

4TH ANNUAL MARCH TO YORKTOWN DAY

On Sunday, Aug. 27th the Washington-Rochambeau Revolutionary Route Association New Jersey, W3R-NJ held the 4th Annual March to Yorktown Day in Westfield, NJ to commemorate an event that occurred 242 years ago during the Revolutionary War.

This year's event kicked off with an opening ceremony at Mindowaskin Park on Mountain Ave. There, W3R-NJ Chair, Julie Diddell told of how the their French and Continental troops marched from Newport, Rhode Island to Yorktown, VA (an almost 700-mile, nine state, land and water journey) in the summer of 1781 taking them through Westfield on August 29, 1781 along a route that is has been designated as the Washington-Rochambeau Revolutionary Route National Historic Trail, a unit of the National Park Service. Remarks by Westfield Mayor Shelley Brindle, State Senator Jon Bramnick, West Fields Chapter Sons of the American Revolution President, Jay Hershey and New Jersey Daughters of the American Revolution State Historian, Pat Saftner.

The community joined in a symbolic march re-enactment into an Mindowaskin Park accompanied by the Generals Rochambeau, Washington and Major General Chastellux and





General Lafayette. the New Jersey Sons of the American Revolution Color Guard, the Daughters of the American Revolution, Washington's Fifes and Drums, the Miller-Cory Museum colonial living history group and Heard's Militia.

A festival followed with children's' games provided by Liberty Hall, and local history organizations such as the Forgotten Victory Trail Association, Miller-Cory House Museum, Princeton Battlefield Society, Union Township Historical Society, Chatham Historical Society, Westfield Chapter Daughters of the American Revolution and the Washington Association of New Jersey had informational tables set up and interacted with the public to share information, sell history books and engage new members. An encampment with tents, cooking demonstrations, fife and drum music, musket firing and marching drills will occur during the festival.

HANDS-ON, PROBLEM-BASED LEARNING AT STEM CAMP

Westfield Public Schools


For nearly a decade, the popular Westfield STEM Camp has welcomed students in grades 3-8, offering hands-on, problem-based learning in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics.

This summer's STEM Camp offered oneweek, half-day sessions from July 10 through July 28, with courses that included CSI Forensics, Stop Motion Animation, Engineering Design Challenges, Robotics Exploration, Surviving a Disaster, Mind-Blowing Science Experiments, Mission Impossible, and DNA: Cracking the Code of Life. New this summer was Flight Engineering, with campers creating and testing their own aircraft while learning the basic math and physics (forces and motion) that govern the design of airplanes, helicopters, and rockets.

"STEM activities promote a child's natural curiosity by providing them with the opportunity to ask questions and develop solutions to a specific problem," say camp co-directors Laura Paiva and Sean Bonasera. "The goal is that campers will develop a can-do attitude and an interest in a STEM activity that encourages them to dive deeper into new STEM skills and concepts that will help them in school and later in life."

The courses are taught by Westfield Public School teachers with a passion for STEM education. Co-directors Bonasera and Paiva teach industrial arts and computer literacy, respectively, at Edison Intermediate School.

"We want all campers to have a fun, but meaningful, hands-on experience," say Bonasera and Paiva, as they consider the STEM Camp curriculum for each summer.







In fact, U.S. News and World Report ranked Kean 46th out of 439 in Top Performers for Social Mobility among national universities. That means we help those who come from disadvantaged backgrounds succeed and graduate. Our students find success regardless of their backgrounds. Each one of them deserves the opportunity Kean offers to improve their own lives and the lives of their families.

The path to higher education should be free from obstacles and wide enough for all who wish to travel it. Without solving the problems of cost and access, it's possible we could live in a country without a robust and diverse higher education sector. Can we really envision the prospect of an America without teaching, research, inventiveness, and social mobility for which American higher education is synonymous?

At the same time, institutions of higher education need to have multiple paths to fund the cost of educating future generations. Education costs money, and we need a full and diverse set of funding resources. Government, private sector support, and individual philanthropic giving are all part of the solution to the challenges students and families face around access and cost of securing a college degree.

DAUGHTER'S KIDNEY DONATION SAVED HER MOM'S LIFE

NJ Sharing Network

Twenty years ago, Rosemarie Hampp, 58, made the loving decision to donate one of her kidneys to save her mother's life. Today, Rosemarie is forever thankful for that decision, and she is now on a personal mission to support NJ Sharing Network, the nonprofit organization responsible for the recovery and placement of donated organs and tissue in the Garden State.

"My goal is to save and enhance more lives because there are nearly 4,000 people in New Jersey waiting for a life-saving transplant," said Rosemarie. "I believe that everyone should consider being a living organ donor or simply register as an organ and tissue donor to make a positive difference in the lives of others after your time on Earth is done."

Rosemarie's fundraising efforts to support the Sharing Network Foundation have been powered by many of her family members and friends who are participating in the 5K Celebration of Life on May 20 in Ocean Grove. "Team Rosie," named in honor of Rosemarie's mother (Rose Marie Hampp), was established earlier this year to celebrate the 20th anniversary of Rosemarie's life-saving gift.

"My mom lived a healthy and happy life until she was diagnosed with primary amyloidosis," said Rosemarie. "Her health issues grew progressively worse and dialysis treatments were never easy."

Once Rosemarie learned about the possibility

of being a living kidney donor for her mother, she was eager to move forward with hopes of giving her mother the gift of life. However, her parents did not want her to donate her kidney.

"Even though I knew they were against it, I secretly got tested for transplant compatibility," said Rosemarie. "When the results showed that I was a great match, I was a nervous wreck because I was not sure how I was going to tell them about it."

Although Rosemarie's mother was hesitant at first, she finally agreed. The successful kidney transplant was completed by the medical team at Cooperman Barnabas Medical Center on December 17, 2003. Rosemarie's gift gave her mother several additional years to enjoy life's precious moments.

"We named my donated kidney 'Fred,' and we called my remaining kidney 'Ginger' because they worked well together and individually," said Rosemarie. "My mom ultimately passed away in 2006 due to pancreatitis. It was unrelated to her transplant, and her kidney always worked perfectly."

Rosemarie has also used her professional art skills to create colorful Donate Life stickers to raise additional funds and awareness. To support Rosemarie's efforts, visit events.njsharingnetwork.org/go/TeamRosie23.
