CELEBRATING THE WEEK OF THE YOUNG CHILD

Under the leadership of Principal Elise A. Genao, Robert Gordon Elementary School in Roselle Park celebrated the Week of the Young Child in a fun new way.

The Week of the Young Child is a week full of celebrating early learning, young children, their teachers, families, and communities. This special week is an annual celebration sponsored by the National Association for the Education of Young Children (NAEYC), the world's largest early childhood education association. According to NAEYC, the purpose of the Week of the Young Child is to focus public attention on the needs of young children and their families and to recognize the early childhood programs and services that meet those needs.

Robert Gordon PreK classes celebrated the Week of the Young Child April 3, 4, and 5.

Monday was Music Monday and was celebrated in a variety of ways such as dressing like a rock star and creating their own instruments.

Tuesday was Tasty Tuesday celebrated in a variety of ways such as wearing clothes with images of food on them and creating a rainbow fruit salad.

Work Together Wednesday was celebrated in workout wear while the school did a cereal donation domino challenge. This activity was implemented by Robert Gordon Alumni and Kean University Student Teacher Miss Hanarae Force. The student body was encouraged to donate new

boxes of cereal. Robert Gordon donated a total of 130 cereal boxes. Then the fourth grade classes (Teachers: Mrs. Karima Laidoui and Miss Tanaz Karai) worked together with PreK classes (Teachers: Mrs. Melissa Cruz, Miss Jessica Lopez, Mrs. Tara Pisano, and Mrs. Rosangela Perez) to create a cereal box domino chain throughout the hallways. After the fun domino chain activity, cereal boxes were distributed and donated to the food pantries at the Roselle Park Casano Center, Kean University Cougar Pantry at the Union campus, and Union County College Food Pantry at the Cranford campus. The PreK classes went on a short walk to the Casano Center to personally donate a portion of the boxes to the food pantry.

Miss Force further developed this popular activity to demonstrate to the young children in the Pre-k classes that we can come together as a school to have fun and also provide for the community and other schools; while also celebrating and bringing awareness to the Week of the Young Child.

Miss Force, a Robert Gordon alumni, began her student teaching journey in September 2022. She has described this experience as magical. Miss Force expressed her gratitude towards Principal Genao for continuing to provide an excellent education where students will grow in intelligence, creativity, and character. Miss Force was inspired by Principal Genao to implement this project and activity to continue the Robert Gordon mission.



BOROUGH ANNOUNCES SMART-PHONE APP

The Borough of Roselle Park is excited to unveil its very first smartphone app, "My Roselle Park." Users can now download this free app in order to gain access to a number of useful tools, streamlining the flow of information from the Borough to its residents.

"I am excited about the Roselle Park app!" said Mayor Joe Signorello. "We all carry around our devices, and now at the touch of a button we have a tool to help keep the community clean, safe and increase awareness of events and services that Roselle Park has for its residents. This app is easy to use and a great resource for not only locals but visitors seeking information about our town."

The app features a "report issue" button which allows citizens to report non-emergency issues like potholes, garbage, graffiti, code violations, and more. Once pressed, residents can describe the issue that they are seeing in real-time, as well as tag their location. They have the ability to upload a photo of that issue, and will receive an alert once it has been resolved.

App users can receive up-to-date information about amenities, local events, activities, and news. The app is connected to the Borough webpage, Facebook and Instagram accounts. By opting-in, the user can receive push notifications for when an event is happening or if a road is closed for maintenance. In the "Contact" section there is a thorough list of important phone numbers such as The Casano Community Center, Library and the Non-Emergency Police Department line.

On Monday, May 29, 2023, the Borough of Roselle Park will be holding its annual Memorial Day Celebration, consisting of a parade and solemn service.



SOS ~ SAVE OUR SEAL! A MESSAGE FROM THE U.C. HISTORICAL SOCIETY

War is hell. Unfortunately, that powerful expression is just as accurate today in Ukraine, for example, as it was in Elizabethtown in 1780. In both cases, civilians suffered, and are suffering, along with soldiers.

Heroic sculptures and statues of beribboned generals on horseback are noble and inspiring, to be sure. On the other hand, however, there is the World War II Katyn Memorial in Jersey City, showing the horror of war as it depicts the brutal massacre Russians committed on Polish soldiers graphically showing a bound and gagged Polish soldier impaled through his back by a bayonetted rifle. At its base, a Polish woman cradles a starving child, representing the Polish citizens who were deported to Siberia. Are we to take down such monuments because the horror they depict offends us, or should they remain, conveying their timeless message to us: "Never forget, and Never again!"

Yes, war is hell. And it was so in 1780 as local patriots fought for independence against the often cruel and brutal British and Hessian troops.

One of the most infamous events of that struggle was the horrible murder of Mrs. Hannah Caldwell, the wife of the famous Rev. James Caldwell ("the fighting Parson"), on June 7, 1780 in Connecticut Farms, now Union. It seems that ongoing discussions concerning the changing of the County Seal depicting Mrs. Caldwell's murder by a British soldier apparently have finally come to light recently.

This tragic event has been depicted on our County Seal for over 100 years. In 1923, the



Union County Historical Society proposed and supported the official adoption of the Seal, which had previously been used unofficially for decades. It was formally ratified by the Board of Freeholders at that time. The Society has been proud of its role in the adoption of the Seal a hundred years ago, and strongly opposes current efforts to change it.

Some now object to the Seal's depiction of a violent and senseless act against a woman and mother of nine young children. But it really happened! Are we to ignore it? Those were dangerous times in this area and few were spared from the death, destruction, and suffering that occurred.

Indeed, Hannah Caldwell's death became a rallying cry to the despondent, tired, and outnumbered American troops who were inspired

to fight on at the Battle of Springfield, the turning point of the Revolution in the North, just two weeks after her death.

Whether she was inside the house or outside when she was murdered is immaterial to the Seal's message. Showing her outside the house simply makes the event more visible. Similar artistic license is often employed in depicting important events in history. For example, the iconic and dramatic 1851 Emanuel Leutz painting of Washington's 1776 Christmas night crossing of the Delaware near Trenton is inaccurate in every way except one: its heroic portrayal of a courageous and brilliant military operation, which led to an important turning point in the war.

History is not always convenient; it has more than its share of suffering and evil, as the Union County Seal demonstrates. And isn't that in fact the meaning and message of the Seal, that democracy and freedom often demand sacrifice. It is a reminder of the terrible price paid by the brave men and women during those difficult times. Any redesign of our iconic and unique Seal would dishonor and diminish the memory of Hannah Caldwell and so many others who sacrificed all in the long and difficult struggle for independence.

Indeed, after the war, Washington acknowledged that no place had suffered greater deprivation and destruction than Elizabethtown and its environs. Our Seal reminds us of that. Let it be.

Rosemarie's fundraising efforts to support the Sharing Network Foundation have been powered by many of her family members and friends who are participating in the 5K Celebration of Life on May 20 in Ocean Grove. "Team Rosie," named in honor of Rosemarie's mother (Rose Marie Hampp), was established earlier this year to

"My mom lived a healthy and happy life until she was diagnosed with primary amyloidosis," said Rosemarie. "Her health issues grew progressively worse and dialysis treatments were never easy."

Once Rosemarie learned about the possibility of being a living kidney donor for her mother, she was eager to move forward with hopes of giving her mother the gift of life. However, her parents did not want her to donate her kidney.

"Even though I knew they were against it, I secretly got tested for transplant compatibility," said Rosemarie. "When the results showed that I was a great match, I was a nervous wreck because I was not sure how I was going to tell them about it."

Although Rosemarie's mother was hesitant at first, she finally agreed. The successful kidney transplant was completed by the medical team at Cooperman Barnabas Medical Center on December 17, 2003. Rosemarie's gift gave her mother several additional years to enjoy life's precious moments.

"We named my donated kidney 'Fred,' and we called my remaining kidney 'Ginger' because they worked well together and individually," said Rosemarie. "My mom ultimately passed away in 2006 due to pancreatitis. It was unrelated to her transplant, and her kidney always worked perfectly."

Rosemarie has also used her professional art skills to create colorful Donate Life stickers to raise additional funds and awareness.
