Ellen's commitment to Summit was deep and firmly rooted. She, along with her husband, Chip, made Summit their home for over two decades, watching their three children flourish and graduate from Summit Public Schools. Ellen was a beacon of community enhancement, deeply understanding that the essence of a thriving community is embedded in the spirit of giving.

Throughout her life, Ellen was not just a leader but a beacon, illuminating the path for countless young people. Her guidance and steadfast support nurtured and molded many future leaders of Summit.

Ellen was a dedicated public servant who devoted two terms to Summit's Common Council, followed by her election as Summit's Mayor in November 2011. In these roles, she conveyed an extraordinary ability to lead with determination and creativity, infusing a sense of optimism and camaraderie into city governance. Her leadership was characterized by a genuine appreciation for the hard work and dedication of city employees. She completed her term as mayor in 2015.

During her 20 years in Summit, Ellen's commitment to our community was truly exceptional:

She served as the president of the PTO at both Lincoln-Hubbard School and Summit High School, fostering a strong connection between schools and families.

Ellen was an active member of the Board of School Estimate, where her insights and dedication helped shape the future of education in our city.

Her contributions extended to the Zoning Board, where she lent her expertise for five years, ensuring responsible development in Summit.

In 2009, she served as Council President, showcasing her ability to lead and collaborate effectively.

Ellen's involvement in various committees, including Safety, Finance, and Building & Grounds, demonstrated her versatility and dedication to making Summit a better place.

## **SARKISSIAN RECEIVES US PRESIDENT'S VOLUNTEER SERVICE AWARD**

This summer experience enabled Leon to see first-hand SJSK operations and the difficulties it encounters along with some success along the way. Leon reflected "Through a mélange of language and food, we can not only help fight hunger but improve mental health as well. These common threads bring us all together and I hope, in a small way, I was able to make a difference."

Prior to this summer, Leon and Newark Academy students already supported SJSK

# CHRIST CHILD SOCIETY OF SUMMIT

Over 80% of the donated backpacks went to Summit students who are eligible for the free and reduced lunch program. The remaining backpacks went to students in neighboring towns who are GRACE recipients and to students at New Communities in Newark. For many families, furnishing their children with school supplies is a hardship. Providing these items can alleviate expenses that can then be used for food, rent, or other necessities.

Distribution of the backpacks was a concerted

The Summit Old Guard was founded in Summit in 1930 and meets most Tuesdays at the New Providence Presbyterian Church located at 1307 Springfield Ave. in New Providence. Our motto is "Come for the Programs. Stay for the Friends." Please join us. Our programs are free to the public, and we welcome you!

October speakers include Dr. Wm. Happer, professor of Physics; Mike Martin discussing ethical drug development; Robert Connley, Mayor of Madison; and Paul Cirillo, astronomer.

On October 3rd, Dr. William Happer, retired professor of physics, Princeton, will present a different interpretation of selected Climate change data. Dr. Happer will question current dogma about climate change by presenting scientific data and theory which questions the underlying assumptions of conventional wisdom, He expects many questions and will allow ample time to accommodate OG members. Dr. Happer worked in various capacities for the Bush and Trump Administrations.

Our speaker on October 17th with be Mike Martin. Mike spent many years in the pharmaceutical industry and will focus on how drugs are developed, the regulatory process, historic examples of pioneering discoveries which have combated serious diseases. Unique theories on how penicillin was discovered! Is Thalidomide which was the scourge of the 1950's still prescribed? The discussion will present an entertaining description on important historical discoveries and controversies. As part

of the presentation, he will also discuss the origins of a few common therapies which the OG members are currently taking.

On October 24th, Robert Conley, Mayor of Madison will be our speaker. The Mayor will discuss his administration's efforts to maintain the excellent quality of life in Madison despite dealing with diverse populations composed of students and suburbanites with different needs. Three universities are headquartered in Madison which has tax consequences and other social issues, The Mayor had to address the following proposals: allow Madison to become a sanctuary city and providing a storefront for marijuana dispensing, indeed, Madison is also unique because it has its own electric power distribution facility. The Mayor will discuss these and other issues.

Since it was formed in 1962, the First Aid Squad has been staffed entirely by volunteers and funded solely by private contributions. The Squad receives no government funding and does not bill for service. "For over 60 years, neither our patients, nor the taxpayers have ever receive a bill for our service," said Squad's President John Buscaino who accepted the Proclamation on behalf of the Squad. In her Proclamation, Mayor Radest praised the Squad for answering over 2,300 emergency calls in 2022 and estimated the Squad saves the City about 2 million dollars annually. The Squad's fund drive is a mail campaign sent to every residence and business in Summit. They do not solicit by phone and do not use any outside fundraising agencies. Even the fund drive itself is run by volunteers noted Public Information Officer John Staunton.

The all-volunteer First Aid Squad, responds to emergency calls 24/7, is entirely funded through private donations and does not bill for service. The Squad is always looking for new volunteers to join its ranks. All needed training, uniforms and equipment is provided.
