# LOCAL STUDENTS SHINE IN K OF C CHESS TOURNEY

## TASTE OF FLORHAM PARK WAS A WELL-ATTENDED SUCCESS!

#### The Rotary Club of Florham Park

The Florham Park Rotary hosted the 4th Taste of Florham Park on May 8, 2023. It was an opportunity for local restaurants and eateries to get in front of the public, for residents to partake in some great food, and for the 100-room Mansion on the Florham campus of Fairleigh Dickinson to be on display. All for a great cause - raising money for the Scholarship Fund which awards Florham Park resident Seniors in local high schools for the volunteer work they do in the community.

Historical background about the venue is that Florence Vanderbilt and Hamilton Twombly, married in 1877, joined with Leslie Ward to incorporate Florham Park in 1899. Until her death in 1952 at the age of 98, premier socialite Florence Vanderbilt-Twombly held five parties every Spring and five parties every Fall in this Mansion (one of three which she owned).

Portraits on the walls kept the many guests company as they walked about Lenfell Hall enjoying food and desserts from Kyoto's Japanese Restaurant, Great Greek Mediterranean, CHOPT, Puleo's Brick Oven, Anita's Baked Wonders, Baba's Bakery, TAIM Mediterranean, Butter & Jam Bundt Cake. Main Street Wine & Liquors of Madison provided the wine, M&T Bank supplied water and soda, and Starbucks generously provided regular and decaf coffee.

Those Lenfell Hall portraits include Cornelius "Commodore" Vanderbilt and his son, William Henry Vanderbilt, who doubled the family fortune and became the richest man in the world. Also in Lenfell Hall were portraits of Florence Vanderbilt-Twombly and Hamilton Twombly. Yes, fashion designer and socialite Gloria Vanderbilt was a descendent as is Anderson Cooper of CNN.

The Madison Area YMCA donated a valuable door-prize, as did TM Ward Coffee of Chatham and Lucy's Gift of Florham Park with their gift baskets. The Y also paid for the shuttle service from/to the parking lot on campus. A serendipitous moment as philanthropist William H. Vanderbilt was a big supporter of the YMCA and coincidentally now the Y supported this Rotary fundraising event for students with a history of giving back to their community.

# **PROTECT YOURSELF - KNOW THE SCAMS**

Sometimes impostors contact PSE&G customers demanding immediate payment and threatening service shut off. Don't be a victim...be prepared.

#### **PHONE SCAMS**

Residential and small business customers have reported receiving phone calls from individuals claiming to be PSE&G employees. Payment is demanded within hours using a pre-paid debit card. Things to know:

- PSE&G offers a variety of payment options and would never require a specific type of payment.
- Customers scheduled for disconnection due to nonpayment receive written notice on their bill at least 15 days in advance.
- PSE&G will never ask for personal information over the phone unless you initiated the contact.
- If you ever doubt the legitimacy of a call from PSE&G, especially if payment is demanded, hang up and call us directly.

#### EMAIL SCAMS

PSE&G customers have reported receiving convincing-looking emails that are actually fraudulent. Emails sent by PSE&G would never: • Threaten to close your account if you do not take immediate action

- Ask customers to provide personal information online without first logging into My Account
- Should you receive a suspicious email DO NOT reply, click any links, or download any attachments.
- If you're unsure of the legitimacy of the email, feel free to call PSE&G Customer Service.

#### **IMPOSTORS AT YOUR DOOR**

If anyone comes to your door looking like, or claiming to be, a PSE&G employee, ask for ID. All PSE&G employees must carry ID and present it when requested. If you are not convinced, do not let the person in your house. Call us at 1-800-436-PSEG (7734). A Customer Service Representative will gladly verify if a technician has been dispatched to your location.

#### THINGS TO KNOW:

- If the person at your door gives you a different phone number to verify his/her presence, do not call it. Only call 1-800-436-PSEG (7734).
- PSE&G will never send employees to your home or small business offering cash refunds on deposits or utility charges. We will only either credit your account or mail a check to your service address.

Dr. Chervenak will assume the presidency from Steven Orland, MD.

"Dr. Chervenak is a passionate advocate for patient health, supportive colleague and dedicated physician," said Larry Downs, CEO of MSNJ. "With an eye on equity and focus on women's health issues, he will bring new ideas and fresh perspective to our organization. I welcome Dr. Chervenak as our new President for the 2023-2024 term, and fully support his continued leadership and advocacy on behalf of our physician members throughout the state."

In his inaugural speech as President, Dr. Chervenak shared the following thoughts:

"Harking back to the oaths we took when we received our medical licenses and degrees, the health and wellbeing of our patients is and will forever be our first priority as physicians. We are called to be protectors – even in the face of mental, physical and spiritual challenges. As physicians, we cannot be apathetic in our care and advocacy – we must listen, we must learn, we must protect and we must provide the highest quality of care to our patients, no matter the circumstance or situation. That is what it means to be a physician. I am proud to serve as the next President of MSNJ – not only to give a voice to our profession, but, more importantly, to those we care for each day."

Dr. Chervenak is a board-certified obstetrician/ gynecologist and the founder of Florham Park OB/GYN where he currently practices. He also serves a Clinical Associate Professor, Department of OB/GYN of Rutgers New Jersey Medical School and previously served as clinical chief of OB/GYN at Cooperman Barnabas Medical Center in Livingston.

He has been cited by both Assembly and Senate of New Jersey for his work, and was named a recipient of numerous awards, including MSNJ's DeGroote Award, recognizing a member whose selfless and idealistic work benefits broader humankind, and Edward J. III Excellence in Medicine Foundation's prestigious Peter W. Rodino, Jr. Citizen's Award, recognizing distinguished service in advancing and promoting the health and wellbeing of the people of New Jersey, to name a few.

Dr. Chervenak received a dual bachelor's degree in medical science and psychology and medical degree from Boston University, through the university's Accelerated Medical Program. # **NEW JERSEY VETERANS NETWORK MEMORIAL DAY MESSAGE**

A few years ago, I was approached by a veteran who is a friend of mine who expressed how extremely depressed he was and that he wanted to take his own life. Initially, I was completely shocked because this guy seemed to be upbeat and happy all the time. Immediately, I asked him to come with me to a private office so we could talk about his awful situation. This was the first time in my life that I had a friend talk to me about suicide, and I knew I had to really do my best to help him get through this horrible ordeal. We spoke for a few hours and I listened closely to everything he said. I was able to convince him to immediately get some help and we went to the hospital. I stayed with him at the hospital and met with him when he was released. I did everything to show my friend that I had his back, and because of this he is alive today. This awful situation inspired me to do whatever I possibly can to help others in need, and shortly after the New Jersey Veteran's Network created our mobile outreach program.

In today's day and age, most of you have known a veteran or first responder who has taken their own life. We lose nearly 22 veterans and approximately 300 first responders every year to suicide. Even with all the awareness and new anti-suicide programs available, this number has not changed, and in some cases has increased.

The VA hospitals with PTSD and mental health programs are packed with patients and unfortunately, the numbers continue to increase. More of our first responders are also seeking help and are utilizing some of the state programs being offered. So many people want to help and put an end to this crisis, but sadly there isn't a foolproof program available that will stop this ever-growing crisis from destroying our uniformed heroes and their family's lives.

For the last two years, our team has been working tirelessly with other charities to come up with a better solution to help prevent this epidemic from continuing. Personally, we believe our Mobile Outreach Team is really making a difference and everyday it helps our uniformed heroes live a better way of life.

The first thing we learned as a team is that we must lose our ego and seek out other groups and organizations that are looking to save lives. Then we find the right volunteers who are committed and dedicated to being a men-tor to a person in crisis. Volunteers are ex- tremely valuable because they want to be there, and they usually care more than the people who get paid for their services.

To date, we have been able to change and save countless lives because of the in- credible commitment from the volunteers and other supporting groups. In the next few months we are excited to be launching the "Uniformed Heroes Project," which is a statewide peer support/mentorship program for veterans, first responders, and active duty military.
