SUMMER READING KICKS OFF WITH TOUCH-A-TRUCK

The Florham Park Public Library's annual summer reading challenge kicked off on June 20 with a Touch-a-Truck event highlighting the community's first responders and government services. The national theme for this year's summer reading initiative is "All Together Now." The event attracted nearly 400 people to the municipal pool lot, where members of the Police Department, Volunteer Fire Department, First Aid Squad, Water and Sewer Utility, and Department of Public Works were gathered with an array of impressive vehicles. Children and their caregivers were encouraged to play games, enjoy a sweet treat, learn all about Florham Park, and to sign up for the Library's summer reading program.

This year's kickoff generated a record 130 sign-ups for the reading program, which caters to infants and toddlers, children, teens, and adults. Participants in summer reading receive prizes just for logging days they read, and raffle tickets for a drawing at the end of the summer for a grand prize. In addition to the reading incentive program, the Library's Summer Reading includes a robust schedule of events for all ages during its 8 week duration. Highlights include a reptile show by Zootopia, an Edible Art workshop, Family Fort Night, and a Magic Show! Registration is required for most events. The Touch-A-Truck kickoff event isn't the only way that this year's Summer Reading program is promoting community awareness and togetherness. Throughout the summer, participants in this year's challenge are invited to complete a community scavenger hunt, where they collect stickers from locations around Florham Park for additional chances to win a grand prize at the end of the summer. Stops on the scavenger hunt include the Florham Park Gazebo Concert series, 4th of July Celebration, Borough Hall, Little Red Schoolhouse, and Spring Garden Lake. The Patriots' Path Council Chess Club held its First Annual Chess Tournament on Saturday, April 29. The Florham Park Library being centrally located and the Akhoury Room being ideal for the tournament the Council decided to hold the tournament in a location within a half hour drive of most of the troop members.

Dave Setzer, longtime Florham Park resident, involved with Scouts for many years, and a strong supporter of chess, commented that "The BSA tournament was a terrific success. As always, Tom Andrea is a master chess tournament director. It was 4+ hours of chess and fun for all, including the parents."

There were 20 players from various NJ towns and troops who competed.

Scout Josh McDonald, of Raritan Valley, Troop 90, earned the 1st place trophy as he won all 5 of his matches. Nicholas DiCrescenzo of Fishawack, Troop 25, and Paul Mild – Watchung Mountain, Troop 73, each won 4 matches and took the 2nd and 3rd place trophies.

Each player had 20 minutes on their clocks, provided by the Council for the match. Matches

started at 11:30 a.m. and scouts played up to 5 matches each in this non-rated chess tournament.

Chess has been growing and has become the 7th most popular merit badge that isn't required to earn Eagle Scout. There are a total of 135 Merit Badges. The game (many would say "sport") helps develop concentration and patience and teaches strategy, tactics, and sportsmanship that can transfer to many other things in life. A bonus is that it activates both sides of the brain, and can increase a person's intelligence coefficient. And simply, it's an opportunity to socialize and to have fun.

The Patriots' Path Council Chess Club has monthly online tournaments using the Chesskid.com website. Members are provided with a basic logon to the site. The Chess Club also holds occasional in-person meetings.



OPERA AT FLORHAM 2023 INTERNATIONAL VOCAL COMPETITION

Opera at Florham is excited to announce the winners of the 33rd Annual International Vocal Competition. On Sunday, May 21, ten finalists demonstrated exceptional talent in the operatic art form before a live audience in Morristown, New Jersey. Each contestant sang an aria accompanied on piano by Opera at Florham's Artistic Director, Mary Pinto. Soprano Amanda Batista placed first for which she was awarded \$5,000.

From 175 singers age 21 to 35 who applied for the competition, 75 were selected to audition May 17-19 in New York City. Vocalists were judged by adjudicators renowned in the opera world: Barbara Ann Testa, Cynthia Munzer, Ken Benzon, James Thurmond Smithgall, and Tyson Deaton.

A total of \$13,500 in prizes was awarded with every finalist receiving an award.



THOUSANDS UNITE IN SUPPORT OF ORGAN AND TISSUE DONATIONS

NJ Sharing Network

On Sunday, June 11, thousands of people came out in support of organ and tissue donation during NJ Sharing Network's 5K Celebration of Life. The event, presented by RWJBarnabas Health, brought together transplant recipients, donor families, living donors, hospital partners, and dedicated volunteers to help raise awareness about the power of organ and tissue donation and transplantation.




