ALEXANDER CHATTERJEE RECEIVES JR LEAGUE AWARD

The Junior League of Summit (JLS) gave out more than \$37,000 in grants, scholarships and awards at its Annual Dinner held on June 19, 2023, at the Madison Hotel Conservatory.

Grants were awarded to St. Andrew's Haven, Bridges, GRACE, Summit Speech School, Chatham Community Food Distribution, Overlook Foundation Healthstart, Imagine and Summit First Aid Squad. The JLS Community Grants Program focused on projects which meet the emerging needs of our communities arising from the COVID-19 pandemic. The program enables the JLS to support other nonprofit organizations creating change in the Summit area.

The Jean Hudson Gano Award was given to Aidan Barth and Abigail Franco of New Providence. The duo co-founded and managed the LINC Resource Pantry which provides food and household items to families in need. This award was established and named in honor of Jean after her early passing in May 1997. Jean's impact on the community was far-reaching and long-lasting - the award is given annually in her memory.

The Shirley Wight Keeney Scholarships were granted to

Madison Ryder and Eli Markowitz of Summit and Alexander Chatterjee of Chatham. Each student demonstrated academic excellence and has shown significant volunteer work that aligns with the JLS mission. Shirley was a beloved member and Past President of the JLS.

The Amanda Parrish Block Grant winner was the Summit Warm Hearts (SWH) program of the Summit Interfaith Council. SWH provided shelter and meals for individuals with nowhere else to turn during the winter months. Each year, the JLS awards this grant based on needs that arise in the community surrounding food insecurity and essential demands. The grant was established in 2017 in honor of JLS member Amanda Parrish Block, founder of Giving and Receiving Assistance for our Community's Essentials (GRACE).

The Junior League of Summit, Inc. is an organization of women whose mission is to advance women's leadership for meaningful community impact through volunteer actions, collaboration and training.

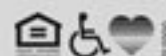

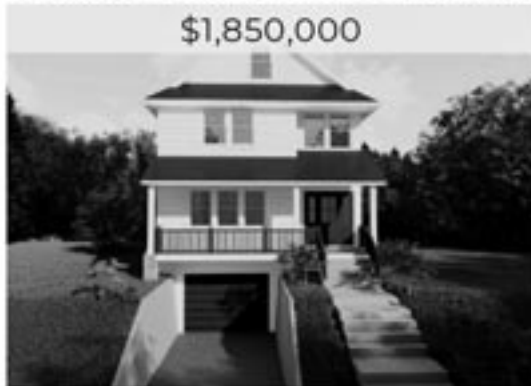

IMAGINE GRIEF SUPPORT FOR CHILDREN AND YOUNG ADULTS

Volunteers recently completed three full days of training in order to join Imagine’s amazing team of volunteer facilitators. During their training, space was provided where they could share their stories of loss with one another and give and receive support as Imagine staff modeled the skills utilized in Imagine’s peer support groups. Imagine practices Alan Wolfelt’s Companioning Model which encourages us to walk beside someone on their grief journey, so they feel felt and know that their story matters. Those who participated in this training can utilize the same skills and tools modeled by Imagine staff as they create safe spaces for Imagine participants in our peer support groups.

Imagine is a 501c3 nonprofit that offers free year-round grief support groups for children ages 3-18 and young adults 19-30 who are coping with

a loss due to death. Concurrently, support groups are available for the parents and guardians of the children in the groups and offered in English and Spanish. Groups are also available for parents who have lost a child aged 30 or younger.

"TAG-IT AND LEAVE-IT" INSPECTION PROGRAM

MCMUA/Chatham Borough

The most common and problematic unacceptable materials (contaminants) found mixed with acceptable recyclables include, plastic bags, plastic film/plastic packaging, foam (Styrofoam), hangers (plastic, metal, wood), food waste, wood scraps, and plastic bottles/containers coded #3, #4, #6 & #7 (only plastic bottles/containers coded #1, #2 & #5 are acceptable).

For curbside collection, recyclables must be loose in a reusable container with handles (lids are strongly recommended to reduce moisture and to prevent litter)

Recyclables must be empty, clean and dry (no food residue)

The MCMUA's updated guidelines for the proper preparation of recyclables exclude shredded paper, pizza boxes, aerosol or pressurized cans, and paint cans. The plastics acceptability guidelines limit plastic recycling

collection to only bottles/containers coded #1, #2 & #5.

Due to strict requirements for collecting only acceptable materials in the recycling stream, the MCMUA will leave those recycling set-outs with unacceptable items in the recycling containers at the curb. After, contaminated recyclables are left at the curb, residents will have to CORRECT the issues and wait until the next scheduled collection day to put their now acceptable recyclables out for curbside collection.

The main goal is to make your bottles, cans, paper and cardboard into other products that can be used over and over again. Contaminated loads are rejected at the materials recycling facility and cannot be separated into the individual materials that make up the recycling stream. Cleaner loads result in less cost while rejected loads, due to contamination, result in a greater cost for all involved.

IAN REARDON AWARDED CHRISTINE K. GROBERT CES SCHOLARSHIP

Chatham Emergency Squad

Ian Reardon received the 2023 Christine K. Grobert Chatham Emergency Squad (CES) Scholarship, granted since 2014 to a graduating Chatham High School student who has been committed to volunteerism and/or has displayed an interest in the field of medicine or science.

Ian, also an Eagle Scout, is going to attend the Nursing and Healthcare Management program at the University of Pennsylvania this fall. "The goal of the NHCM program is to get a Bachelors of Science in Nursing (BSN) from the School of Nursing and a Bachelors of Science in Economics (BSE) with a concentration in Healthcare Management from the Wharton School in five years," he said.

During this summer, Ian plans to become a certified EMT. "I hope to stay involved with CES for as long as I can. At UPENN, I will be involved with the Medical Emergency Response Team (MERT). This is a club that provides EMS services to the college campus and gives EMS medical training to students."

Ian learned about the cadet program from a fellow boy scout, Brad Rindos, who encouraged him to apply to the program. At that time Ian was interested in the field of marine mammal veterinary, and found emergency medical experience fitting this field. He had also witnessed many emergency medical events and wanted to be the person who could help. "From the moment I first started on the Thursday night crew, I felt welcomed. Everyone was very supportive and pushed me to learn as much as I could. The crew was a very big help when I went through the EMT course at Union County College. I have learned so much from being around my crew and on calls," he said. CES Captain and Deputy Cadet Manager, Nicole DiMaggio, said: "Ian is a perfect example of the quality of student that makes our cadet program shine. He is smart, inquisitive, mature and both learns from and teaches his fellow EMTs. We are so proud of him and all our cadets."

The scholarship applications were judged by an 8-member team who did not know the identity of the applicants as they were assigned a number. Each applicant was scored based on their volunteerism, their essay, and the financial impact to the applicant. In his essay, Ian wrote about how the cadet program and being a part of CES has changed his life and inspired him to pursue a career in medicine. During the nine years of the CES scholarships, cadets have won it six times while three previous winners were not affiliated with the CES cadet program, CES President Evan Skinner explained.

The CES Scholarship program was spearheaded by long-time CES volunteer and former president Christine K. Grobert who was amazed by Chatham's cadet volunteers. "Right from the beginning of the cadet program, our young adult volunteers have displayed an impressive level of dedication, compassion, and maturity for their patients and their roles as EMTs. The Board of Trustees wanted to be able to acknowledge and highlight the spirit of our cadet volunteers and similar teens in the

community who are donating their time to improve the lives of others. This scholarship focuses on service, which is the backbone of the Emergency Squad," Grobert said.

VANDALS CAUGHT IN THE ACT.

The “Pool House Gang” were caught red handed vandalizing a building at Boy Scout Camp Wheeler, in Byram Township, NJ. They are seen here in a “line up” against the wall.

They claim that they were doing repairs and renovations to an old decrepit building at the Boy Scout Camp. But they were seen removing valuable lumber, sinks, toilets, shower heads, and construction materials from the building.

Just kidding. This is a group of dedicated volunteers, including many retired professionals, who volunteer every week all year round at the Boy Scout camps for Patriot’s Path Council in northern New Jersey. These guys pictured have come up every Wednesday and Thursday for several months to renovate the Pool House and other buildings. This group includes retired engineers, an electrician, computer experts, small business owners, and corporate executives.

The Pool House building was built in 1971. The roof was still good, but the wooden walls were completely rotted, and the roof was sagging perilously. They needed to prop up the roof and replace the boards one by one. Eventually the building will have two

bathrooms, two common showers and 8 individual changing rooms on each of two sides. There is a full sized swimming pool behind the building, so all of the chlorination, pumping mechanisms and electrical service are also located inside the building.

The “Flintlocks BSA, Inc.” a 501c3 corporation, is a group of retired scouters who volunteer at the camps every week, all year round, to help the council. They do most of the repairs and maintenance for the three Council camps, but also build new structures, such as cabins, waterfront structures, picnic tables and tent platforms. In 2018 they secured funding and built the STEM Lab at Allamuchy. Second, they make the craft kits for birdhouses, bird feeders, stools, handy boxes, racing sailboats, etc., which are sold through the Scout Shops. Third, Flintlocks volunteer to help run the many Council programs. Three quarters of the Flintlocks have received the Silver Beaver Award, the highest National award a volunteer may receive. GETTYSBURG: 160TH ANNIVERSARY TRIBUTE

Morris County

To commemorate the 160th anniversary of the Battle of Gettysburg, Morris County has released an online collection of data and photographs memorializing local soldiers known to have participated in the three days of fury from July 1-July 3, 1863.

The project is a collection of names, service narratives, historical information and photographs compiled by the county Office of Planning and Preservation, and it remains a work-in-progress. This list is the latest chapter in the series of online projects known as the Morris County Veterans Compendium being led by the Office of Planning and Preservation that documents the military service of Morris County residents throughout history.

The Battle of Gettysburg is considered the turning point of the Civil War, forever ending Confederate General Robert E. Lee's plans to invade the north. Victory; however, it came at a high cost: More men were lost at Gettysburg than in any other Civil War battle. As many as 23,000 "Yankees" and 28,000 "Rebels" were killed, wounded, or captured over the course of just three days.

The fiercest combat occurred on July 2, earning the day's nickname: "The Bloody 2nd." Some of the casualties died by drowning as a summer storm caused wounded men laying by the Plum Run Creek to drown as the creek overflowed on July 3.

"Battlefields often sound the siren call to veterans to go back and re-visit the places where life and death met in close contact. Morris County veterans have revisited Normandy, Korea and Vietnam, and they have revisited Gettysburg," stated Jan Williams, Cultural and Historic Resources Specialist for the planning and preservation office.

Heyward Glover "H. G." Emmell, a stretcher bearer with the 7th NJ, returned to Gettysburg in 1881. Enlisted at age 19, H. G. served as a private in the infantry division before transferring to an ambulance corps for fourteen months. Private Emmell died on May 21, 1917, and is buried in the First Presbyterian Cemetery in Morristown.

Morris County men are also known to have attended "The Great Jubilee" in 1913, the 50th anniversary of the Battle of Gettysburg. All honorably discharged soldiers from both the North and South were invited, and an estimated 83,000 old soldiers descended on Gettysburg.

The history shared today of Morris County soldiers known to have participated in the Battle of Gettysburg reflect the fates of many of them: they were killed outright, presumed dead, captured or wounded, or were never seen again and left eternally missing in action. Those who returned home started businesses and families, endeavoring to rebuild a nation.

Some of these local American heroes include:
JACOB S. HOPING OF CHATHAM TOWNSHIP

The son of Henry and Margaret was born c. 1842. In both the 1850 and 1860 census, Jacob resides in Chatham Township.

Private Jacob Hopping was attached to Co. K, 7th NJ Inf.

At Gettysburg, he was wounded in a leg on July 2. Private Hopping succumbed to his wounds on July 16, 1863, and is buried in the Evergreen Cemetery, Adams County, Pennsylvania.

WILLIAM HENRY MILLER OF CHATHAM TOWNSHIP

Born in March 1840, Mr. Miller was raised in Chatham Township. His childhood home remains standing at 184 Southern Boulevard.

Enlisting in the 83rd NY Infantry, Co. C in Brooklyn, the regiment left for Washington, D.C.

on May 27, 1861.

On July 1, 1863, Private Miller is at Gettysburg and participates in the capture of Iverson's Brigade of North Carolina.

Wounded in battle, he loses an arm and is discharged with a disability as a Corporal in October 1863.

In civilian life, Mr. Miller marries Susann Wetton in 1870 and they set up housekeeping in Elizabeth, N.J.

In the 1880 Census his occupation is Custom House Clerk and in the 1900 Census as Examiner Customs House.

William Henry Miller died in March of 1912, aged 72.

GEORGE S. BEAVERS OF MENDHAM

Private Beavers survived the battles of Spotsylvania, Cold Harbor and Gettysburg, where he was wounded in the foot. Returning to Mendham, Mr. Beavers was the guest speaker Mendham's Decoration Day (Memorial Day) events for many years. Mr. Beavers also owned and operated The Black Horse Inn for 37 years. The business still exists, now operating as The Black Horse Tavern.

IRA "IDE" CORY OF MORRISTOWN

Captain Cory participated in and survived many battles during the war, including Gettysburg. After military service, "Ide" turned his attention to public service and was elected sheriff of Morristown in 1887. He died on March 2, 1904 and is buried in Evergreen Cemetery.

The Office of Planning and Preservation has reached out to the public in the past to build webpages memorializing Morris County residents who served in the nation's armed forces at other times. An accounting of Civil War Men Of Color who were affiliated with Morris County was initially launched in 2018, as well as an accounting of the more than 3,000 residents who were part of The Greatest Generation – Morris County in WWII.

Morris County also has dedicated pages to veterans of the Spanish-American War and Philippine War, the Korean War and the Vietnam War.

In July 2023, another Veterans Compendium project called "Morris County in the American Revolution," was launched to honor the local patriots whose sacrifices gave us Independence Day.
