FIRE DEPARTMENT CELEBRATING 125 YEARS

The Chatham Volunteer Fire Department is celebrating its 125th anniversary this year. The community was invited to an Open House event held on Saturday, May 6, 2023.

The Chatham Volunteer Fire Department was formally organized on May 7, 1898. Initially the department was organized as two companies, one on either side of the railroad tracks. Initial equipment consisted of two hose carts and some hose purchased second hand from Morristown. A second hand ladder truck later joined the equipment roster. Equipment was rushed to a fire scene by hand, with horses being borrowed from one of the local livery stables when needed. The equipment was stored in rented space on Passaic Avenue.

In 1907 a combined Borough Hall and Fire House on was constructed on Fairmount Ave. 1959 when a new Firehouse was constructed using a section of Reasoner Park.

The need to borrow horses ended in 1911 when the CVFD acquired their first motorized piece of fire equipment, a homebuilt fire truck converted from a Locomobile touring car. In 1914 the CVFD purchased their first purpose built fire motorized truck from American La France.

In addition to providing fire protection, the CVFD has been instrumental in establishing many beloved local traditions. In December of 1918 the CVFD began the tradition of decorating and displaying a tree in Reasoner Park

for the holidays. In 1919 the CVFD helped to raise funds for the first version of what is today the Chatham Municipal Pool.

The Chatham Emergency Squad was originally organized as a unit of the CVFD in 1935.

In 1952 a great local tradition was born as the CVFD established their annual 4th of July parade and fireworks celebration. This well loved tradition continues to delight Chatham residents of all ages as well as to bring former residents back into town.

In 1959, having long outgrown their original location on Fairmount Ave., the CVFD moved into their new quarters in the current firehouse.

Other Chatham traditions that originated with the CVFD includes the Annual Small Fry Fishing Derby, first held in 1964, and the annual post holiday Christmas Tree Collection. The Christmas tree collection was originally organized as a fire prevention effort by the CVFD.

Today's CVFD continues the commitment to the safety and welfare of the citizens of Chatham Borough that was shown by the founding members 125 years ago. A new volunteer undergoes over 100 hours of rigorous formal training using modern equipment that was not yet even imagined in 1898. Regular drills keep their skills up to date. One thing that has not changed in 125 years: the commitment to the safety and welfare of the citizens of Chatham Borough that has always been shown by the members of the CVFD.



THE CONSEQUENCES OF UNDERAGE DRINKING

Municipal Alliance Committee of the Chathams

As high school graduation and other celebratory events approach us, please take the time to speak to your teen(s) about the consequences of underage drinking.

Underage drinking can have serious consequences for teens and young adults. According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), at least 6 youth under 21 die every day from non-driving alcohol-related causes (such as drowning and suicide). Studies have shown that alcohol consumption by adolescents results in brain damage (possibly permanent) and impairs intellectual development. When drinking is delayed until age 21, a child's risk of serious alcohol problems decreases by 70%.

Underage drinking is against the law, and it is also against the law for adults to serve or provide alcohol to minors. Parents who host parties and permit underage drinking may face serious consequences as a result. Adults who provide alcohol to minors can be held legally responsible for anything that happens when the minors drink and can face legal consequences. The penalties for giving alcohol to minors or allowing alcohol to be consumed on your property can include fines and is a Criminal Disorderly Persons Offense. A civil claim could also hold you financially responsible for injuries

sustained by a third party as a result of the actions of a minor, who has been illegally served or had alcohol.

"Parents Who Host, Lose the Most" is a public health awareness campaign that encourages parents and the community to send a unified message that teen alcohol consumption is unacceptable.

WHAT YOU CAN DO:

- Always be home when your child has a party or friends over.
- Let your child know that drinking alcohol is not ok and how alcohol can and will affect them.
- Check and make sure that alcohol is not brought into your home by other teens or young adults.
- Know your kids' friends and communicate with other parents.







HISTORICAL SOCIETY HOLDS ANNUAL DINNER MEETING

The Chatham Historical Society held its annual dinner meeting on Tuesday, May 9, 2023 at the United Methodist Church. The annual dinner meeting resumed after three years of pandemic restrictions and disruptions. Special guest, His Excellency General Washington, entertained the audience with recollections of the most significant battles of the Revolutionary War, spiced with anecdotes of the United States' journey to independency.

As customary the officers for the society were elected for 2023-2024. Amy Crandall and Karen Hoerrner will serve as co-presidents, Debbie Fabian as vice president, Christine Grobert as treasurer, and Stacey Keenan as secretary.

Long-time board members Diane Conlan and Gerry Geisler were honored for their outstanding contributions to the Chatham Historical Society. The co-presidents also presented the Library of the Chathams with an annual contribution check for the library's support and assistance.

General Washington's presentation highlighted the many miracles that turned the tables on the British in the colonies' long road to winning their independence. He touched upon the small role that Chatham played in the final stages of the war.

In August 1781 Washington and his troops set up a camp in Chatham. The bread ovens were constructed to fool the British into thinking that Washington and his troops were staying in the area and preparing to attack New York. In reality, Washington secretly planned to move his troops to the south and attack the British at Yorktown, Virginia. It took over a day for the British to realize that Washington had left the area. The American and French forces surrounded Yorktown on September 28, 1781. The battles continued for over two weeks until British General Cornwall surrendered on October 19, 1781 thus successfully concluding the Revolutionary War.

Chatham Historical Society will be celebrating its 100th Anniversary in 2024. The society is looking for volunteers to help plan the upcoming celebrations of this milestone. More information on the society can be found on its website chathamnjhistoricalsociety.org.





PROTECT YOURSELF - KNOW THE SCAMS

Sometimes impostors contact PSE&G customers demanding immediate payment and threatening service shut off. Don't be a victim...be prepared.

PHONE SCAMS

Residential and small business customers have reported receiving phone calls from individuals claiming to be PSE&G employees. Payment is demanded within hours using a pre-paid debit card. Things to know:

- PSE&G offers a variety of payment options and would never require a specific type of payment.
- Customers scheduled for disconnection due to nonpayment receive written notice on their bill at least 15 days in advance.
- PSE&G will never ask for personal information over the phone unless you initiated the contact.
- If you ever doubt the legitimacy of a call from PSE&G, especially if payment is demanded, hang up and call us directly.

EMAIL SCAMS

PSE&G customers have reported receiving convincing-looking emails that are actually fraudulent. Emails sent by PSE&G would never:

- Threaten to close your account if you do not take immediate action
- Ask customers to provide personal information online without first logging into My Account
- Should you receive a suspicious email DO NOT reply, click any links, or download any attachments.
- If you're unsure of the legitimacy of the email, feel free to call PSE&G Customer Service.

IMPOSTORS AT YOUR DOOR

If anyone comes to your door looking like, or claiming to be, a PSE&G employee, ask for ID. All PSE&G employees must carry ID and present it when requested. If you are not convinced, do not let the person in your house. Call us at 1-800-436-PSEG (7734). A Customer Service Representative will gladly verify if a technician has been dispatched to your location.

THINGS TO KNOW:

- If the person at your door gives you a different phone number to verify his/her presence, do not call it. Only call 1-800-436-PSEG (7734).
- PSE&G will never send employees to your home or small business offering cash refunds on deposits or utility charges. We will only either credit your account or mail a check to your service address.

leaders in providing immigration resources and refugee support. The book also offers a discussion of the moral issues around border walls, as well as a historical overview of the Reformed Christian faith tradition of welcoming the stranger and providing help to neighbors near and far.

RE-“CYCLE” YOUR USED BIKES AND SEWING MACHINES

Pedals for Progress & Sewing Peace of High Bridge, NJ is having a used bike and sewing machine collection sponsored by Faith Lutheran Church at 524 South Street in New Providence on June 17, 2023 from 9:00 a.m. until 12:00 p.m. Anyone with an adult or child’s bicycle in rideable or easily repairable condition is urged to donate that bike to this worthy cause. “Bikes for parts” or disassembled bicycles will not be accepted. Working portable sewing machines are also greatly appreciated and put to good use around the world. If you are unable to drop your donation off on the actual collection date, you may do so ahead of time by leaving your bicycle(s) in Faith Lutheran’s lower lot next to the utility shed. If you are donating a sewing machine, please leave it underneath the sheltered alcove by the main doors at the bottom of the parking lot.

Every year, Americans buy 22 million new bicycles and discard millions of old ones, abandoning many more unused in basements, sheds, and garages. Most of these end up in our already overburdened landfills. Meanwhile, underprivileged people overseas need cheap, non-polluting transportation to get to jobs, markets, medical care and schools. Pedals for Progress has received, processed and donated

over 165,000 bicycles, 6,000 used sewing machines and millions of dollars in new spare parts to partner charities in 32 developing world countries. In 2022, deliveries were made to partners in Belize, Cameroon, Guatemala, Rwanda, Somalia, Togo and Uganda.

It costs approximately \$52 to collect, process, ship, rebuild and distribute each bicycle or sewing machine. A donation toward shipping costs is necessary with a suggested minimum \$20 per item. All cash and material donations are fully deductible, and a receipt will be provided on site. Pedals for Progress is a 501(c)(3) corporation and a registered charity in the states of NJ, NY, PA, CT, VT. Brochures explaining this innovative program will be available at the collection site.



NEW JERSEY VETERANS NETWORK MEMORIAL DAY MESSAGE

Michael D. Boll, Director, NJVN

A few years ago, I was approached by a veteran who is a friend of mine who expressed how extremely depressed he was and that he wanted to take his own life. Initially, I was completely shocked because this guy seemed to be upbeat and happy all the time. Immediately, I asked him to come with me to a private office so we could talk about his awful situation. This was the first time in my life that I had a friend talk to me about suicide, and I knew I had to really do my best to help him get through this horrible ordeal. We spoke for a few hours and I listened closely to everything he said. I was able to convince him to immediately get some help and we went to the hospital. I stayed with him at the hospital and met with him when he was released. I did everything to show my friend that I had his back, and because of this he is alive today. This awful situation inspired me to do whatever I possibly can to help others in need, and shortly after the New Jersey Veteran's Network created our mobile outreach program.

In today's day and age, most of you have known a veteran or first responder who has taken their own life. We lose nearly 22 veterans and approximately 300 first responders every year to suicide. Even with all the awareness and new anti-suicide programs available, this number has not changed, and in some cases has

increased.

The VA hospitals with PTSD and mental health programs are packed with patients and unfortunately, the numbers continue to increase. More of our first responders are also seeking help and are utilizing some of the state programs being offered. So many people want to help and put an end to this crisis, but sadly there isn't a foolproof program available that will stop this ever-growing crisis from destroying our uniformed heroes and their family's lives.

For the last two years, our team has been working tirelessly with other charities to come up with a better solution to help prevent this epidemic from continuing. Personally, we believe our Mobile Outreach Team is really making a difference and everyday it helps our uniformed heroes live a better way of life.

The first thing we learned as a team is that we must lose our ego and seek out other groups and organizations that are looking to save lives. Then we find the right volunteers who are committed and dedicated to being a mentor to a person in crisis. Volunteers are extremely valuable because they want to be there, and they usually care more than the people who get paid for their services.

To date, we have been able to change and save countless lives because of the incredible commitment from the volunteers and other

supporting groups. In the next few months we are excited to be launching the "Uniformed Heroes Project," which is a statewide peer support/mentorship program for veterans, first responders, and active duty military. This project is a collaboration between the NJ VFW, NJ American Legion, NJ FMBA, PFANJ, NJSPBA, NJ FOP, NJ MAVA, NJ legislators, other military/first responder organizations.
