AMERICAN LEGION RESUMES "GIVEAWAYS"

On April 6th, after the hiatus due to covid, the Frank Patterson American Legion Post #43 of Florham Park-Madison, resumed its in person "Giveaways" event. Post Commander Joseph Nester welcomed representatives from a variety of local and state level organizations involved in veteran, educational, and community programs.

Over the one hundred years since receiving its charter, Post #43 has donated thousands of dollars to the communities of Florham Park and Madison. Twenty-two organizations and programs received donations this year. At the top of the list, Nester and other members of the Post presented checks to various Veterans' Memorial Homes and Veterans' Administration Hospitals. Included for the first time, was a donation to Joint Base McGuire/Dix/Lakehurst to assist military families on base who are experiencing food insecurities.

As part of their Children and Youth program, funds have been provided for boys at local High Schools to attend the Boys State Program over the summer. Scholarships will be awarded to graduating seniors at Madison and Hanover Park high schools in June. Gifts to various charities that provide comfort and medical help to children in need were included as well. That included Jake Macko of Madison who is suffering from a rare form of cancer and is in desperate need of a wheelchair accessible van.

Community First Aide Squads were not forgotten. Nester stated that





LIBRARY AND EDUCATION FOUNDATION CREATE **ACTION WITH COMMUNITY CONVERSATIONS**

committed group of Florham Parkers met to discuss the state of volunteerism and community-based organizations in our town. The group consisted of roughly 15 representatives and leaders from nonprofits, volunteer groups, and local government, plus a few unaffiliated concerned citizens. The meetings were all part of "Community Conversations," a discussion series that is hosted by the Florham Park Public Library and co-produced by the Library and Florham Park Education Foundation. This annual conversation series invites people from all walks of life and political persuasions to enter into a moderated dialog with each other on a topic that matters for the wellbeing of the overall community. The past two years have used this "dialog-to-action" model to create solutions that address volunteerism and civic engagement in Florham Park.

Though it is often celebrated as a "community of volunteers," many community groups in town are experiencing declines in the number of people who are willing and able to contribute their time to sustain beloved Florham Park traditions. Some examples of groups in need of volunteers and leaders are the Volunteer Fire Department, Volunteer First Aid Squad, Florham Park Education Foundation, Senior Club, 4th of July Committee. Gazebo Committee. and Environmental Commission.

In 2022, the group determined that one reason why organizations are struggling with dwindling

During the months of February and March, a ranks might be a lack of awareness around town, especially among new residents and people living farther from the center of town. The group worked to solve this problem by creating a website and community-wide calendar, which can be accessed at florhamparknj.org. Community Groups are invited to list their events on the community calendar by filling out a form or sending an email to fpboroevents@gmail.com. This website and calendar is separate from the local government and maintained by dedicated community volunteers.

> This year's Community Conversations asked simple questions like "what do we have here in Florham Park?" and "What do we need?" The resulting discussion led the participants to conclude that regular meetings of leaders and volunteers active in the community might help organizations to create synergies that boost each other, and the whole community. As a result, quarterly "networking" events will be held so that people can connect with community groups and learn more about meaningful ways to get involved. These meetings will be coordinated by community volunteers and open to everyone. Check the community calendar to see when the next one will be!



They claim that they were doing repairs and renovations to an old decrepit building at the Boy Scout Camp. But they were seen removing valuable lumber, sinks, toilets, shower heads, and construction materials from the building.

Just kidding. This is a group of dedicated volunteers, including many professionals, who volunteer every week all year round at the Boy Scout camps for Patriot's Path Council in northern New Jersey. These guys pictured have come up every Wednesday and Thursday for several months to renovate the Pool House and other buildings. This group includes retired engineers, an electrician, computer experts, small business owners, and corporate executives.

1971. The roof was still good, but the wooden walls were completely rotted, and the roof was sagging perilously. They needed to prop up the roof and replace the boards one by one.

The "Pool House Gang" were caught red Eventually the building will have two bathrooms, two common showers and 8 individual changing rooms on each of two sides. There is a full sized swimming pool behind the building, so all of the chlorination, pumping mechanisms and electrical service are also located inside the building.

The "Flintlocks BSA, Inc." a 501c3 corporation, is a group of retired scouters who volunteer at the camps every week, all year round, to help the council. They do most of the repairs and maintenance for the three Council camps, but also build new structures, such as cabins, waterfront structures, picnic tables and tent platforms. In 2018 they secured funding and built the STEM Lab at Allamuchy. Second, they make the craft kits for birdhouses, bird feeders, stools, handy boxes, racing sailboats, etc., which are sold through the Scout Shops. Third, Flintlocks volunteer to help run the many Council programs. 





HOLOCAUST SURVIVOR TO SPEAK - MAY 9TH

The Summit Old Guard

Of the 1.6 million Jewish children who lived in Europe before World War II, only 100,00 survived the Holocaust. Most were hidden children. Separated from her parents in July 1942, 6-year old Maud Dahme and her 4-year old sister, Rita, were hidden from the Nazis by Christian families in the Netherlands. Dahme will share with the Summit Old Guard her wartime experiences, as well as her reunion with her parents, immigration to the United States at age 14, and serving as a Holocaust education advocate.

"I think the greatest gift that was given me was to be alive," said Dahme in an interview with the Huffington Post. Dahme went on to explain the significance of genocide education and the importance of emphasizing the efforts of people who hid, protected, and rescued Jewish people with no concern for their own safety. "I think it's very important to remember that it was a time in history when millions of people died and only because of their religion. But there's also the other side of the story, which is how many people cared and were willing to risk their lives to save Jews and anyone else."

Dahme was inducted in the New Jersey Hall of Fame as one of the state's Unsung Heroes in 2014. She served as president of the New Jersey State Board of Education and has spent much of her time speaking to students and adults about her experiences during World War II. Dahme's story was published in a 2015 memoir entitled "Chocolate, The Taste of Freedom." The memoir was co-written and edited by Maryann McLoughlin of Stockton University's Sara & Sam Schoffer Holocaust Resource center.

Dahme will speak at the Summit Old Guard's weekly meeting on Tuesday, May 9th at 10 a.m. in the Parish Hall of the New Providence Presbyterian Church, 1307 Springfield Ave., New Providence, NJ. This presentation is open to guests and prospective new members, who are also invited to enjoy coffee and conversation at a social reception starting at 9:15 a.m.

About the Summit Old Guard: The Old Guard of the Summit NJ area was founded in 1930 with the purpose of providing retired business and professional men with good fellowship and activities. Men from throughout the broader Summit area gather on Tuesday mornings to hear from interesting speakers on a broad range of topics.
