



TOWNSHIP OF UNION EDUCATION FOUNDATION AWARDS GRANTS

The Township of Union Education Foundation is pleased to announce that they are awarding 10 grants to teachers in the Township of Union public schools for the school year 2023-2024.

Mini grants of up to \$750 were awarded to the following teachers:

Cathy Jakositz, Kawameeh Middle School, has been awarded a grant for replacements parts for the aeroponic garden which she received from a prior grant from the Foundation. Ms. Jakositz has used the garden as a catalyst for a Garden Club which was a place where general education students and students with special needs could join and work together to learn how to grow not only plants but friendships as well.

Nicole Kelly, 8th grade English teacher at Kawameeh Middle School, and Danielle Stabler, 8th grade science teacher at Kawameeh Middle School, will receive a 3D printer which will enable the science students to visualize abstract concepts by creating physical models, as well as to design and create prototypes that can be tested and further improved upon as part of the engineering process. Students in the English classrooms can create visual representation of literary settings, historical monuments as they read novels, poems and plays in a way to visualize the setting and understand the context better.

Lauren Kohn and Marcy Musarra, who teach English self-contained grades 9-12 at Union High School, will receive funds for sets of books for each special needs student in their class. These students will be exposed to a variety of genres, explore literature as a form of entertainment and make connections to real life skills.

Thomas Lubanski, CAST teacher at Union High School, and Sandra Mangarella, Screenwriting 9-12 and other Language Arts classes teacher at Union High School, requested funds that will enable their students to enter nationwide contests where they can showcase their talents in screenwriting and television production. Having entry fees paid will provide students with a chance to build a professional portfolio which they can showcase to industry professionals and receive feedback and national recognition for their efforts.

LaShanna Armour, Integrated Preschool teacher at Hannah Caldwell, has been awarded a grant to purchase materials which will support her preschool students with extra support and guidance in mastering the early stage of selfregulating their strong emotions with materials for stimulating experiences to creatively explore and engage in tactile play.

Macro-grants of up to \$5,000 have been awarded to:

Lisa Krauze, media specialist at Kawameeh Middle School, and John Irwin, media specialist at Burnet Middle School, cooperated on a grant proposal for both schools which requested funds for materials that are print books and also contain an audio component which allows students to read along to help strengthen the reading skills and help students to learn to pronounce new words as they learn them. These books are especially geared towards students with special

needs and students who are learning the English Hannah Caldwell School and Battle Hill School, language. These books will enable students at all reading abilities and levels to select and read printed books on their own.

Jha'Lon Motley, Pre-K teacher at Hannah Caldwell, will receive materials that will enable the young students to explore science, technology, engineering, arts and math through play. These specially designed kits will be able to be used for years to come.

Alexia Moriello, Trisha Davis, Nicole Filippone, Ashley Maynard, teachers of selfcontained pre-K and self-contained autistic students at Hannah Caldwell School, will receive materials for a Sensory room, that students can use throughout the day to help with selfregulation in order to help them increase the ability to refocus and promote positive classroom behaviors.

Melissa Antolovich, library media specialist at

requested funds to add a graphic novel and manga book collection to the school libraries. These novels are an accessible way for all students, including those with disabilities, to spark a love for reading. Students will learn to interpret both text and images, a skill needed for students in our media rich age.

Mary Ellen Patricco, fourth grade teacher at Connecticut Farms School, will receive materials for a grant called "Building Math Success." Ms. Patricco believes that students need hands-on and engaging materials to learn math. The students will use "Math Stackers" and "Math Magnets" to help students learn the "why" behind math.





NEW JERSEY VETERANS NETWORK MEMORIAL DAY MESSAGE

Michael D. Boll, Director, NJVN

A few years ago, I was approached by a veteran who is a friend of mine who expressed how extremely depressed he was and that he wanted to take his own life. Initially, I was completely shocked because this guy seemed to be upbeat and happy all the time. Immediately, I asked him to come with me to a private office so we could talk about his awful situation. This was the first time in my life that I had a friend talk to me about suicide, and I knew I had to really do my best to help him get through this horrible ordeal. We spoke for a few hours and I listened closely to everything he said. I was able to convince him to immediately get some help and we went to the hospital. I stayed with him at the hospital and met with him when he was released. I did everything to show my friend that I had his back, and because of this he is alive today. This awful situation inspired me to do whatever I possibly can to help others in need, and shortly after the New Jersey Veteran's Network created our mobile outreach program.

In today's day and age, most of you have known a veteran or first responder who has taken their own life. We lose nearly 22 veterans and approximately 300 first responders every year to suicide. Even with all the awareness and new anti-suicide programs available, this number has not changed, and in some cases has increased.

The VA hospitals with PTSD and mental health programs are packed with patients and unfortunately, the numbers continue to increase. More of our first responders are also seeking help and are utilizing some of the state programs being offered. So many people want to help and put an end to this crisis, but sadly there isn't a foolproof program available that will stop this ever-growing crisis from destroying our uniformed heroes and their family's lives.

For the last two years, our team has been working tirelessly with other charities to come up with a better solution to help prevent this believe our Mobile Outreach Team is really making a difference and everyday it helps our uniformed heroes live a better way of life.

The first thing we learned as a team is that we must lose our ego and seek out other groups and organizations that are looking to save lives. Then we find the right volunteers who are committed and dedicated to being a men-tor to a person in crisis. Volunteers are ex- tremely valuable because they want to be there, and they usually care more than the people who get paid for their services.

To date, we have been able to change and save countless lives because of the in- credible commitment from the volunteers and other supporting groups. In the next few months we are excited to be launching the "Uniformed Heroes Project," which is a statewide peer support/mentorship program for veterans, first responders, and active duty military. This project is a collaboration between the NJ VFW, NJ American Legion, NJ FMBA, PFANJ,

community leaders gathered at St. Joseph Social Service Center in Elizabeth on April 5 to celebrate the start of construction on the agency's new facilities, which will make it possible for the organization to expand and improve services to residents in need in Elizabeth and to achieve its vision of dignity for all. St. Joseph's is one of the largest social service agencies in Elizabeth and Union County, providing residents with food, household items, prescription assistance, health screenings, mental health counseling, job training and case management.

There are four components to the new facilities plan. The first is to build a food pantry. This new building will give St. Joseph's a dedicated space, a larger space, and a more functional space to operate its food pantry. Perhaps most importantly, the new building will allow the organization to offer a better food pantry model - an individual choice food pantry. With this model, clients will come at an appointed time and will be able to choose their food. The second project is to construct a clothing and household goods distribution center. Clothing and home goods will be displayed in different sections much like one would find in a retail store. The third project is to renovate the former parish hall and church building on campus to expand and enhance the many support services offered by the agency. The fourth project is to reconfigure and repave the parking lot.

Bernadette Murphy, Executive Director, remarked that the overarching goal of the plan is to "serve our sisters and brothers in need with dignity." At the Groundbreaking Event, she introduced the agency's new logo and tagline, "Connecting Communities – Nourishing Each Other." To fulfill its mission, the agency relies

More than 100 supporters, partners and on 6,000 volunteers who come from schools, community groups, businesses, churches and other houses of worship in five counties in New Jersey. "In addition to serving the hungry, St. Joseph's is also a place that feeds the hunger to serve," stated Murphy. 


