ANNUAL GARWOOD BROOK CLEANUP

Garwood Green Team volunteers recently joined up with NJDEP AmeriCorps Watershed and Garwood LIDL employees for the annual Garwood Brook Cleanup.

The rain and high stream flow kept most of the cleanup crew from walking in the brook, but there was plenty of trash - most of it plastic - to collect along the stream banks, and along South Avenue as well as the eastern edge of the LIDL parking lot and stream bank. Particular trash highlights included a portable CD player, a broken fence panel, and a table lamp. The crew cleaned the railroad edge of the LIDL property for the first time and was quite amazed at the amount of empty (!) beer and vodka bottles collected around the embankment. People really have to stop using street

gutters, streams, railroad lines and parking lots as dumping grounds! It all ends up in our drinking water!

The cleanup grabbers, gloves and bags are funded through a Clean Communities mini grant provided by the Borough of Garwood. Lidl commenced this joint project in 2022 as part of their community involvement campaign and strives to maintain their Garwood property on a weekly basis. Both parties to this public-private venture wish that they didn't have to schedule annual cleanups but look forward to doing so in order to make the eastern entrance into Garwood a pleasing one for all. Please dispose of all garbage appropriately!





GARWOOD GREEN TEAM

October was a busy month for the Garwood Green Team, with a cleanup and holiday events. There are also upcoming events to advertise and this request for assistance to make them happen!

First off, Garwood's very own Luke's Farm stand came through by donating and delivering pumpkins, hay bales and corn stalks for the Team and the Garwood Girl Scouts to arrange at Garwood Borough Hall and the JFK Plaza parking lot on October 8. Garwood just doesn't look like autumn until these decorative trimmings are completed.

Team member Jeff Jotz organized the Garwood/LIDL joint Garwood Brook cleanup on October 21. The cleanup got changed a little due to the rain, and subsequent high-water flow in the brook, but the group was still able to clean the top sides of the brook, and the South Avenue ROW. Thanks go to Jeff, Kim and Eleina Ficarra, Daniel D'Amico, Leslie Breen and Michael Mindel of the Garwood Green Team, and store manager Nik Reed, Chris O'Keeffe,

and Lewis Dokie of LIDL. AmeriCorps NJDEP Watershed Ambassador Morgan Crouch also assisted.

Highlights of the cleanup were finding a compact disk player, a fence section and a table lamp, and too many empty beer and vodka bottles to count! People really do need to stop throwing their litter in our streets, streams and parking lots! Don't they realize that this stuff enters our drinking water?

On October 28, the Green Team had a table and bikes - but no cars - at the Garwood PTA 'Trick or Trunk (bike)' event. Kim Ficarra, Julie Graham, and Jen Blumenstock 'womaned' the table where costumed figures selected our Halloween themed handouts (nothing with candy wrappers, of course!).

The Team's next activity is the completion of the wood chip path that was started back in April in Unami Park. As part of our adoption of the park, team members worked with Union County personnel to install a path from Cener Street facebook.com/garwoodgreenteam

halfway through the natural area of the park. This next phase -to be undertaken on October 18 - will complete the path from that halfway point to the baseball/soccer fields, providing a designated and dry path for all park users to travel.

Upcoming activities include the 'Adopt A Pot' program where Team members make and decorate Christmas Trees for placement in the 24 pots that are centered around Garwood's downtown. Local businesses chip in \$45/pot for decorated trees and their business signs 'planted' around the downtown. Volunteers are always welcome for the final decorating. All adopted pots will be out by the day before Thanksgiving. The Green Team will also participate in the Borough Tree lighting scheduled for November 25.

This has been a very important year for Garwood's shade trees with many actions taking With the tree planting and removal contracts being let very shortly by the Borough administration, residents will begin to see positive shade tree changes within the Borough Right-of-ways and on Brough properties.

In January of 2023, the Mayor appointed a Shade Tree Officer, tasked with the responsibility of responding to all citizen requests and complaints regarding shade trees. The Officer has responded to almost 70 such inquiries to date. On April 28, Arbor Day plantings and ceremonies were held at Washington and Lincoln Schools. In July, the Mayor and Council adopted a Shade Tree Ordinance creating a Borough Shade Tree Advisory Board, and adopting regulations regarding managing all Borough shade trees. The mayor also finished appointing all 7 members to the board.

The Borough recently awarded contracts for road reconstruction projects including portions of Second, Third and Locust avenues, and all of Fifth Avenue and Maple Street, and sidewalk improvements at other various locations throughout the Borough. These projects will include removal of trees that are creating tripping conditions on sidewalks, and trees that are not healthy or are simply the 'wrong tree in the wrong place'. Equally important is that these contracts will include the planting of over 70 new trees. The Advisory Board wishes to advise residents that the Borough is no longer planting trees such as oaks, maples, ashes, lindens, plane trees, or others that are prone to roots lifting sidewalks, or that mature to such heights that they interfere with overhead electric wires. The Borough Engineer and Shade Tree Officer walked the entire lengths of the streets to be improved selecting the tree removals and

planting sites. They have also provided the contractors with a tree list inclusive of all trees reaching a maximum of 25-30' heights, the vast majority of which will be native trees. The planting of these trees - while not eliminating ALL such issues- should go a long way to providing shade tree lined streets while reducing future costs of removing large trees.

Residents of properties adjacent to where new trees will be planted will receive a flyer from the board advising of the type of new tree that Is being planted, as well as tips on how to assist in maintaining the tree. Contact information for shade tree members will be provided allowing residents to ask any questions that they may have. It is the Board's goal to return Garwood to the days where there is more shade on our streets than heat islands, and our shade tree canopy is restored. We look forward to working with our fellow residents to achieve this goal together.










"DID YOU KNOW?"

Garwood Historical Committee

What is with the strange Unami name for our nearby local park and what is the history?

Unami Park is located south where the borders of Garwood, Cranford, and Westfield converge and is presently owned by the County of Union. Its origins were just a wooded area, and the locals 100 years ago called it "Garwood Park". In 1930 Union County set up a park system and Garwood ceded this wooded area to them. Subsequently, the county park system layout was designed by the Olmsted brothers, sons of the famed landscape architect Frederick Law Olmsted, whose greatest creation includes Manhattan's Central Park.

In the early years of the 1900's during the expansive phase of housing throughout northeast NJ, that wooded area almost became developed. Vintage maps of the woods show roads though it and a few houses within. Roads with names Park Ave, Columbus Ave and Wood Ave. Center Street extended west through the woods into Westfield. Upon making it parkland, the roads became vacated. Of the existing houses, one house was moved over to Pine Avenue, where an old Garwood family, the Hasselman's lived for decades.

But what about that name? Upon developing the parks within, the County named their parks after indigenous tribes living around this region centuries ago. Our local park is named for the Unami Indians who were a branch of the Lenni Lenape Indians that occupied central New Jersey. The Unami tribe, or as it is translated "people down river," is the group that called their home Shackamaxon. The full boundaries of the Unami branch's homeland were the northern two-thirds of New Jersey, the island to be known as Staten, and the adjoining woodland parts of eastern Pennsylvania, down to just below the future city of Philadelphia. One last tidbit of information: Tony Benzinger, the husband of Tina Ariemma, our former Garwood Business Administrator, is a descendant of the Unami Indian tribe.

And now you know the story.
