





# PICTURESQUE RAHWAY – LARGE ESTATES LOST OVER YEARS

On Thursday, May 27, 1948, the editors and staff of the Rahway-News Record published a 180-page issue to commemorate the 125th anniversary of their newspaper. The extensive issue contained nine sections which covered all aspects of community life including the history of Rahway as a city of homes and industry. One article bemoaned the loss of some of the elegant estates that once graced the streets of many neighborhoods. The article cited several reasons for the loss of the large mansions and feared more of these gems would be razed in the future.

It's obvious their fears were justified as large properties were taken down during the decades of the 1960s and 1970s. The three magnificent structures that follow are examples of the beauties that were lost.



about 50 yards back from the corner of Elm and Esterbrook Avenues. The imposing stucco home featured a three-story flat-roofed entrance tower with central recessed entry, arched Palladian windows, over-hanging roof lines, and heavy support brackets, all characteristics of this masculine architectural style. It later became the home of Frank Stillman, a civic leader who served on many local boards. In the late 1950s the home became the property of the Zion Lutheran congregation and was used as their Sunday school building. It was razed in 1975.

"Elsmere Villa," the estate of George Bracher, was located at the end of East Hazelwood Avenue near the city limits just before the corner of Hart Street. Built in 1849, the three-story, 22 room Gothic Revival structure was set far back off the road on beautiful park-like grounds. The romantic Gothic style was characterized by pointed arches, steep gabled roofs, lacy bargeboards, colonnaded verandas, oriel windows, and finials on roof peaks. By the mid-1930s the residence was converted into a meeting hall and tavern and eventually became the Royal Gardens Picnic Grove, where social clubs held their outings. The building was torn down in the mid-1970s.

Touted as the largest home in Rahway, the residence of Peter Tillman stood on the north side of west Milton Avenue near the corner of Pierpont Street. Mr. Tillman served three terms as an assemblyman in the State Legislature and was Rahway's tax assessor. Architectural features included an ornate front entrance porch, triangular crowning over porch and windows, dentil molding, a three-story tower with conical roof, and massive chimneys with caps. By the 1920s, the massive home became too large to accommodate single family living and was converted into a multi-family dwelling with as many as six units. It served in that capacity until it was razed in 1967. The Clifford Case Senior Apartments were erected on the site in 1985.

Fortunately, handsome, "picturesque" homes still stand in Rahway neighborhoods, many from the 18th and 19th centuries with historical or architectural importance. City officials have shown an interest in protecting these valuable properties and several families are currently restoring their homes to showcase their significance and at the same time to increase their value. Let's hope we heed the warnings given in the 1948 anniversary issue and continue to make efforts to protect the legacy of our city's housing stock.

## THE HISTORY OF VANILLA

In December of 2019, I wrote an article for Our Town on "The History of Chocolate" so I thought Vanilla would be a good follow up topic. I must admit I'm surprised how little I knew about vanilla. For example vanilla is the world's most favorite spice. It is also the most labor-intensive crop in the world. Today there are now over 150 different varieties of vanilla orchid plants, each imparting its own unique characteristic.

Vanilla is believed to have been initially cultivated by the Totonac people in Mexico, in the region of Totonacapan. This region is now encapsulated by the state of Veracruz in modern-day Mexico. It is unknown how long exactly the Totonac had known about and cultivated Vanilla, but in the 15th century, the Aztecs conquered the Totonacs.

Afterwards the Aztecs would get a large part of their tribute from the Totonacs in the form of Vanilla and the Aztecs, in turn, used the vanilla for their Chocolatl. They discovered the value that the black vanilla pod brought in flavoring and medicinal benefits to their culture. The Aztacs were the first to use both drinks, often mixing them together. The mixture was much like our "hot chocolate" which they called it "xocolatl."

Legend says Aztec Emperor Montezuma was quoted saying xocolatl is a "Divine drink, which builds up resistance and fights fatigue. A cup of this precious drink permits a man to walk for a whole day without food."

In 1519, Hernando Cortez was served a beverage mixture of cocoa and vanilla by Aztec Emperor Montezuma, most likely the xocolatl. Both flavors were so well received by the Spanish conqueror that he brought the cocoa and vanilla beverage back to Europe as a treasure from the New World. Europeans quickly fell in love with vanilla and found that it could be used in a wide variety of recipes and beverages. They imported the cured vanilla beans from Mexico until the mid-1800s as a luxury spice for the elite class.

With European expansion around the world, cuttings of the vanilla vine were transplanted to other tropical regions to see if it would grow outside of its native region, Mexico. The vines did grow, however they did it not bear fruit.

Finally, a Belgian botanist, Charles Morren realized that this was because the Melipone Bee (native to Mexico), was the only source of

pollination for the vanilla orchid. This bee had developed a longer proboscis (mouth) which could reach into the vanilla pod flowers. Symbiotic relationships like this are common in nature and one of the reasons planting natives in our area is so important.

The future of vanilla came down to the discovery of a young 12 year old slave named Edmond Albius on the island of Réunion, who in 1841 figured out how to hand-pollinate the vanilla orchids. This discovery changed the game, and allowed global cultivation of the plant. With France the primary driver, leading to a number of former French colonies becoming the primary producers of vanilla, namely Madagascar and Réunion. Indonesia and a handful of other nations, Tahiti, Mexico and Tonga make up the remaining majority of the world's vanilla production. In fact today, Madagascar and Réunion produce somewhere between 70% and 80% of all vanilla in the world.

When the Spaniards in turn came and took the land from the Aztecs, vanilla was one of the first spices/ingredients to be brought home. Cortez was the European "discoverer" of vanilla, and he brought home a large supply of vanilla to the Spanish royal court. From there it spread quickly into the European palate, but only as an additive




