DAR HONORS NATIVE AMERICANS AND VETERANS

November is National Native American Heritage Month, a time to celebrate indigenous peoples and their contributions to the nation. Members of the Elizabeth Snyder-Continental Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution (DAR) accepted a Heritage Month Proclamation from the mayor of Green Brook and the Township Committee on October 16. The chapter requested the Proclamation as part of a DAR national initiative.

"Green Brook is honored to have a chapter of the DAR within the township," said Green Brook Twp. Mayor Jim Van Arsdale. "We appreciate their good work in the community as well as their passion and desire to educate the public about our past."

"We want to thank Green Brook for recognizing this celebration of Native Americans," said Holly Dunbar, DAR State Chairman of American Indians. "Our area was home to the Lenape long before Europeans arrived. Their legacy lives on in their descendants, their words for places, plants and animals that we use today, the food crops that they developed, and their trails that are now our roads and highways."

November is also a time to remember and honor those who have served in the military. On Veterans Day, November 11, the DAR will honor local veterans in a ceremony at The Chelsea in Warren.

"This is an opportunity to thank our veterans and let them know how much we appreciate their service," said Regent Ashley Salsano. "Their dedication and sacrifice have preserved our nation's freedom. We all owe them a debt of gratitude."

The chapter's recent DAR Day of Service projects included collecting holiday gifts for the veterans at Lyons V.A. Medical Center and gathering donations of pet supplies for the Plainfield Area Humane Society Shelter; an estimated \$750 worth of goods were donated. Members also cleaned historic headstones at Liberty Corner Presbyterian Church in Bernards Twp.



Turnaround 1: On Jefferson Ave. at utility pole 60314GBT which is just before closed bridge. Mile 1: On Greenbrook Rd., 2 foot after utility pole BT60338GT on the left.

Turnaround 2: On Greenbrook Rd. 49 feet 3 inches west of utility pole BT60345GBT

on the north side of road and at center of house #73 on the south side of road. Mile 2: On east side of Briar Circle at the trailing edge of garage door to #50 on the left

Mile 3: On east side of Green Brook Middle School Track at 1 foot after 21 yard line.

Green Brook Historical Society

The Dr. John Vermeule House, one of Green Brook's historic links to its early settlers was built as a farmstead. Construction began in 1799 and became occupied by the Vermeule family in 1805. Dr. Vermeule practiced medicine and operated a farm on the original 113 acres of his property. The home is based on a blending of English and Dutch architectural traditions with Georgian and Federal style influences.

Vermeule ownership of the property ended in 1824. Various families bought and sold the property over the years, namely, Vail, Cohen, Voorhies and lastly, Mundy. The farmstead continued to function as a dairy farm into the mid-20th century. The township of Green Brook acquired the house and remaining 2.2 acres of the property in 2008. Necessary preservation renovations have been made to some structural elements, but the house is virtually unchanged from its original construction.

The Dr. John. Vermeule House Museum located at 223 Rock Avenue, Green Brook will be open for visitors on Saturday, 11/18/23 from 10:00 a.m. - 12:00 p.m. There you will meet several of its volunteer members to give you a glimpse into 19th - 20th century rural living. There are some interesting outbuildings and farm equipment to see, on the 2-acre property.

Mark your calendars and consider participating as a volunteer or enjoy the event as a proud resident!

Our meetings are held at Green Brook Town Hall, 111 Greenbrook Road, on the 3rd Thursday of every month at 7:30 p.m. We also offer Zoom, for those who can't come in person. BLUE ENVELOPE PROGRAM

The Green Brook Township Police Department has implemented a Blue Envelope Program, which was first developed in the State of Connecticut. The purpose of the Blue Envelope is to improve the interaction between a driver with autism spectrum disorder (ASD) and Police Officers on a traffic stop. The Blue Envelope provides written information and guidance on enhancing effective communication between Police Officers and persons with ASD.

The primary goal of the Blue Envelope Program is to assist drivers with ASD with document organization and to help them understand what to do on a motor vehicle stop. The envelope's instructions warn the driver that the officer might have a radio and flashing lights on their patrol car. The instructions also direct the driver to keep his or her hands on the steering wheel until they receive further orders from the officer. The envelope also details the events that should occur during a stop and how the driver should respond.

In addition, the Blue Envelope provides Police Officers with the means to quickly identify an operator of a motor vehicle who has ASD and helps to guide Police Officers with the interaction. The Police Officer's section of the envelope explains some behaviors that the driver might exhibit, including repetitive body movements and signs of high anxiety. Police Officers are also instructed to allow the driver extra time to respond, to use the most simplistic language possible and to clearly tell the driver when he or she can leave the scene.

The ASD driver can place a copy of their driver's license, vehicle registration, and

The Green Brook Township Police insurance cards inside the envelope for quick epartment has implemented a Blue Envelope access. The envelope also contains an ogram, which was first developed in the State emergency contact form for the ASD driver.

The "Blue Envelope Program" will be implemented immediately, and the envelopes will be available at the police department. Drivers who wish to participate, or someone representing them, can pick up an envelope at the Green Brook Township Police Department located at 109 Greenbrook Road, Green Brook, NJ 08812. "The Officers of the Green Brook Police Department are proud to participate in a program that improves communication between the department and those that we serve," said Chief William Coward.

VANDALS CAUGHT IN THE ACT.

handed vandalizing a building at Boy Scout Camp Wheeler, in Byram Township, NJ. They are seen here in a "line up" against the wall.

They claim that they were doing repairs and renovations to an old decrepit building at the Boy Scout Camp. But they were seen removing valuable lumber, sinks, toilets, shower heads, and construction materials from the building.

Just kidding. This is a group of dedicated volunteers, including many retired professionals, who volunteer every week all year round at the Boy Scout camps for Patriot's Path Council in northern New Jersey. These guys pictured have come up every Wednesday and Thursday for several months to renovate the Pool House and other buildings. This group includes retired engineers, an electrician, computer experts, small business owners, and corporate executives.

The Pool House building was built in 1971. The roof was still good, but the wooden walls were completely rotted, and the roof was sagging perilously. They needed to prop up the roof and replace the boards one by one.

The "Pool House Gang" were caught red Eventually the building will have two bathrooms, two common showers and 8 individual changing rooms on each of two sides. There is a full sized swimming pool behind the building, so all of the chlorination, pumping mechanisms and electrical service are also located inside the building.

> The "Flintlocks BSA, Inc." a 501c3 corporation, is a group of retired scouters who volunteer at the camps every week, all year round, to help the council. They do most of the repairs and maintenance for the three Council camps, but also build new structures, such as cabins, waterfront structures, picnic tables and tent platforms. In 2018 they secured funding and built the STEM Lab at Allamuchy. Second, they make the craft kits for birdhouses, bird feeders, stools, handy boxes, racing sailboats, etc., which are sold through the Scout Shops. Third, Flintlocks volunteer to help run the many Council programs. Three quarters of the Flintlocks have received the Silver Beaver Award, the highest National award a volunteer may receive.
