

CAPSTONE SCIENCE PROJECT PRESENTATION

Berkeley Heights Public Schools

Students in the Accelerated Physical Science classes in grade 8 at Columbia Middle School recently participated in their first ever Capstone Science Project Presentation and Fair. Capstone is a year-long project that the Accelerated Physical Science classes at CMS does. Grade 8 science teachers Mr. Thomas Clayton and Ms. Connie Lee teach the classes. The project involves student groups devising an optimized solution to a problem where the solution either does not currently exist or which improves upon a current solution. Some examples of the

incredible work done by students include creating affordable environmentally-sustainable cosmetics, natural food dyes, and shoes with interchangeable heels.

Dennis Dagounis, Science Supervisor said, "This was a wonderful opportunity for our students to go through the design and engineering process. Students needed to identify a problem, do research and devise a solution. This is just another example of some of the exciting things taking place in the Berkeley Heights Science classes."



GLHS CODING CLUB EARNES TOP PRIZES

Berkeley Heights Public Schools

Competition students in the GLHS Programming Club (also known as the Coding Club) recently participated in the "American Computer Science League (ACSL)" Competition which ran from November 2022 through May 2023, and included some 500 teams across the United States, Canada, Europe, and Asia.

In the "Senior 3" Division, the GL team scored in the Top 25 of all schools (for the second year in a row!), edging out competition from schools in states across the US, Canada, China, Russia, UAE, Taiwan, among others.

In addition, two GLHS students - Daniel Long (senior) and Anthony Tan (junior) - competed in the ACSL Invitational Finals on May 27th. Out of over 580 students, our team scored in the top 200, with Daniel Long finishing tied for 45th, earning Bronze medal honors.

Justin Polce, GLHS Math teacher and Programming Club advisor said, "The Programming Club is in its fourth-year at GLHS. The general goal of the club is to learn coding (no experience necessary), talk about projects, find resources for skill building, and explore STEM applications. Some students share projects in which they are creating games (think Minecraft). Members of the club researched and found the ACSL competition and decided to participate in it. The ACSL goes from fall into spring and is

composed of four contests, each with multiple this year." choice questions and open-ended coding questions. The students completed each of the contests over the course of 8 months and then competed in a day-long final exam. I am proud of the team and all that they have accomplished

> According to the traditions of the Carmelite order, on July 16, 1251, the Blessed Virgin Mary appeared to St. Simon Stock, a Carmelite. During the vision, she revealed to him the Scapular of Our Lady of Mount Carmel, popularly known as the "Brown Scapular." A century and a quarter later, the Carmelite order began to celebrate on this date the Feast of Our Lady of Mount Carmel.

The feast celebrates the devotion that the Blessed Virgin Mary has to those who are devoted to her, and who signal that devotion by wearing the Brown Scapular. According to tradition, those who wear the scapular faithfully and remain devoted to the Blessed Virgin until death will be granted the grace of final perseverance and be delivered from Purgatory early.



Governor Livingston High School Junior Bessie Huggins is excited to mentor the next generation of young leaders for Central Presbyterian Church's youth led cooking camp this July. "I developed the camp as part of my Girl Scout Gold Award, and I'm so excited to see it continue!" Huggins and her freshman interns will continue to reach out to the local community and to our food pantries to provide hands-on instruction and experiences for kids using ingredients that are common food pantry staples.

After learning about food insecurity in the community, Bessie was surprised to hear that cooking skills are one of the major barriers for good nutrition. "I grew up cooking dinner every week, but I realize that not everyone's parents have the time and patience to do that!" Bessie reached out to our local food pantries to see what ingredients they commonly give out and used resources from the United States Department of Agriculture. She filled in with her own tips and experience that she picked up in cooking classes at school, and from cooking at home.

The camp, located at Central Presbyterian Church in Summit, NJ, focuses on teaching kitchen safety and kitchen basics, nutritious meals, healthy snacks, and tasty treats to kids from third grade through fifth grade.

IS IT REALLY POSSIBLE FOR A KID TO LEARN HOW TO RUN FAST
