The American Legion Auxiliary Unit 328 of Clark is celebrating its 75th year of service.

According to nj.gov/services, New Jersey had 360,415 veterans as of 2019. 5.4% of them live below the poverty level. The median income for NJ veterans in January, 2023 was \$41,881.

According to veteransdata.info, New Jersey is home to 50,175 disabled veterans.

The American Legion Auxiliary's mission is to help all veterans and their families. Unit 328 of the Clark American Legion Auxiliary is one of the most active in Union County. Some of the activities Unit 328 does serves veterans directly, and other activities aid the community.

WHAT EXACTLY DO WE DO?

At all times the Auxiliary helps the American Legion Post 328 with any project, activity, or issue where we can offer assistance.

Currently the Clark Auxiliary is collecting clothes, new and slightly used, for a veteran's homeless shelter and a women's shelter which houses women and children. Donations can be dropped off at the American Legion Post 328, 78 Westfield Avenue, Clark.

A food drive is ongoing to service several food pantry and community kitchens in the Clark area. Non-perishable items can be delivered to the American Legion Post 328 at 78 Westfield Avenue, Clark.

Gift cards for baby items have been purchased for women veterans who are expecting. A "baby shower" is being held in June.

A \$200 donation was given to the New Jersey Veterans Memorial Home in Menlo Park for recreational activities for home residents.

Unit 328 is collecting small, new gift items to give to the Menlo Pak Veterans Home Gift store where residents can pick items, at no charge, to give to family members for holidays or birthdays, etc.

Coffee and cake were delivered this spring to

the Women Veterans housed at the Lyons VA Medical Center in Bernards Township, NJ.

Previously, the Clark Auxiliary has visited the women veterans to host a pizza and dessert evening of crafts. But since the Covid pandemic, no visitors have been allowed.

Every June Unit 328 sends two High School junior girls to Girls State. Girls State is a weeklong educational seminar held at Georgian Court University in Lakewood. The girls learn how the local, county, state and federal government work. They create, run, and elect representatives to jobs held by politicians on all levels. This year Emilie Wagman of Union Catholic High School and Layla Soto from Linden High School will attend from June 18 to 22nd.

Every September the Clark Auxiliary prepares backpacks for local students filled with school supplies. These are distributed by local Boards of Education to needy students. One of our guiding principals is education of our youth.

The third project is to renovate the former parish hall and church building on campus to expand and enhance the many support services offered by the agency. The fourth project is to reconfigure and repave the parking lot.


Bernadette Murphy, Executive Director, remarked that the overarching goal of the plan is to "serve our sisters and brothers in need with dignity." At the Groundbreaking Event, she introduced the agency's new logo and tagline, "Connecting Communities - Nourishing Each Other." To fulfill its mission, the agency relies

"In addition to serving the hungry, St. Joseph's is also a place that feeds the hunger to serve," stated Murphy. 





Michele Ford, President & CEO, Inroads To Opportunities, was recently interviewed on 106.7 Lite FM, "Get Connected," with Host Nina Del Rio. Inroads to Opportunities is a Union County, NJ based non-profit human services agency, that provides programs and services to individuals with disabilities.

In a wide-ranging conversation, Ford covered what drew her to advocacy, her experiences and vast responsibilities at Inroads. Ford is dedicated to the success of each participant and noted that Inroads is one of the most diverse workplaces to be employed.

During National Autism Awareness Month, Inroads expands their already robust outreach to increase awareness for individuals with autism who are seeking employment. Ford mentions 45% of Inroads participants that transition from their school to work program are on the autism spectrum, but yet in the employment world 85% of people with autism and other disabilities are unemployed. This is a huge statistic and obstacle that Inroads seeks to turn around.

According to Ford, "Our participants bring such an enrichment to our setting...we really need employers to open their doors just for

practice, just to let someone come in and try." Exposure is necessary for these prospective employees to have a better understanding of their work environment and the expectations of their potential job.

The Garden Helpline volunteers are well trained to identify tick species including 'deer ticks' which transmit Lyme disease to humans and pets. This is an extremely valuable service as the deer and tick population continue to grow in New Jersey. Along with garden critters the Helpline will identify house infesting insects such as carpenter ants, termites and food infesting pests.

ARRIVE TOGETHER PROGRAM

Union County Prosecutor's Office

The Union County Prosecutor's Office is pleased to announce that New Jersey's highly regarded ARRIVE Together program, aimed at providing compassionate response during 9-1-1 calls involving a mental health crisis, has been expanded to additional police departments in Union County.

The focus of the ARRIVE Together program is to provide individuals in crisis with whatever help they need as quickly and effectively as possible, by teaming up a police officer – specifically trained in crisis intervention — with a civilian certified mental health screener in order to respond to 9-1-1 calls relating to a mental health crisis. The officer and crisis worker literally arrive together. Both are in plain clothes, and arrive at the call in an unmarked police vehicle. During the encounter, the mental health screener takes the lead.

This focused approach both supports the individual facing a mental health crisis, and protects the responding officers. The intention is to get the person in crisis the proper help they need as quickly as possible, while also preventing escalation and facilitating any necessary de-escalation.

The ARRIVE Together team also follows-up on these specific calls to ensure that the individual is doing well and does not need additional mental health support.

"Heart is a core value of the program, as this program humanely gets to the heart of many of the difficulties of responding to calls involving a mental health crisis for both law enforcement and those in crisis" said Union County Prosecutor William A. Daniel.

"This partnership approach enables a quicker response time to get the individual the help they need, rather than having to wait for the later arrival of a mental health screener," Director of the Pre-Indictment Division Tiffany Wilson, who is also the UCPO Liaison for the ARRIVE Together Program, states. "It also helps to avoid having this person come in contact with the criminal justice system."

The Prosecutor said that, since its inception, it is extremely promising that there have been

no injuries or escalations associated with any Union County ARRIVE Together calls, specifically because nationally, half of the "Use of Force" reports arise from police responding to these types of calls.

Elizabeth and Linden Police Departments were quick to pilot the program in June of 2022, following its creation and the Office of the Attorney General's pilot launch in November 2021 in Cumberland County involving a partnership between the Cumberland County Prosecutor's Office and the New Jersey State Police, who provide local police services in that part of the state.

Elizabeth Police Chief Sacca is optimistic about the benefits of the ARRIVE Together program. "Since the inception of ARRIVE together program in Elizabeth, in addition to the lack of force and injuries, the department has had great successes in aiding those experiencing homelessness. This success is not only a benefit for the individuals impacted, but a benefit for the relationship between the police department and the community as a whole."

The Roselle Park Police Department launched this program in December of 2022, followed by the current launch by the police departments in Clark, Cranford, Plainfield, Scotch Plains, and Westfield, along with the Union County Police Department and the Union County Sheriff's Office.

"Union County has led the way for the past two decades in sensitizing our law enforcement officers to the struggles of individuals dealing with the wide spectrum of mental illness," Prosecutor Daniel said. "We continue to offer law enforcement sensitivity training, including our intensive Crisis Intervention Team Training (CIT) and Autism Spectrum Awareness training, and de-escalation training, such as Integrated Communications, Assessment, and Tactics (ICAT)," he said.

"We are committed to partnering with the County community to tackle these tough issues, and to engage in honest dialogue with our citizens, with our eye on equality and social justice for all," he added.

NEW JERSEY VETERANS NETWORK MEMORIAL DAY MESSAGE

A few years ago, I was approached by a veteran who is a friend of mine who expressed how extremely depressed he was and that he wanted to take his own life. Initially, I was completely shocked because this guy seemed to be upbeat and happy all the time. Immediately, I asked him to come with me to a private office so we could talk about his awful situation. This was the first time in my life that I had a friend talk to me about suicide, and I knew I had to really do my best to help him get through this horrible ordeal. We spoke for a few hours and I listened closely to everything he said. I was able to convince him to immediately get some help and we went to the hospital. I stayed with him at the hospital and met with him when he was released. I did everything to show my friend that I had his back, and because of this he is alive today. This awful situation inspired me to do whatever I possibly can to help others in need, and shortly after the New Jersey Veteran's



Network created our mobile outreach program.

In today's day and age, most of you have known a veteran or first responder who has taken their own life. We lose nearly 22 veterans and approximately 300 first responders every year to suicide. Even with all the awareness and new anti-suicide programs available, this number has not changed, and in some cases has increased.

The VA hospitals with PTSD and mental health programs are packed with patients and unfortunately, the numbers continue to increase. More of our first responders are also seeking help and are utilizing some of the state programs being offered. So many people want to help and put an end to this crisis, but sadly there isn't a foolproof program available that will stop this ever-growing crisis from destroying our uniformed heroes and their family's lives.

For the last two years, our team has been working tirelessly with other charities to come up with a better solution to help prevent this epidemic from continuing. Personally, we believe our Mobile Outreach Team is really making a difference and everyday it helps our uniformed heroes live a better way of life.

The first thing we learned as a team is that we must lose our ego and seek out other groups and organizations that are looking to save lives. Then we find the right volunteers who are committed and dedicated to being a men-tor to a person in crisis. Volunteers are ex- tremely valuable because they want to be there, and they usually care more than the people who get paid

for their services.

To date, we have been able to change and save countless lives because of the in- credible commitment from the volunteers and other supporting groups. In the next few months we are excited to be launching the "Uniformed Heroes Project," which is a statewide peer support/mentorship program for veterans, first responders, and active duty military. This project is a collaboration between the NJ VFW, NJ American Legion, NJ FMBA, PFANJ, NJSPBA, NJ FOP, NJ MAVA, NJ legistrators, other military/first responder organizations. The Uniformed Heroes Project will provide peer support training throughout the state for volunteers and host numerous recreational therapy events for our heroes in need.




