November speakers include Marc Andreo, Greg Wroclawski, Jeffrey Gitterman, and Dr. Paul Desjardins. Please join us. Our programs are free to the public, and we welcome you!

November 7th, Marc Andreo, Scout Executive of the Patriot's Path Council, will give an overview of Scouting in New Jersey, focusing on the council, which includes Morris, Somerset, Sussex, Union, and parts of Middlesex counties. Recent history includes accepting girls in core programs, outdoor activities, life skills and values. He will discuss how each of his successive aircraft has moved up in performance and capability, and he will cover the physical characteristics of Morristown

Airport and how they have changed over the years, as well as how the types of operations at the airport and traffic have evolved.

November 21st, Jeffrey Gitterman, CEO, Gittermen Asset Management. Jeffrey will discuss how the physical changes in climate from 1850 through 2020, a period of 170 years, have consistently occurred, and how the current warming of the planet has affected our lives. His presentation is not meant to be a treatise on climate change and its global effects, but rather a discussion of how investment advisors and investors can take action to integrate climate change considerations into investment decisions and to align portfolio goals with both profits and the needs of the planet. Admittedly, he believes this is a difficult and complex task.

November 28th, Dr. Paul Desjardins will be our speaker. Paul has used his wide-ranging educational background to full advantage in his career as a clinical pharmacologist, dentist, Academic Dean at UMDNJ (Newark), Senior Vice President at Wyeth and Pfizer Consumer Healthcare, and leading researcher in over 130 clinical studies. At the same time, he has experienced severe medical challenges. He will share lessons from his lifetime journey as a dentist, pharmacologist and especially a throat cancer survivor.





"We planned a variety of events to help us celebrate," says Bicentennial Committee Chair Pam Mansfield. "Once a month we spend a few

look back at our history. In February someone dressed in costume as our first installed pastor, Rev. Joseph Meeker Ogden, for whom the church is named."

In May the church held a community-wide bbq and concert, featuring the Madison-based band Rosewood, on the lawn. Over 250 people attended and the event raised \$1,000 for the Chatham Borough Volunteer Fire Department, which was celebrating its 125th anniversary and in need of new equipment.

At the 4th of July parade, the church set up a snack and water station on its front lawn, prime viewing spot for the parade. It also entered a float and banner celebrating the bicentennial.

In August, the church celebrated its oldest living and longest member, Mrs Jean Wallace White who turned 105 on August 9th. She received proclamations from Chatham Borough

Ogden Memorial Presbyterian Church, 286 minutes during our Sunday worship service to Council, Morris County Commissioners and US Congresswoman Mikie Sherrill's office. IOn addition, the church partnered with Juniper Village for a driveby parade of 24 vehicles including cars, fire trucks, DPW vehicles and police cars.

> In September Pastor Kathi Heath was installed as Ogden's 15th pastor. Five local Presbyterian ministers participated in the ceremony and special guests from the Stewartsville Presbyterian Church.

In October, a month-long art show celebrated the church and its rich history. More than two dozen pieces from watercolors to acrylics to oil paintings are included as well as photographs, some from the church's own collection. On October 22nd a special worship service and luncheon celebrated the Bicentennial. Former pastors, employees and members are expected to attend.







Ann will discuss her memoir, Lost and Found, Surviving Displacement, Finding Love, Uncovering Secrets. She will talk about her journey from one country to another, learning new languages and adapting to different cultures, while struggling to figure out where she fits in. Born in war-torn Romania shortly after WWII, the author fled to Israel along with her family, and then they abruptly moved to Canada. She moved to the US at 19, another uprooting in her young life. When she meets the love of her life at a young age, she learns that his family's history of displacement and survival during the Holocaust parallels her own. As she matures, has children, and her ambitions grow, the author finds an inner strength. Even a shocking family secret learned late in life that might have

shattered another person's worldview, only strengthens her resolve to remain true to herself. Her extraordinary life of dealing with losses and secrets, and finding love, is the subject of this moving memoir.

Ann & her husband are residents of Madison, having moved here 18 years ago after raising 3 daughters and 5 dogs in Randolph Township. Ann is a retired Deputy Attorney General, following her trial work of Termination of Parental Rights trials and appeals. She is a graduate of Rutgers University (New Brunswick) and Rutgers Law School (Newark). Never happy to sit still, she has always been involved in volunteer work and politics, starting with the Red Cross and Leaders' Corps in High School, Pres. of Morristown Jewish Center Sisterhood, Pres. Randolph Chamber of Commerce and member of Rotary, then held elected office as Councilwoman and Mayor in Randolph. Ann has been president of the AAUW Madison Area Branch since June 2022. ### RENEE REILLY CELEBRATES ANNIVERSARY OF LIFE SAVING TRANSPLANT

celebrating an incredible milestone as she marks the 10-year anniversary of her life-saving liver transplant. Renee, 52, has not only cherished every moment of her life since her successful transplant but is also passionate about advocating for NJ Sharing Network, the nonprofit organization responsible for the recovery and placement of donated organs and tissue for transplant in the Garden State. She actively shares her story with others to encourage more people to register as organ and tissue donors.

"I continue to feel overwhelmed, humble, and grateful," said Renee. "Giving someone a second chance as an organ and tissue donor is such a special and amazing gift of love."

Renee's journey began when she was 16 years

old and was diagnosed with Polycystic Kidney Renee Reilly, a resident of Madison, NJ, is Disease (PKD). Her father, who also battled PKD, had received a life-saving kidney transplant that gave him an additional 35 years of life. Renee later developed Polycystic Liver Disease (PLD) after giving birth to her two boys. She was added to the liver transplant list in 2009.

> "Waiting for the liver transplant phone call, I felt hopeless at times, tired, anxious, and I didn't think I would ever get 'the call,'" said Renee.

> The pivotal moment in Renee's journey arrived unexpectedly on a day filled with emotional turmoil. Her father had been in the hospital for weeks due to complications from a previous surgery. Renee had just visited him when she received 'The Call' from the transplant center.

> "I began to cry because I was filled with emotions, from joy and excitement to worry

about my family and guilt about receiving such a precious gift. But my husband, John, and my sons, Ian and Brendan, served as a source of strength and kept me focused because they were excited to know that I was going to get a liver transplant," said Renee.

On August 6, 2013, Renee's liver transplant surgery was a success, giving her a new lease on life. In 2017, Renee's kidneys started to fail. Fortunately, she received a kidney transplant in 2018, sparing her from the hardships of dialysis treatments.

The transformation in Renee's life posttransplants has been remarkable. She now enjoys all of her favorite hobbies, including gardening, knitting/crocheting, sewing, and spending time with her family.

"Thanks to my organ donors and the miracle of transplantation, I have been there for unforgettable moments like my boys' graduations. I am now able to give hugs again without any pain due to my enlarged liver," said Renee. "Now, I am focused on sharing my story to give hope for those waiting for the gift of life and inspire everyone to register as organ and tissue donors."

According to United Network for Organ Sharing (UNOS), there are over 100,000 Americans – nearly 4,000 of whom live in New Jersey – waiting for a life-saving transplant. One organ and tissue donor can save eight lives and enhance the lives of over 75 others. 
