JUNIOR LEAGUE ANNOUNCES 2023 AWARD RECIPIENTS

The Junior League of Summit (JLS) gave out more than \$37,000 in grants, scholarships and awards at its Annual Dinner on June 19, 2023, at the Madison Hotel Conservatory. Grants were awarded to St. Andrew's Haven, Bridges,

GRACE, Summit Speech School, Chatham Community Food Distribution, Overlook Foundation Healthstart, Imagine and Summit First Aid Squad. The JLS Community Grants Program focused on projects which meet the emerging needs of our communities arising from the COVID-19 pandemic. The program enables the JLS to support other nonprofit organizations creating change in the Summit area.

The Jean Hudson Gano Award was given to Aidan Barth and Abigail Franco of New Providence. The duo co-founded and managed the LINC Resource Pantry which provides food and household items to families in need. This award was established and named in honor of Jean after her early passing in May 1997. Jean's impact on the community was farreaching and long-lasting - the award is given annually in her memory.

The Shirley Wight Keeney Scholarships were granted to

Madison Ryder and Eli Markowitz of Summit and Alexander Chatterjee of Chatham. Each student demonstrated academic excellence and has shown significant volunteer work that aligns with the JLS mission. Shirley was a beloved member and Past President of the JLS.

The Amanda Parrish Block Grant winner was the Summit Warm Hearts (SWH) program of the Summit Interfaith Council. SWH provided shelter and meals for individuals with nowhere else to turn during the winter months. Each year, the JLS awards this grant based on needs that arise in the community surrounding food insecurity and essential demands. The grant was established in 2017 in honor of JLS member Amanda Parrish Block, founder of Giving and Receiving Assistance for our Community's Essentials (GRACE).

The Large Animal Veterinary Medicine program brings students to Belize for two weeks to volunteer alongside Belizean veterinarians and learn from them and from Belizean animal experts. Clara and her team took a course in the husbandry and health issues confronting farm animals in Belize so that they could be better

equipped to study and help support animals in the opportunities. tropics as well at the farms where they spent their time.

Belize is only a two-hour flight from Miami, but it faces different farming and environmental challenges than the US. The nation is over fifty percent rainforest, which provides unique conservation opportunities and a chance for students to learn from the hard-working local veterinarians who help to sustain the agriculture industry in Belize.

Clara and her team provided care for the animals at working ranches and farms, including horses, sheep, cattle, and pigs. In addition, they helped to host a free small pet clinic for animals owned by locals in the area. Clara and her team were also able to explore San Ignacio, a town in the Cayo District of western Belize.

CELA Belize has animal science and veterinary programs for undergraduate and veterinary students, as well as internship programs throughout Belize.

Programs are offered in summer and winter and are two weeks long, and college credit through Iowa Wesleyan is available. Interested participants can inquire or apply at celabelize.com. Professors and teachers who want to travel with a group of students to Belize can work with CELA to connect their students with local conservation projects, schools, development projects, and service learning Brunswick, majoring in Animal Science.

By following a study abroad model instead of a voluntourism model, CELA Belize focuses on educating its students so that they can contribute and serve in meaningful ways. Students learn from the expertise of local Belizean staff. It also works with locally run animal welfare organizations so that students contribute to longterm improvement on the ground in the countries they visit. CELA has been based in Belize for over a decade, and with the help of students like Clara, continues to help support important sustainability and development projects in Belize.

The program's Managing Director Jane Stine says, "Our students come to Belize because they want to experience another culture in a way that supports and learns from the local expertise. On this program, they have the chance to see Belize from a Belizean point of view and learn from our amazing veterinary team, and we love seeing them bring that knowledge and experience home to move even further in their veterinary and conservation careers."

Of her trip, Clara says, "I have spent a month in Belize learning and working in wildlife conservation and large animal medicine. My experience has further secured my passion to become a veterinarian and helping the animals we all know and love ... "

OBITUARY DR. MICHAEL GEORGE KNOWLTON

Former Summit Superintendent Michael George Knowlton was diagnosed with pancreatic cancer in February, 2023. He succumbed to the disease on June 7.

Michael was born on September 1, 1946, in Binghamton, New York. He was predeceased by his parents, Richardson Drake Knowlton and Virginia Seeber Knowlton. He has one brother, Richardson Drake Knowlton, II of Guyton, Georgia.

Michael received his Bachelor of Arts degree in Economics and Government from Oberlin College, Oberlin, Ohio in 1968, his Master of Science Degree in Education from State University of New York, Cortland in 1975, and his Doctor of Education from Syracuse University in 1985. He held Assistant Superintendent positions in Windsor, NY, Hilton, NY, and White Plains, NY. His career led him to become a Superintendent of Schools in Valhalla, NY and Summit, NJ where he retired in 2004.

He met his wife, Lunetta Jane Bennett while attending Oberlin College. They were married December 28, 1968 in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. They had two children, Michael Bennett Knowlton born in 1970 currently residing in Englewood, FL and Amy Jane Knowlton Lamb born in 1972 currently residing in St. Louis, Mo. Michael is married to Kelly Grimm Knowlton and they have one child, Windley Virginia Knowlton. Amy is married to Keith Richard Lamb and they have two children, Breuer Jane Lamb and Bodhi Knowlton Lamb. During his last months he received a great deal of pleasure from his two Havanese puppies, Isa and Henry.

After retirement from the Summit, New Jersey School District Michael and Lunetta lived in Clayton, Oklahoma for several years while building a home in Venice, Florida where they resided for over 15 years before moving to Englewood. During his retirement, he became an avid Bonsai collector and expert in the art form. His collection included as many as 125 Bonsai Trees at the peak of his involvement with the art form. He was elected President of Sho Fu Bonsai Society of Sarasota and Bonsai Societies of Florida. He also was an active member of St. Mark's Episcopal Church, Venice, Florida. He served as Senior Warden under 2 Rectors and was Treasurer of the Church for many years.

Michael was not only loved by his family, but by so many, whose lives he touched through his 76 years. These seniors have mild to moderate age-related cognitive disorders, and during 48 weekly sessions, a VACNJ-trained art educator engages approximately SAGE clients in handson art-making projects. This sequential program is specifically designed to improve cognitive functions, enhance memory, and improve an overall sense of well-being.

LANGUAGE AND LITERACY THROUGH ART

Language and Literacy Through Art is a partnership between VACNJ and Empowering Kids Organization (EKO) in Summit. EKO creates strategies and programs to empower under resourced, English-language learners to thrive throughout their educational journey by connecting them and their families with opportunities and resources. The program expands students' knowledge and understanding of contemporary art by utilizing art viewing and art making to engage and empower Englishlanguage learners to build skills in reading, writing, and speaking.

SUMMIT PEP AT VACNJ

Providing Educational Possibilities (PEP) is a college access program that offers academic, social-emotional, and financial support to select, motivated Summit public school students. PEP students visit VACNJ to experience the museum, view current exhibitions, and create their own work based on the contemporary art on display. **ART THERAPY FOR TEENS**

Art Therapy for Teens is an after-school enrichment program led by VACNJ art therapist Megan Tuttle with the goal of promoting mental health by providing teens with a way to manage stress and anxiety through art. This powerful program was created in response to a call from parents, teens, and teachers to help today's teenagers manage the pressures of not only being a young adult but navigating the world after the isolation of the pandemic.

VOLUNTEER CLASS 102 IS READY TO LISTEN

Caring Contact Crisis Line

Residents from Summit, Florham Park, Westfield, Linden, Clark, and North Plainfield completed training in June to become volunteers on the Caring Contact crisis hotline. During the 52-hours of training the graduates developed the ability to listen actively, assess the needs of someone in crisis and provide empathy and support. The training included dynamic and interactive presentations by guest experts in active listening, grief recovery, mental health issues and suicide intervention. Volunteer Listener Training was taught by trainers who are long-time listeners and nationally certified instructors in Applied Suicide Intervention Skills Training.

"This training and volunteer opportunity is ideal for people of varying backgrounds retirees, empty-nesters, stay-at-home parents, and full-time professionals" said Mary Claire Givelber, Caring Contact's executive director. "Many of our listeners are looking for something meaningful to do after they retire, or their children leave home. Full-time professionals also participate finding the flexible volunteer hours work well with their work obligations."

Following the training, new volunteer crisis counselors are supported by seasoned listeners

during 24 hours of internship before they take calls on their own. Even once a volunteer is a certified listener, Caring Contact provides a range of support and training opportunities to allow them to keep honing their skills.

The next volunteer crisis counselor training begins September 20th through December 13th. The training will run once a week on Wednesdays from 6:30 to 9:30 p.m. and will be a combination of in-person training and via Zoom.
