# "MR. BOB THE GARDENER" HONORED

National Garden Clubs, Inc.

The members of National Garden Clubs, Inc. (NGC) recently honored Mr. Bob's Garden Foundation for YMCA Campers with their prestigious Award of Excellence, the highest award presented by NGC to a nonmember. The Award of Excellence honors an individual, organization, or institution that has made significant contributions toward the advancement of the goals and purposes of National Garden Clubs, Inc.

Master Gardener and Certified Square Foot Garden Instructor Bob Markey started Mr. Bob's Garden Foundation for YMCA Campers in 2008 when he launched his YMCA Square Foot Gardening Summer Camp initiative at the Gateway YMCA in Rahway, New Jersey. In 2019, the program was incorporated as a 501(c)(3) organization and registered as Mr. Bob's Garden Foundation for YMCA Campers.

Square Foot Gardening is simple, easy to learn for all ages, and does not require lots of space or heavy tools. It involves the assemblage of an above-ground 3'x 3' box, a special organic soil mix, and a grid of nine squares and it is ready to plant. It is possible to grow nine different crops in that small space. Sixteen radishes fit in a square, nine bush beans fit in a square but only one tomato plant. Ultimately, Markey became known to the campers as "Mr. Bob the Gardener".

The Square Foot Garden Summer Camp Program supports the YMCA's Core Values of Youth Development, Healthy Living, and Social Responsibility. Along with learning the basics of Square Foot Gardening, the campers develop a deeper relationship with nature, a greater appreciation for the food they grow, and an expanded sense of community. The program's mission connects kids with nature by empowering them to grow, harvest, taste, and market the organic fruits and vegetables of their

The Square Foot Garden concept originated in 1976, when civil engineer Mel Bartholomew set out to solve world hunger one square foot at a time. He called his revolutionary approach to growing plants of all kinds Square Foot Gardening. In 1981 his book, "Square Foot Gardening," became the largest selling gardening book of all time. That is when Markey, traveled to Eden, Utah, in 2008, to meet the author and where he became a Square Foot Gardening Instructor to teach the method to kids.

Since 2009, The Great Zucchini Race is the foundation's signature special event. The campers harvest zucchini squash, break into teams, and with bamboo skewers as axles they decorate their zucchini "race cars" with veggies. Add a 6-foot-tall wooden racetrack and it's "game on!" You can see the race on YouTube - search Great Zucchini Race!

Mel Bartholomew has said, "Mr. Bob's Square Foot Gardening for Kids has done an excellent job of bringing a summer program that will give a lifetime of memories for all of the children associated with the Y and all of their programs."

National Garden Clubs, Inc. currently has over 5,000 local clubs, with 145,000 members, and over 330 international affiliate clubs. The



## STUDENTS SHOW SIGNIFICANT GROWTH IN I-READY PROGRAM

#### Rahway Public Schools

Franklin Elementary School students have shown significant growth in their reading and math skills as a result of the i-Ready program, an online learning tool that helps teachers personalize instruction and track student progress. The i-Ready program is designed to help students identify their areas of strength and weakness, and then provide targeted instruction to help them improve. The program also tracks student progress over time, so teachers can see how each student is doing and make adjustments to their instruction as needed.

In the 2022-2023 school year, Franklin students completed a total of 59,862 i-Ready lessons over a span of 13,354 hours, averaging 99 lessons and over 22 hours per student. As a result of this hard work, Franklin students have shown significant growth in their reading and math skills. On average, students at Franklin School showed 124% of expected growth in their diagnostic scores, with some individual students hitting as high as over 300% annual growth. This growth was shown across the school and across data subsets as well. Every subgroup based on race or sex showed an average annual growth of over 100% as well. Economically disadvantaged

students were able to show an average of 110% annual growth.

In addition to the academic benefits, the i-Ready program has also helped to create a positive and fun learning environment for students. Mr. Greg Mariconda, the school's counselor, was able to obtain two successful Donors Choose grants to fund prizes and parties for students who completed i-Ready lessons. These incentives have helped to motivate students and keep them engaged in the program.

"The i-Ready program has been a great success at Franklin Elementary School," said Mr. Mariconda. "The prizes and parties have helped to create a positive and fun learning environment, and the data shows that students are making significant gains in their reading and math skills."

"We are very proud of the hard work and achievement of our students in the i-Ready

program," said acting Principal Dr. Kevin Robinson. "The program has helped our students make significant gains in their reading and math skills, and we are confident that these gains will continue in the years to come."

In addition to the individual prizes and parties, Franklin Elementary School also held a school-wide celebration to recognize the students who showed the most growth in the i-Ready program. Plory, the orange alien who appears in the i-Ready program, came to Franklin School and visited all the classrooms to recognize the i-Ready superstars.

The i-Ready program is just one example of the many ways that Franklin Elementary School is working to improve student achievement. The school is committed to providing a rigorous and challenging academic environment that prepares all students for success in college and beyond.







# **BULLIES TO BUDDIES WORKSHOP – OCT. 19**

On Thursday, October 19th from 6:30-8:00 p.m. Imagine, A Center for Coping with Loss will offer a Bullies to Buddies workshop at their Mountainside center at 244 Sheffield Street in Mountainside. Ther is no cost for this program. Children and youth, third grade and older are welcome to attend along with adults who wish to help the children in their lives gain skills for responding to bullying behavior. Young people attending will have an opportunity to role play techniques taught throughout the session.






# 1931 MURDER FILLED WITH BIZARRE TWISTS (Part One of Two Parts)

During the height of the Great Depression, Rahway and Union County officials were confronted with a murder case that would take their investigation from New York to North Carolina. In the end, they would discover that as the murderer was making his escape through six states, he had his victim's body in the back seat of his car. The events of this true story of the murder of Pheobe Stader by her illicit lover, William Frazer, began after midnight in the early hours of Wednesday, February 18, 1931.

Pheobe Stader was a 33-year-old married woman who had much on her mind and needed time to think about her future. She was not happy with her eight-year marriage to husband Phillip, and her two-year secret romance with 31-year-old William Frazer was becoming an item of city gossip. She decided it might be good to "get away" for a while so she left her Rahway home on Monday, the 16th of February to spend time with her sister who lived in the rural town of Walden, New York. A day later, William Frazer himself a married man and father of two daughters - followed Stader to Walden fearing she was trying to put an end to their relationship.

By Tuesday evening, he was able to persuade





Pheobe to leave with him, and late that night, the two stopped on a secluded hilltop a few miles from Walden. Sitting in Frazer's brown Buick sedan, the lovers contemplated their situation while sharing a bottle of applejack, a popular brandy of the day. When they had met in 1929, Frazer had just received an inheritance of \$25,000 after the death of his father. He spent it lavishly on Pheobe until it was completely used up, giving him suspicions that without money Pheobe would lose interest in him. As they talked and drank, Pheobe pledged her love to him, promised to get a divorce, and looked forward to starting a new life. Frazer, with the liquor slowly taking hold, had become morose and unconvinced, and in a teary-eyed outburst uttered, "Now that my inheritance is gone, you're through with me. You came up here just to get away from me."

Frazer's depression increased as he drank more, even as Pheobe promised to run off with him to Florida. Her words did nothing to ease his worst thoughts. Completely despondent in his drunken stupor, he said he needed air and opened his door, stepped out, and went to the back seat. Reaching behind the seat he pulled out a .22 caliber rifle. When he returned to the driver's door, Pheobe was leaning over looking down to fix her stocking. A loud blast shattered the stillness of the night.

Frazer froze as he saw Pheobe slump in her seat, her head resting against the side window. Blood from a wound in the back of her head was flowing down her neck and onto her clothes. Not fully understanding what had just happened, he gently shook the still body and said softly and haltingly, "I didn't mean to do it. I still love you." He touched her breast and felt the faint beat of her heart. She was still alive!

In a panic, Frazer started the Buick, sped down the country road to the main highway and headed for Rahway. He covered the 89 miles in a daze as he raced along the mostly deserted roadways. When he reached Elizabeth, he stopped and composed himself enough to again check Pheobe's pulse. This time there was nothing. She was dead.

The sun was just rising by the time Frazer Conclusion

reached his mother's East Cherry Street home. He entered the home quietly to avoid waking his mother and went to the second-floor bedroom where his 21-year-old cousin, Ira, was asleep. Frazer roused him roughly and said, "I'm in a terrible mess. Pheobe is out in the car. She's dead." The startled cousin replied, "Pheobe Stader dead! How did it happen?" Frazer cut him off. "Stop asking a lot of questions and get up and come outside with me." When they got to the car, he told Ira to get in the back. Ira asked, "Where are we going." Frazer's answer stunned him. "I'm going to tell my wife."

Everyone was still asleep when he entered his Jefferson Avenue home. He woke his wife, Hilda, and with little emotion told her what had happened. Hilda, being a stereotypically faithful wife of the time, realized her husband needed her more at this time than ever before. She believed he had weaknesses that led him to his troubles and implored him, "You've got to give yourself up."

"I can't do that. I just can't," he protested firmly. They argued for an hour as Hilda pleaded and begged, but Frazer refused to budge and with nothing more to say, he left. At the car, he lifted Pheobe's limp body, placed it in the back, and returned to Cherry Street with Ira sitting in Pheobe's blood covered front seat.

After arriving at the house, Ira was sent in to get a blanket to cover the body. Frazer then parked the car around the corner on Campbell Street, locked the doors, returned to his mother's house, and went to bed.

The next morning, Frazer gathered some belongings and packed his car. He then brought Pheobe's pocketbook into the house, removed her money, and set it ablaze in the basement furnace. Finally, he left a note for Ira directing him to meet him in Raleigh, North Carolina at the Sir Walter Hotel on Friday the 20th and to bring \$200.00 which he could get from his mother. He would be registered under the alias H. G. Devlin.

Frazer was off to Florida with Pheobe's cold corpse in the back seat, but now, not quite the way they had planned.

#### **PUMPKINS**

I had originally started to write about Bats in New Jersey this month, but there is so too much information about these incredible and misunderstood creatures to write about in just one article. Therefore, I have decided to wait until the winter months when I can focus two articles about NJ Bats in a row

This article about Pumpkins was originally written in 2017.

Pumpkins are native to North America where seeds have been found in Mexican graves and temples dating back five to seven thousand years ago. Up north, pumpkins were grown by Native Americas for hundreds of years before the first European settlers arrived here.

The America Indians created a farming technique called "The three sisters". Corn was grown in the same plot as beans and squash. The corn would grow tall, and the beans would use it as a trellis. The pumpkins and squash were planted at the base and would discourage raccoons and other critters from eating the corn and beans. The Natives later taught this practice to the Pilgrims. Without pumpkins it is doubtful any of the Pilgrims would have survived the first long winter.

In later years, the Pilgrims would carve out pumpkins, fill them with milk and bake them until they turned into a rich, flavorful custard. This tradition later became today's pumpkin pies. Sugar pumpkins are the smaller orange pumpkins used to make pumpkin pie.

Pumpkins and other winter squash are easy to grow if you give them their basic requirements, warm rich soil, heavy but even moisture, lots of sun and most importantly, plenty of space to spread out and grow. If they outgrow their space, you can turn the growing tips towards where you want them to grow. When harvesting leave at least one inch of stem attached and let your pumpkins sit in the sun for ten days to cure them before storing them.

Our modern Halloween tradition of carving out pumpkins began in ancient Ireland. The Celtic people believed the dead arose from their graves every year on October 31. To ward off evil, people carved faces into rutabaga or turnips, beets or potatoes and put them in windows and at their doors. Even the name Jack-O-Lantern is derived from Irish lore and folktales.

When our Irish immigrants arrived in America, they brought these traditions with them and quickly learned pumpkins are much easier to carve out.

Today pumpkins can be found in a variety of sizes, from the massive orange pumpkins to jack-be-little, which can fit in the palm of your hand. Color choices now start at white, then orange, and blended. There are even pumpkins with warts for folks looking for something different.

Selecting a pumpkin is often a family event with everyone going to a local farm to make their selections. When choosing your pumpkin pay attention to the stem. Pumpkins with stems last longer; long or curved stems add character to the pumpkin.

A pumpkin placed by a door or in front of a house today has come to symbolize the fall season, good fortune and prosperity.

Due to time and erosion some of the stones in Raway Cemetery are deteriorating. The cemetery is an important part of American history. Buried there are Revolutionary and Civil War soldiers, and Abraham Clark, signer of the Declaration of Independence and namesake for Clark Township.

The scouts carefully and respectfully recorded sections 1, 2, and 5 of Rahway Cemetery. They noted names, dates, and special characteristics of the graves and took a picture of each headstone.



## **DOCUMENTING NJ'S REVOLUTIONARY WAR VETS**

Two local women are helping create a new database of New Jersey Revolutionary War Soldiers. A project of the Daughters of the American Revolution (DAR), the database will be the most comprehensive produced to date utilizing a wide variety of sources.

"The hope is that this database will not only allow us to recognize and honor these veterans, but also help their descendants and researchers to learn about them," said DAR volunteer Holly Dunbar. Working on Somerset County, Dunbar has compiled information on more than 1,700 individuals to date.

Project volunteers aim to find and record as much information about each patriot as possible. This includes dates and locations of birth, enlistment, death and burial; service record with rank and unit, battles, if wounded, taken prisoner or killed; family with names of spouses, parents and children; and the sources of this information. A special effort is being made to include women, African Americans and Native Americans.

"We are starting with the current DAR database, but also using church records, county and local histories, surviving military and pension records, newspapers, and more," said Dunbar, who is a member of Elizabeth Snyder-Continental Chapter in Green Brook.

Another chapter member, Ruth Ryno, is working on Essex County, which also includes present-day Union and and part of Passaic County. ""I look forward to helping prepare this database in honor of our New Jersey patriots as our country prepares to celebrate America's 250th anniversary in 2026." When the project is completed, the database will cover all of New Jersey and will be made available to the public.

DAR is a nonprofit nonpolitical service organization open to women 18 and older who can prove lineal descent from a patriot of the American Revolution. Elizabeth Snyder-Continental Chapter is based in Green Brook and serves areas in Somerset, Middlesex and Union counties. New members are welcome.
