



WHAT WHERE AND WHEN IN OLD KENILWORTH MILITARY COUPLES WHO SERVED OUR NATION, PART 2

This is Part 2 of a two-part series featuring residents who as husband and wife or as brother and sister served in the military. All presented were honorably discharged. If you know of others, please contact this author. Residences indicated are still standing.

THE CONKLINS (brother/sister): William "Billy" and Mary Elinore Conklin lived with their parents, old time Police Chief George Conklin and wife Anna, at 215 N. 21st St. They both graduated from Jonathan Dayton Regional H. S., Springfield.

Billy served as a test pilot for the US Navy from 1942 to 1946. In 1946 he married neighbor Helen Clare Lohmann and later built a home at 540 Monroe Ave. They had two children, Bonnie (Pontin) and William, Jr. After WWII he served for 30 years as a Newark International Airport air traffic controller. He teamed up with fellow Kenilworth WWII veteran Raymond Scheuerer, a professional photographer. With Billy piloting and Ray with camera in hand, they took many invaluable historic aerial photographs of Kenilworth. Billy died in 1990 at age 67 while a resident of Franklin Twp. He is buried in the Fairview Cemetery, Westfield.

His sister, Mary Elinore, served in the Women Accepted for Volunteer Services, aka the WAVES, of the US Naval reserves. She was stationed in New England. She attained the rank of lieutenant, j. g., the highest military rank ever achieved by a Kenilworth woman during wartime. After the war she worked as a stenographer and married M. T. "Marty" (Manness Tremlet) Martin. They had two sons, Jeffrey and Thomas. She died in 1954 at the young age of 32 while a New York City resident. She, too, is buried in the Fairview Cemetery.

THE PATERSONS (brother/sister): In 1929, Adolf and Edith Paterson, nine and ten years old respectively, came to Kenilworth from Elizabeth with their parents, Charles and Ingeborg. The family lived at 25 S. Michigan Ave. and later at 42 N. 23rd St. Their 23rd St. home was moved in

the mid-1960s to what is now 509 Washington Ave. Adolf and Edith attended Roselle Park H.S., from which Edith graduated, but Adolf graduated from the then new Jonathan Dayton Regional H.S., Springfield, where he spent his senior year.

Adolf became a partner in the Charles Paterson Flooring Co., established by his father, which was located across from their Michigan Ave. home. He began his WWII service in 1942 which included being an infantry paratrooper in the 101st Screaming Eagles. He attained the rank of 2nd lieutenant in the Army Air Corps. Heavily decorated, he saw combat at the Rhine River and was in the Times Square Victory Parade of January 12, 1946. In 1947 he married Mary Jane Andy. They had seven children. Adolf passed away in 2020 in a South Jersey retirement community at age ninety-nine and a half. He is buried in the Brigadier General Wm. C. Doyle Military Cemetery in Burlington Co.


In 1943, while a beautician, Edith enlisted in the Women's Army Corps, aka the WACS. At war's end she was a corporal and received the Bronze Service Star. She later was employed as an oil refinery typist and bookkeeper, and finally as a postal clerk. Edith remained single. She died in FL in 2019 at the age of 97 and is buried in the Fairview Cemetery.

The Kenilworth Police Department is proud to participate in Union County's Blue Envelope Program which is geared towards fostering inclusivity and promoting safer interactions between law enforcement officers and individuals with Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD). Blue Envelopes are available at our police headquarters.

The Blue Envelope Program is accessible to all Union County residents on the Autism Spectrum. Residents can obtain a Blue Envelope at their local police departments throughout the county.

The Blue Envelope Program introduces a simple yet effective tool that contains essential information for drivers with Autism Spectrum Disorder. This includes a copy of their driver's license, vehicle registration, insurance details, and an emergency contact card. Additionally, the envelope provides clear instructions to drivers on

The Kenilworth Police Department is proud to how to navigate a traffic stop and interact with rticipate in Union County's Blue Envelope law enforcement officers in a manner that ogram which is geared towards fostering promotes clarity and safety.

Key features of the Blue Envelope Program include:


- Specialized Training: Every officer in Union County, including local officers in all 21 municipalities, will undergo specialized training to develop a deeper understanding of Autism Spectrum Disorder and the best practices for engaging with individuals during traffic stops.
- Communication Facilitation: Drivers with Autism Spectrum Disorder can present the blue envelope to the officer upon being stopped, allowing officers to quickly recognize the situation and adapt their approach accordingly.
- Essential Information: The envelope includes guidance for officers to simplify requests and

minimize the risk of misunderstandings or potential escalation. Additionally, officers are advised to contact the person listed on the emergency contact card for assistance if needed.

• Verbal or Nonverbal Indication: A checkedoff box on the envelope indicates whether the driver is verbal or nonverbal, which aids officers in communicating effectively.

"Every single police department in Union County is proud to be a part of this initiative," said Elizabeth Police Chief Giacomo Sacca and President of the Union County Police Chief's Association. "Our officers have undergone thorough briefings and trainings to ensure they are well-versed in the proper protocols, and they are eager to put their training into action."

Before earning his role as the agency administrator, Chief Sacca served as the Commanding Officer of the Emergency Service Unit, Patrol Division, Narcotics Unit, and Training Division. Chief Sacca's current responsibilities include the management of daily operations, strategic planning for the agency, and ensuring the resource needs of the 365 sworn members of the department.

Chief Sacca is an alumnus of the United States

Naval Postgraduate School with a Master of Arts in Security Studies, Homeland Security and Chief Sacca completed Defense. his undergraduate studies at Thomas Edison State University, achieving a Bachelor of Science in Security Homeland and Emergency Management. He also has a certificate in Public Safety Liability Mitigation, Risk Management from Richard Stockton University. In 2021, Chief Sacca completed the Certified Public Manager Program at Rutgers University.

Chief Sacca is the current President of the Union County Police Chief's Association. Chief Sacca serves as the Superintendent of the John H. Stamler Police Academy and the Chairman of the Union County Law Enforcement Officer Memorial project. Chief Sacca is a member of the Board of Trustees for the 313 Ancestor's Speak Project. Chief Sacca also serves as an Executive Board Member of the Italian American Police Society of New Jersey and is a Commissioner for the New Jersey State Chief's of Police Accreditation Board. 

Kenilworth resident Petty Officer Juan Martinez, David Brearley Class of 2016 is currently serving in the U.S. Navy as an administrator for facility operations at Norfolk Naval Station. Growing up he attended David Brearley High School where he played four-year varsity soccer and was a member of the 2013 and 2015 state championship teams. Following graduation, he continued to work for Blanc Noir Event Group, a DJ company in northern New Jersey where he worked since 2012. Juan enlisted in the U.S. Navy in May, 2019 and left for boot camp at Great Lakes, Chicago on August 19, 2019. When asked why he enlisted he stated,

"I enlisted because I always wanted to serve either my country or community. Whether it was law enforcement, the military, or any other capacity. I love to travel and see different things. The military was the best fit for me since it was a place where I can serve my country, travel the world, and see so many different things."

After bootcamp Juan was sent to Pensacola, Florida where he learned to become an ABH (Aviation Boatswain Mate Handler). After completion of his studies, he boarded the USS Dwight D. Eisenhower (CVN-69), also known as "IKE." He reported aboard the IKE on December 15, 2019, and fifteen days later received his first deployment. He commented,

"I was super excited and eager to get started and see the world, I was in for a rude awakening. Little did I know Covid came and ruined everything. We spent 206 days out at sea straight with no port calls and it turned into the longest deployment in carrier history. After being stationed on the Ike for three years I took my talents to shore duty. I am now currently stationed at Norfolk Naval Station running facility operations for the entirety of the base. Norfolk is known for being the biggest naval base in the world."

When asked about his duties as an Aviation Boatswain Mate Handler he commented,

"An aviation boatswain mate handler works on

the flight deck of an aircraft carrier. If you have ever seen the movie Top Gun or Top Gun Maverick, I'm the one that wears the yellow shirt and direct aircraft. It's said that it is the second most dangerous job in the military with the first being on the frontline of war. They say that because you need to always keep your head on a swivel especially at night. If someone turns an F-18 jet on and you're not paying attention, you can get blown overboard. We work fourteen- or sixteen-hour days especially when we are flying in the 5th fleet but it's an amazing, rewarding, and super-fun job."

Juan also commented on what it means to serve his country. He stated, "Serving my country to me means being a part of the 1% of Americans that make up the military. It means being part of a select few who are willing to sacrifice everything to support and defend our democratic republic for better or worse."

When asked if he keeps in touch with anyone in Kenilworth he stated, "I keep in touch with many people from back home. 


