As part of their annual "Scouting for Food" initiative, local scouts will be dropping off bags and flyers at your home. Residents are asked to fill the bags with non-perishable items to donate to the drive. The flyers will have further directions about pick-up and other ways to donate.

Members of the community are also welcome to bring food directly to Faith Lutheran Church at 524 South Street, New Providence, during office hours Monday through Thursday, 8:00 a.m. -4:00 p.m.

The most needed items are spaghetti sauce, pasta, powdered milk, condiments, canned meat, pork and beans, cereal, Pop-Tarts, mac and cheese, peanut butter, jelly, tea bags, coffee, canned vegetables, canned fruit, raisins, and soup.

In addition, the community is invited to come to Faith Lutheran on Saturday, November 18 at 9:00 a.m. to help sort and pack the collected food into labeled boxes which will provide meals to patrons of the CSA of New Providence and Star Fish Food Pantry. All ages are welcome, and many volunteers are needed, with something for everyone to do.

Stay for 30 minutes or 3 hours - as long as you would like. Being a part of the "organized chaos"

is a lot of fun. The day is "organized" because after 41 years, we've worked out the kinks, and "chaos" because of the high-energy volunteers buzzing in every direction! The fun part is working together with family, neighbors, and friends to make a difference in this very direct and tangible way.

On Saturday, November 25, volunteers from Faith will load up a truck and deliver most of the boxes to Star Fish Food Pantry in Plainfield. There, more volunteers will be on hand to unload and further sort products by item and expiration date. This delivery will provide patrons with food throughout the winter and spring.

At the 2022 sort and pack day, 402 boxes were packed with canned and packaged food valued at \$32,700. The CSA of New Providence received 161 boxes and Star Fish Food Pantry received 241 boxes.



OLD GUARD SPEAKERS PROGRAM

The Summit Old Guard was founded in Summit in 1930 and meets most Tuesdays at 10 a.m. at the New Providence Presbyterian Church located at 1307 Springfield Ave. Our motto is "Come for the Programs. Stay for the Friends."

November speakers include Marc Andreo, Greg Wroclawski, Jeffrey Gitterman, and Dr. Paul Desjardins. Please join us. Our programs are free to the public, and we welcome you!

November 7th, Marc Andreo, Scout Executive of the Patriot's Path Council, will give an overview of Scouting in New Jersey, focusing on the council, which includes Morris, Somerset, Sussex, Union, and parts of Middlesex counties. Recent history includes accepting girls in core programs, outdoor activities, life skills and values. Scouting also provides numerous services to local communities such as several major outdoor projects supporting the Summit Library's many learning enhancing programs.

November 14th, Greg Wrocławski, a commercial pilot and flight instructor will tell us about that "other" airport, the Morristown Municipal Airport. Greg's presentation will cover the history of the Morristown Municipal Airport from its origins in the 1930s to the present day. Greg has been a 32-year resident of the airport, having based all four of his personal aircraft there since 1991. He has a commercial license and an instrument rating. He will discuss how each of his successive aircraft has moved up in performance and capability, and he will cover the physical characteristics of Morristown Airport and how they have changed over the years, as well as how the types of operations at the airport and traffic have evolved.

November 21st, Jeffrey Gitterman, CEO, Gittermen Asset Management. Jeffrey will discuss how the physical changes in climate from 1850 through 2020, a period of 170 years, have consistently occurred, and how the current warming of the planet has affected our lives. His presentation is not meant to be a treatise on climate change and its global effects, but rather a discussion of how investment advisors and investors can take action to integrate climate change considerations into investment decisions and to align portfolio goals with both profits and the needs of the planet. Admittedly, he believes this is a difficult and complex task.

November 28th, Dr. Paul Desjardins will be our speaker. Paul has used his wide-ranging educational background to full advantage in his career as a clinical pharmacologist, dentist, Academic Dean at UMDNJ (Newark), Senior Vice President at Wyeth and Pfizer Consumer Healthcare, and leading researcher in over 130 clinical studies. At the same time, he has experienced severe medical challenges. He will share lessons from his lifetime journey as a dentist, pharmacologist and especially a throat cancer survivor.



The New Providence High School Parent Teacher Student Association is proud to announce that the room previously used as a sick room/storage room within the nurse's office has been updated. The new space will now serve as a wellness room for our middle school and high school students and staff to use as a place to unwind, relax and decompress throughout the school year.

This quiet, comfortable space came to fruition through the collaboration of the PTSA and Debbie Merrick, founder of the New Providence Mental Health Advocacy & Education Committee. The goal was to design a space that would give students and staff a place where they can take a short break and reset themselves for the rest of the day.

"This is an important step in reducing the stigma of mental health and aligns with the NP MHAE committee mission. It allows those who need it to take a few minutes to pause, breathe, regroup or destress from a difficult moment," says Debbie.

We were also lucky to have our high school administration, nurses Andrea Wright R.N and Lauren Abbatemarco R.N and our custodial staff, update this room so that it is a safe and comfortable environment that can be easily accessed for any student or staff member who would like to take advantage of this newly created space.

The room includes freshly painted walls, a mural (provided by Lilo Walls), a new couch, soft lighting, additional storage, an ottoman, a meditation pillow, a sound machine, an iPad with calming apps, plush carpet, soft pillows and an extra special window light to brighten up the room (donated by the 2023 National Honor
