The Girl Scout Bronze award is earned by 4th and 5th grade Girl Scouts who make a long-lasting change to a community of their choice. They put up pictures and notes on a bulletin board in the school explaining their bronze award project. Confirming they had fun in doing the project Ellie Batiromo stated, "I enjoyed doing this project with my friends" while Emma Greguske said, "I am glad to have done this for the school and its students."
