### **COLLECTION FOR CHILDREN BATTLING CANCER**

The Scotch Plains Rescue Squad Auxiliary has chosen Kisses for Kyle for its annual service project. Kisses for Kyle is dedicated to helping children with cancer, as well as assisting the family unit as a whole. It provides practical assistance to families struggling to care for their child and maintain their livelihood. They serve families in New Jersey, Pennsylvania, and Delaware.

The foundation was named after Kyle Snyder, who in 1998 was diagnosed with leukemia just three weeks shy of his second birthday. After a valiant but brief eight-month fight, he lost his life to the disease. In 2001, Kisses for Kyle was founded by his mother, Sharon, to honor Kyle's memory and to help other children and families battling childhood cancer.

The Auxiliary will collect donations at the Scotch Plains Farmers' Market on the following dates: October 7th; October 21st; November 4th and November 18th from 8:00 a.m. until 1:00 p.m. People can purchase items from the holiday lists (see below) directly from Amazon, they can purchase gifts and bring them to the Market, or they can make monetary donations at the Market which the Auxiliary will use to purchase gift cards.

According to a representative from Kisses for Kyle, teen cancer patients are often overlooked, so the Auxiliary asks that people please remember them when making gift selections. New water bottles are a much needed item for teens and these can also be collected at the market. Gas cards for the parents are also greatly appreciated.

### **PRESENTATION BY JACK THE RIPPER RESEARCHER - OCT. 16TH**

Dr. Mark R. Vogel, a clinical psychologist with 36 years of experience, including working in the New Jersey prison system will present his program, "Jack the Ripper: A Mystery of Mysteries" on October 16th at Fanwood Presbyterian Church, 74 Martine Avenue (McDermott Street entrance) at 7:30 p.m. The program is being hosted by the College Club of Fanwood-Scotch Plains; it is free and the public is invited to attend. Please note that this program is not intended for children.

Jack the Ripper is one of the most infamous serial murder cases in the world. Set in the slums of eastern London in 1888, five women, possibly more, all impoverished prostitutes, were viciously slayed. The heinous crimes rocked London to its core. The unknown assailant, like a phantom in the night, committed the grisly tasks and vanished without ever being caught.

The identity of Jack the Ripper is by far the most beguiling aspect of the murders. But within this mystery are countless other mysteries. Was he a doctor? Why did he keep some of the victim's organs? Are the famous Ripper letters authentic or a hoax? How was he able to commit the murders without being caught? Did he have an accomplice? Why did he stop killing?

PowerPoint presentation with then and now photos of the murder sites. He was a guest speaker at a Jack the Ripper conference in London in 2018. He promises a "riveting lecture".






The FSPSL has also been a loyal supporter of the College Club Community Date Calendar for more than 15 years.

Remarks by Westfield Mayor Shelley Brindle, State Senator Jon Bramnick, West Fields Chapter Sons of the American Revolution President, Jay Hershey and New Jersey Daughters of the American Revolution State Historian, Pat Saftner.

The community joined in a symbolic march reenactment into an Mindowaskin Park accompanied by the Generals Rochambeau, Washington and Major General Chastellux and General Lafayette. the New Jersey Sons of the American Revolution Color Guard, the Daughters of the American Revolution, Washington's Fifes and Drums, the Miller-Cory Museum colonial living history group and Heard's Militia.

A festival followed with children's' games provided by Liberty Hall, and local history organizations such as the Forgotten Victory Trail Association, Miller-Cory House Museum, Princeton Battlefield Society, Union Township Historical Society, Chatham Historical Society, Westfield Chapter Daughters of the American

Revolution and the Washington Association of SAR, the Westfield Chapter DAR, the New Jersey had informational tables set up and interacted with the public to share information, sell history books and engage new members. An encampment with tents, cooking demonstrations, fife and drum music, musket firing and marching drills will occur during the festival.

### **POLICE WORK WITH RESIDENTS TO KEEP THE TOWNSHIP SAFE**

Allow me to address the growing concerns regarding recent incidents of crime in our community.

The safety and security of our residents and their property are of paramount concern. The Scotch Plains Police Department, working closely with the Union County Prosecutor's Office, neighboring police departments and other levels of law enforcement, are doing everything possible to catch criminals so that they are prosecuted to the fullest extent possible under the law.

Moreover, our police department has developed numerous programs to prevent crime before it happens, as part of our proactive efforts to make Scotch Plains as safe as possible. We eagerly work with citizens to develop initiatives that keep crime down.

Residents can help by registering their outdoor security cameras that are run through private alarm systems. Several years ago, the municipal code was modified to include a volunteer Private Outdoor Surveillance Camera Registry. Through this program, if a crime is committed, our officers can review the surveillance footage of cameras as part of their investigation. Residents are urged to stop by the police department at 430 Park Ave. to complete the necessary paperwork.


Please note this registry does not work for Ring cameras and similar products. But our police will ask to see footage when conducting an investigation in a neighborhood. Locking doors to cars and homes also goes a very long way. Scotch Plains is a secure town, but our township is not fenced in. Too many times, residents have made it too easy to steal a car or break into a home by simply not locking doors. I implore residents to change that practice immediately. You could help by discussing this issue with your neighbors, as part of local efforts to fight crime.

At a recent meeting on these matters with the Union County Prosecutor, mayors from Westfield, Summit, Cranford and Scotch Plains were told that criminals are breaking into homes every day of the week, at all times of the day, but almost always when no one is at home. Sometimes a parent driving their child to school keeps their garage door open, their alarm off and home unlocked. In just a few minutes, a criminal lets themselves in and steals wallets, purses, car keys, jewelry or more.

Keeping or adding outdoor lights, while adding a security alarm to a home (especially with window sensors), appears to also be a strong deterrent to criminals who almost always want to get in, and quickly get out.

Residents continue to form street or neighborhood watches unaffiliated with the police. They, and others, secure signs to post around their homes stating that the street is being watched by neighbors and cameras. These steps are excellent ways in which to further deter crime in our neighborhoods.

The police serve as a resource to these local,
