of the music – an invocation of an eternal music that never ceases, quietly sounding beyond the relatively brief window of time that is the present moment. The "deeper music" of Christ Church in Short Hills and its ever-expanding community reflect its story over the decades, and perhaps centuries.

ABOUT THE ARTISTS

Award-winning Indian-American conductor George Mathew is the founder and Artistic Director of Music for Life International, a global social enterprise, which creates social impact and public diplomacy through music. He has appeared in the U.S., Asia, the Middle East, Africa, Oceania and Europe as conductor, pianist and speaker. Since 2006, Mr. Mathew and MFLI have presented a series of global humanitarian concerts at Carnegie Hall, which have brought together hundreds of musicians from over 120 of the world's most distinguished orchestral, chamber and choral ensembles to raise funds and public awareness for major international crises. He has served as Artistic Director/Conductor of the New Year's Eve Concert for Peace at the Cathedral of St. John the Divine, New York and was the Founder Conductor of the Children's Concerts at the John F. Kennedy Presidential Library in Boston.

Dr. Andrew Moore is the Organist and Choirmaster of Christ Church in Short Hills. Dr. Moore is Chairman of the Music Department at the Pingry School in Basking Ridge, New Jersey. Dr. Moore earned his Bachelor of Music degree from the Curtis Institute of Music, Philadelphia and holds a Master's and Doctor of Musical Arts degrees from The Juilliard School in New York City, where he studied under John Weaver, chair of the Organ Department. He also has studied improvisation with Gerre Hancock and the harpsichord with Lionel Party, the acclaimed harpsichordist of the New York Philharmonic.

The historic, renowned organ at Christ Church in Short Hills is a 63 rank Aeolian-Skinner opus 1347 designed by organ builder Joseph Whiteford in 1960. It is the largest of its kind in the state of New Jersey. The organ was restored in 2015 and the new antiphonal organ and Trompette en Chamade were tonally designed by organ builder, Bynum Petty.
