#### DOMINICK DEFILIPPIS NJ WRESTLING CHAMP

The 2023 USA Wrestling-New Jersey Chapter hosted the Youth State Wrestling Tournament at Cure Insurance Arena in Trenton, NJ this past March. In order to compete in the event, each wrestler had to attend a State Qualifier. There are 9 Qualifiers held across the entire state, with the Top 3 wrestlers from each qualifier earning a spot at the State Tournament. Dominick DeFilippis from Summit entered the 10u division at 60 lbs. He has been wrestling since he was 4 years old, but this was the first time he attempted to qualify for the states. He won the North Hunterdon Qualifier in dominating fashion and earned his first trip to Trenton.

At the state tournament, the 10u 60 lb. division was filled with former State Champions and multiple State Place-winners. A very competitive weight class, Dominick had his work cut out for him. He won all 5 of his matches to earn his first New Jersey State Title, and the right to be called a New Jersey State Champion.

Dominick represented the Yale Street Wrestling Club which is owned and operated by his parents. His mom is a teacher at CPC here in town, and his dad is a Summit Police Officer. He is in fourth grade at Jefferson School where his brother Anthony also attends first grade. Anthony will have his turn at the state tournament next year in 2024.

Other Summit wrestlers who qualified for the State Tournament representing Yale Street: Johnny Matter, Paul Spitzer, Aiden Hoefs, George Pijut, and Aiden Ferguson.

### **HOLOCAUST SURVIVOR TO SPEAK - MAY 9TH**

#### The Summit Old Guard

Of the 1.6 million Jewish children who lived in Europe before World War II, only 100,00 survived the Holocaust. Most were hidden children. Separated from her parents in July 1942, 6-year old Maud Dahme and her 4-year old sister, Rita, were hidden from the Nazis by Christian families in the Netherlands. Dahme will share with the Summit Old Guard her wartime experiences, as well as her reunion with her parents, immigration to the United States at age 14, and serving as a Holocaust education advocate.

"I think the greatest gift that was given me was to be alive," said Dahme in an interview with the Huffington Post. Dahme went on to explain the significance of genocide education and the importance of emphasizing the efforts of people who hid, protected, and rescued Jewish people with no concern for their own safety. "I think it's very important to remember that it was a time in history when millions of people died and only because of their religion. But there's also the other side of the story, which is how many people cared and were willing to risk their lives to save Jews and anyone else."

Dahme was inducted in the New Jersey Hall of Fame as one of the state's Unsung Heroes in 2014. She served as president of the New Jersey State Board of Education and has spent much of her time speaking to students and adults about her experiences during World War II. Dahme's story was published in a 2015 memoir entitled "Chocolate, The Taste of Freedom." The memoir was co-written and edited by Maryann McLoughlin of Stockton University's Sara & Sam Schoffer Holocaust Resource center.

Dahme will speak at the Summit Old Guard's weekly meeting on Tuesday, May 9th at 10 a.m. in the Parish Hall of the New Providence Presbyterian Church, 1307 Springfield Ave., New Providence, NJ. This presentation is open to guests and prospective new members, who are also invited to enjoy coffee and conversation at a social reception starting at 9:15 a.m.

### SOS ~ SAVE OUR SEAL! A MESSAGE FROM THE U.C. HISTORICAL SOCIETY

War is hell. Unfortunately, that powerful in the war. expression is just as accurate today in Ukraine, for example, as it was in Elizabethtown in 1780. In both cases, civilians suffered, and are suffering, along with soldiers.

Heroic sculptures and statues of beribboned generals on horseback are noble and inspiring, to be sure. On the other hand, however, there is the World War II Katyn Memorial in Jersey City, showing the horror of war as it depicts the brutal massacre Russians committed on Polish soldiers graphically showing a bound and gagged Polish soldier impaled through his back by a bayonetted rifle. At its base, a Polish woman cradles a starving child, representing the Polish citizens who were deported to Siberia. Are we to take down such monuments because the horror they depict offends us, or should they remain, conveying their timeless message to us: "Never forget, and Never again!"

Yes, war is hell. And it was so in 1780 as local patriots fought for independence against the often cruel and brutal British and Hessian troops.

One of the most infamous events of that struggle was the horrible murder of Mrs. Hannah Caldwell, the wife of the famous Rev. James Caldwell ("the fighting Parson"), on June 7, 1780 in Connecticut Farms, now Union. It seems that ongoing discussions concerning the changing of the County Seal depicting Mrs. Caldwell's murder by a British soldier apparently have finally come to light recently.

This tragic event has been depicted on our County Seal for over 100 years. In 1923, the Union County Historical Society proposed and supported the official adoption of the Seal, which had previously been used unofficially for decades. It was formally ratified by the Board of Freeholders at that time. The Society has been proud of its role in the adoption of the Seal a hundred years ago, and strongly opposes current efforts to change it.

Some now object to the Seal's depiction of a violent and senseless act against a woman and mother of nine young children. But it really happened! Are we to ignore it? Those were dangerous times in this area and few were spared from the death, destruction, and suffering that occurred.

Indeed, Hannah Caldwell's death became a rallying cry to the despondent, tired, and outnumbered American troops who were inspired to fight on at the Battle of Springfield, the turning point of the Revolution in the North, just two weeks after her death.

Whether she was inside the house or outside when she was murdered is immaterial to the Seal's message. Showing her outside the house simply makes the event more visible. Similar artistic license is often employed in depicting important events in history. For example, the iconic and dramatic 1851 Emanuel Leutz painting of Washington's 1776 Christmas night crossing of the Delaware near Trenton is inaccurate in every way except one: its heroic portrayal of a courageous and brilliant military operation, which led to an important turning point

History is not always convenient; it has more than its share of suffering and evil, as the Union County Seal demonstrates. And isn't that in fact the meaning and message of the Seal, that democracy and freedom often demand sacrifice. It is a reminder of the terrible price paid by the brave men and women during those difficult times. Any redesign of our iconic and unique Seal would dishonor and diminish the memory of Hannah Caldwell and so many others who sacrificed all in the long and difficult struggle for independence.

Indeed, after the war, Washington acknowledged that no place had suffered greater deprivation and destruction than Elizabethtown and its environs. Our Seal reminds us of that. Let it be.

### **LETTER FROM GRACE TO THE COMMUNITY**

#### **DEAR NEIGHBORS,**

Our neighbors facing dire financial straits are our primary focus. Thanks to the neighbors who communicated their concerns, we have expanded our focus to the neighbors who share the Cornog Field House neighborhood.

On March 2, 2023, GRACE broke its record serving 718 households in one day. On March 9, we began a wide-sweeping referral process to make sure everyone who comes to GRACE can get what they need as fully and efficiently as possible, although not necessarily at GRACE. From the new referral program, we have seen a significant drop in demand in the following weeks. This week we served 495 households.

Of the households served by GRACE this week, 44% received their food through deliveries by volunteers this week. Last week it was an even split, deliveries and in person pick ups.

We served 276 at the Field House this week, the other households received groceries via delivery. Of those 276, 31 households walked from home. 245 households arrived in 95 cars. Most of the households carpool. From 4:30 to 7:30 pm, 95 cars visited Cornog via the carline or they parked and walked up to pick up their groceries.

We diverted the early arriving vehicles before 4:30 p.m. All cars that arrived before 5:30 turned

off their engines.

Lt. Daly conducted a traffic safety evaluation. We immediately implemented the traffic and safety improvements. Lt. Daly and other officers have attended the distribution to monitor the situation and will continue to do so. Drivers of cars in violation will get a ticket. The only cars in violation at Memorial Field this week were there to attend baseball.

We continuously study who comes and why they come. We count the number of cars, check for proof of residence, and ask GRACE participants what their connection is to Summit. This week 70% are Summit residents and the others work, worship, attend school or receive medical care in Summit.

Starting Thursday, April 13, we will open midday distribution hours to alleviate evening congestion.

Our community is strongest when we collaborate.

### A RAPTOR FESTIVAL - COMMUNITY DAY AT TRT - MAY 21

The Raptor Trust's 9th annual Community Day will take place on Sunday, May 21, 2023 from 11 a.m. -3 p.m. We invite you and your family for a day of all things bird!

Spring and summer are our busiest time of year, and we're preparing for the adorable invasion of tiny Robins, Great Horned Owl fluffballs, and baby Blue Jays with an attitude, among hundreds of other youngsters.

The average cost of one bird's total rehabilitation is currently \$237, and, because we admit an average of 5,000-6,000 birds per year, those costs quickly add up. All proceeds from the event provide resources for these busy monthsfrom purchasing food and medicine for injured birds of all ages and species, to maintaining the caging and grounds that visitors can enjoy.

#### SPOTTED LANTERNFLIES **ARE HATCHING**

Invasive Insect Is a Danger to Trees, Decorative Plantings, and Agriculture

Residents are reminded to keep an eye out for the invasive spotted lanternfly that has caused damage to residential and agricultural plants and trees throughout the area. Residents are asked to check trees, fences, and other flat surfaces around their homes and neighborhoods for egg masses, as well as grown lanternflies and Stomp Them Out!

The spotted lanternfly is native to China, India, and Vietnam. It was first sighted in the United States in Pennsylvania, and has since spread to surrounding states, including New Jersey. The spotted lanternfly was first discovered in Somerset County in 2019. While not harmful to humans or animals, this invasive insect feeds on the sap of many different hardwood trees, scrubs, ornamental plants, and has the potential to impact agricultural crops of economic importance such as grape vines, hops, and apple orchards. Feeding damage caused by the spotted lanternfly significantly stresses the affected plants which can lead to decreased health and potential crop loss.

Residents and visitors are advised to keep an eye out for spotted lanternflies and their egg masses and kill them on sight. Destroying spotted lanternfly egg masses before they hatch is the best way to limit their spread. Eggs can be laid on any flat hard surface including metal, wood, and plastic. Egg masses are commonly found on fence posts, telephone poles, lawn furniture, and the underside of tree branches. Egg laying begins in September and continues through November or until the first freeze.

While adult spotted lanternflies do not survive the cold winters, their egg masses do. Beginning in May through June, the eggs will start to hatch and mature through their life stages into adulthood. Join the battle to beat the bug and help us Stomp Them Out!

#### **IF YOU FIND SPOTTED LANTERNFLY EGG MASSES:**

- Scrape egg masses using scraper cards, or
- anything else that is hard, tapered and/or flat
  - Kill eggs by putting them into doubled bags, using alcohol/hand sanitizer, or by smashing
