# **DIVINE NINE HELPS TO PRESERVE SHADY REST**

Submitted by Liz Nolley Tillman Through a coordinated effort driven by the National Pan-Hellenic Council of Central Jersey (NPHC of CJ), members of New Jersey's Divine Nine, joined forces to raise \$5,750 to support the Preserve Shady Rest Committee's efforts to preserve and restore the historic significance of the Shady Rest Golf and Country Club.

Located in Scotch Plains, New Jersey, Shady Rest Golf and Country Club opened in 1920 as

the first African American Golf and Country Club in the United States. The country club was home to John Matthew Shippen Jr., the first American Born African American Golf Professional and has hosted Jazz and Blues Legends like Ella Fitzgerald and Duke Ellington.

Through the NPHC of Central Jersey's Divine Nine for Shady Rest fundraiser, the nine historically Black fraternities and sororities comprising the NPHC, collectively known as the Divine Nine, formed teams to collect donations reflective of the founding years of each organization to support the preservation and restoration of the Shady Rest Clubhouse.

In one month, 179 Divine Nine members, chapters and supporters across NJ raised \$5,750 that was presented by NPHC of Central Jersey President Roger Wingate, member of the Mu Gamma Gamma Chapter of Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc. and Divine Nine for Shady Rest Initiative Chairman Liz Nolley Tillman, NPHC of CJ Parliamentarian and President of the Phi Eta Omega Chapter of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc. to Tom Donatelli, Chair of the Preserve Shady Rest Committee at the Scotch Plains Township and Social Justice Matters Juneteenth Celebration on June 17, 2023. The celebration and check presentation took place in front of the historic Shady Rest Golf Clubhouse in Scotch Plains, NJ.

### **ANNUAL 9-11** REMEMBRANCE

Scotch Plains residents are invited to attend the annual 9-11 remembrance, to be held Monday, September 11 at 6 p.m. at the Alan Augustine Village Green, 430 Park Ave.

The Township will remember three residents who died in the terror attacks: James Walsh, Mark David Rothenberg and Matthew Horning.

The Alan Augustine Village Green is home to a 9/11 Memorial. It includes steel from the World Trade Center and was funded through generous donations from residents and businesses throughout the town and was organized by a 9/11 Memorial Committee.

It is important to note the role that Scotch Plains' emergency responders played on that day. Township firefighters were assigned to Ladder 78, which was the closest firehouse to the Staten Island Ferry coming from Lower Manhattan. This made it the first stop for NYC firefighters returning from Ground Zero for temporary rest. That experience bonded SPFD with Ladder 78. In fact, following the annual Tunnel to Towers Run, township firefighters participating in the run return to Ladder 78 for a special reunion.

The Scotch Plains Rescue Squad also assisted on 9/11 by treating the injured and washing dust and debris from people who were at Ground Zero that fateful morning.

Scotch Plains police officers responded, as well. Police Chief Jeff Briel, along with officers Officer Cheney, Sgt. Donnelly, Sgt. Cassidy and Sgt. Hayeck., assisted in the running of a PBA command post providing support to rescue personnel and the delivery of supplies to Ground Zero. Sgt. Brian Hayeck drove family members to and from Ground Zero and Pier 94 searching for survivors. Sgt. Hayeck provided this service for countless families for almost four weeks.

Mayor Josh Losardo said. "For those of us who lived through 9/11, the pain and confusion, the sorrow and heartache, these feelings come back to us when we think of where we were when we learned the horrific news that a plane had crashed into the World Trade Center. The pain was raw then. And is raw and hurts today still."
