## ABOUT SUMMIT SPEECH SCHOOL

Located in New Providence, NJ, Summit Speech School was founded in 1967 by Junior League of Summit member May S. Gold, who wanted to teach deaf and hard of hearing children to listen and talk. The School has grown over the

years and currently consists of the Parent Infant Program, a Preschool, an Itinerant Mainstream Support Program and an Audiology Center that provides pediatric audiology services to families as well as educational audiology services to school districts. Through its four programs, the School serves about 300 children annually. Summit Speech School works with families and school districts to develop children's listening, speech and language skills, thus fostering communication, education, socialization and self-advocacy.

As we approach NJYS' 45th anniversary season, we look forward to continuing this celebration with our NJYS alumni and carrying on Barbara's legacy of excellence in music education."

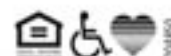

## HOLY WEEK SERVICES AT FAITH LUTHERAN

Faith Lutheran Church in New Providence invites area residents to each of its liturgical services during Holy Week.

On Passion or Palm Sunday, April 2, two Eucharistic liturgies will be conducted, one at 8 am and the other at 10 am. The title of the sermon at both liturgies will be "Hope in the Past." The music at the 10 am liturgy will be provided by the Sanctuary Choir, accompanied by trumpet and organ.

On Holy Thursday, April 6, a spoken Eucharistic liturgy will be conducted at 12 noon and a fully sung Eucharistic liturgy will be offered at 7:30 pm. The title of the sermon at both services will be "Hope for Today." At the evening service, the rite of First Communion will be given to persons in the fifth grade, who are preparing for confirmation.

On Good Friday, April 7, at 12 noon, a Community Ecumenical Service will be held at Faith. Clergy of the New Providence and Berkeley Heights churches will lead the service.

On Good Friday, at 7:30 p.m., a Tenebrae Service, with the Stripping of the Altar, will be conducted. The subject of the sermon will be "Hope for the Future." The music of the service will be provided by the Sanctuary Choir.

Saturday, April 8 will be a day of silence and

meditation. Faith's sanctuary will be open for prayer and reflection.

On Easter Sunday, April 9 at 7 a.m., Faith will hold in its garden a brief service, which will include the lighting of the Paschal Candle. At 8 a.m. there will be a Spoken Liturgical Service with Eucharist, accompanied by organ, brass and timpani. At 10 a.m., Faith will conduct a Festival Easter Processional and Eucharist Service. The music at 10 a.m. will be provided by the Sanctuary Choir, Children's Choir, the Faith Bell Ringers, brass, timpani, and the organ; all coordinated by Shea Velloso, Minister of Music. The title of the sermon at both services will be "Hope for Tomorrow."

Faith conducts an open communion table. All visitors, who are baptized members of the Christian church, are welcome to the Lord's Table.

#### DONATIONS

As in the past, Summit College Club's Book Sale will fill the American Legion Post 433 building at 357 Elkwood Avenue (right next to the town library) in New Providence. People with books to donate are asked to bring them to that building on four days only: Friday, April 14, from 1 to 7 p.m., and Saturday through Monday, April 15, 16, and 17, from 9 a.m. to 7 p.m.

The sale accepts a variety of media in good condition: books, CDs, DVDs, etc. It does not accept encyclopedias, magazines, manuals, textbooks, or VHS tapes.

Volunteers go to work, rapidly sorting and arranging the books into about 50 categories, from astronomy to zoology, with fiction, children's books, cookbooks, history, and biography among the largest.

"We are always surprised," said Rogerson, "at the number and variety of books that we receive. Our area is rich in readers."

#### SALE

The actual sale starts about 40 hours after donations end: April 19 through 23. Nearly all the items will sell for 50 cents, one, or two dollars. On opening day, April 19, from 9 a.m. – 2 p.m., the sale has a \$25 admission charge. Although everyone is welcome, the customers on that day are traditionally book sellers from the tristate area.

Admission on the next four days, April 20

through 23, is free of charge. ## VOLUNTEER SPOTLIGHT: JIM MADDEN RIDES TO END ALZHEIMER'S

The Alzheimer's Association Greater New Jersey Chapter (AAGNJ), the leading volunteer-driven voluntary health organization in Alzheimer's care, support, advocacy and research is spotlighting people who make a difference in the fight to end Alzheimer's and all other dementia. Jim Madden, a former New Providence Councilman and Union County Volunteer of the Year in 2021, is applying his passion for cycling and advocacy to help raise awareness and fund research for the Alzheimer's Association.

Jim has raised nearly \$22,000 on his first two rides in Washington D.C. and Austin, Texas, the 4th highest among all Ride to End Alz fundraisers, and will be participating in his third Ride to End Alz cycling event in the Nation's Capital, which winds through Maryland, Virginia

and Washington D.C on Sunday, May 7. He is also a member of the Nation's Capital ride event planning committee. The Ride to End Alz is a cycling event for a range of riders, from novice cyclists, to weekend warriors, to avid enthusiasts. Riders select a distance between 10-100 miles that fits their skill level and pushes riders to earn a medal they will cherish. With each mile, participant's fuel cutting-edge research targeted to change the trajectory of Alzheimer's disease.

Jim explains, "I am determined to go the distance for all those affected by Alzheimer's. I am inspired by the strength of the more than 6 million Americans living with this disease, and the over 11 million family members and friends who provide them with care. In New Jersey alone, there are 190,000 living with the disease and 361,000 unpaid caregivers providing critical support. I am riding to honor the memories of friends and family members who have been affected by Alzheimer's and to support those who continue their courageous fight. I am riding this year for Jeanne Mancuso who continues her brave fight against Alzheimer's."

"Jeanne is the wife of my fraternity brother, Mike Mancuso. I mean here we are in our early sixties...we have to do more to help find a cure and therapies for Jeanne and the millions of others battling Alzheimer's and dementia spectrum. Folks such as Jeanne need more good days ahead and the more good days we can

create, the more progress we can make in clinical practice and advancements."

In addition to using his legs for pedal power, Jim uses his voice on both the Federal and State level in the fight to end Alzheimer's. He is working to overturn the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) decision that denied the Alzheimer's Association's request to change its policy on FDA-approved treatments for people living with Alzheimer's. Despite unequivocal evidence confirmed by the scientific community, CMS continues to state it is not reasonable and necessary for people living with Alzheimer's to have access to an FDA-approved treatment without barriers. Also, Jim is working to advance bills A-2682 & S-1033, which would establish an Alzheimer's & Dementia Care Long-term Advisory Commission. The legislation was approved by the Senate and Assembly and has been sent to Governor Murphy for final approval.

Jim concludes, "Right now, there is no shortage of ideas in Alzheimer's research = only dollars - which is why I volunteer as a fundraiser and advocate to support the Alzheimer's Association's efforts to discover methods of treatment and prevention."
