KATE KLIM, GOLDEN DIMES IN CONCERT OCT. 14

The Fanwood Performance Series presents singer-songwriter-pianist Kate Klim and alternative-rock band Golden Dimes on Saturday evening, October 14th, in the community building at Fanwood's Forest Road Park.

With roots in Pennsylvania and Illinois, Kate Klim is now based in Nashville. After a hiatus of several years around the births of her two sons, she began recording her fourth album, "Something Green," in 2020 – and finished it from home during the pandemic. "It's an album about hope, love, change, and new growth," says Klim. A review of the 2022 release in Americana Highways praised the "wonderfully composed" songs and "brilliantly upbeat light vocal approach."

Fanwood-based Golden Dimes is the collaboration of a group of suburban dads, all lifetime musicians brought together by fate and a mutual love of great food and drink, positive vibes and making music. The band's songs carry messages of unity, self-awareness, and responsibility, thoughtfully viewed through the lens of generation Xers wishing to do good in the world. The music is contemporary with classic sensibilities, blending keys, guitars and organic drum sounds with vocal harmony.

PRESENTATION BY JACK THE RIPPER **RESEARCHER - OCT. 16TH**



36 years of experience, including working in the New Jersey prison system will present his program, "Jack the Ripper: A Mystery of Mysteries" on October 16th at Fanwood Presbyterian Church, 74 Martine Avenue (McDermott Street entrance) at 7:30 p.m. The program is being hosted by the College Club of Fanwood-Scotch Plains; it is free and the public is invited to attend. Please note that this program is not intended for children.

Jack the Ripper is one of the most infamous serial murder cases in the world. Set in the slums of eastern London in 1888, five women, possibly more, all impoverished prostitutes, were viciously slayed. The heinous crimes rocked London to its core. The unknown assailant, like a phantom in the night, committed the grisly tasks and vanished without ever being caught.

The identity of Jack the Ripper is by far the most beguiling aspect of the murders. But within this mystery are countless other mysteries. Was he a doctor? Why did he keep some of the victim's organs? Are the famous Ripper letters authentic or a hoax? How was he able to commit the murders without being caught? Did he have an accomplice? Why did he stop killing?

Dr. Mark R. Vogel, a clinical psychologist with PowerPoint presentation with then and now photos of the murder sites. Dr. Vogel is a Jack the Ripper researcher who has studied the case, reviewed the original police files and has visited the murder sites himself. He was a guest speaker at a Jack the Ripper conference in London in 2018. He promises a "riveting lecture".

HALLOWEEN PARADE AND COSTUME CONTEST – OCT. 31ST



GWACC ANNOUNCES RETIREMENT OF GENE JANNOTTI

The Greater Westfield Area Chamber of Commerce (GWACC) Board of Directors announced the retirement of Gene Jannotti, CEO of the Chamber, at the September 13, 2023, board meeting. Gene will leave office when the Board hires his replacement. The Board is expected to announce the new GWACC Chamber Executive Director in October as soon as the position is finalized.

Gene served in his position since 2014 and accomplished much during almost 10 years. Gene increased the Chamber membership from 260 members to currently over 400 members. He enlarged the Board to 20 members to be more representative of the businesses and professionals the Chamber represents and established standing committees with board members and volunteers to increase involvement and awareness of Chamber activities and events.

He expanded the size of the Chamber by incorporating Clark and the Irish Business Association into the GWACC Chamber and the communities it serves in Clark, Fanwood, Garwood, Mountainside, Scotch Plains and Westfield. He created special recognition awards for 5-year, 10-year, and older GWACC members. Additional community events were created in Clark, Fanwood and Garwood to engage with community residents and highlight local businesses. In the past five years, Gene received the Union County Boy Scouts Lifetime Achievement Award, the NJBIA ICON Award and the Inroads to Opportunities Champion of Change Award. He is a graduate of the US Chamber Institute of Nonprofit Organizational Management. Gene is a former member of the Trinitas Hospital Foundation Board, Past President of the Board of Trustees of the Union County Performing Arts Center, current Board member of Union College

Foundation and the Boys and Girls Club of Union County. Gene is a member of the Scotch Plans/Fanwood Rotary, the Westfield Optimist Club, and the Union County 200 Club. Gene is also on the Siena College Advisory Board.

"I have enjoyed my time at the Chamber helping businesses succeed and do well. But now it is time to bring in a new Executive Director to take the Chamber to the next level. I want to thank the GWACC Staff, Mary Cirillo who has been with me for the past nine years and Faith Delaney for the past 5 years for the job they have done for the Chamber. I am very happy that I leave the Chamber in better condition than when I started." Gene thanked all current and former Board members for the opportunity given to him to serve as the Chamber CEO and expressed his thanks to all of the GWACC members who make everything happen at the Chamber. Gene will take well deserved time away from employment to serve on various non-profit Boards, play golf and travel.
