The luminary kits cost \$1 per kit in all quantities and include paper bags, candles and sand. Customers are encouraged to bring buckets, boxes or plastic bags to transport the sand. Payments can be made by cash, check or Venmo. Contact-less pickup will be available; customers can call the number listed on the whiteboard to place orders or pick up orders.

Luminaries are traditionally used to illuminate the streets on Christmas Eve. A candle is nestled in sand at the bottom of a paper bag and placed along sidewalks to create a beautiful walkway. The candles are then lit at dusk on Christmas Eve. Some neighborhoods in the area get together and buy hundreds of kits to create an amazing display.

All proceeds from the sale will be used to fund the various charitable and humanitarian projects that Rotary supports, both locally and internationally.

BLUE ENVELOPE POLICE PROGRAM FOR AUTISTIC RESIDENTS

The Blue Envelope Program is accessible to all Union County residents on the Autism Spectrum. Residents can obtain a Blue Envelope at their local police departments throughout the county.

The Blue Envelope Program introduces a simple yet effective tool that contains essential information for drivers with Autism Spectrum Disorder. This includes a copy of their driver's license, vehicle registration, insurance details, and an emergency contact card. Additionally, the envelope provides clear instructions to drivers on how to navigate a traffic stop and interact with law enforcement officers in a manner that promotes clarity and safety.

Key features of the Blue Envelope Program include:

- Specialized Training: Every officer in Union County, including local officers in all 21 municipalities, will undergo specialized training to develop a deeper understanding of Autism Spectrum Disorder and the best practices for engaging with individuals during traffic stops.
- Communication Facilitation: Drivers with Autism Spectrum Disorder can present the blue envelope to the officer upon being stopped, allowing officers to quickly recognize the situation and adapt their approach accordingly.
- Essential Information: The envelope includes guidance for officers to simplify requests and minimize the risk of misunderstandings or potential escalation. Additionally, officers are advised to contact the person listed on the emergency contact card for assistance if needed.
- Verbal or Nonverbal Indication: A checked-off box on the envelope indicates whether the driver is verbal or nonverbal, which aids officers in communicating effectively.

"Every single police department in Union County is proud to be a part of this initiative," said Elizabeth Police Chief Giacomo Sacca and President of the Union County Police Chief's Association. "Our officers have undergone thorough briefings and trainings to ensure they are well-versed in the proper protocols, and they are eager to put their training into action."

VETERANS KILLED IN WORLD WAR II AND KOREA TO BE HONORED

Scotch Plains Township

The Veterans Advisory Board is seeking family members to join in a December 16, 2023, ceremony to honor fallen heroes.

When Scotch Plains launched its Veterans Advisory Board in May 2022, one of its goals was to ensure every local veteran who lost his life in combat or is missing in action would receive special recognition.

There have been five "Gold Star" families / Fallen Heroes honored to date, with ceremonies held and street sign "toppers" placed where the fallen heroes had lived in Scotch Plains at the time of their enlistment.

The ceremonies include participation from Scotch Plains' elected officials and other dignitaries, local veterans and their families. The American Legion Post 209, based on Park Avenue, coordinates all aspects of the ceremony, providing an honor guard and rifle salute, in tribute. Then, township leaders and family members unveil the street sign toppers, featuring the name of the veteran. In addition, the Township Council issues a proclamation, honoring the fallen hero for their ultimate sacrifice in combat.

There are an estimated 15 more Gold Star families that need to be honored. But volunteers with the Veterans' Advisory Board say that is not an easy task. These veterans fought in World War I and II as well as the Korean conflict; many of their extended family members are deceased, unknown or have moved away from Scotch Plains decades ago.

Regardless, the Veterans Advisory Board in conjunction with American Legion Post 209 are planning to honor 10 at one time, asking the public for any information that may be available, as well as locating surviving relatives. The fallen heroes are to be honored with street signs during the Wreaths Across America event, set for 12 p.m. December 16, 2023, at the Scotch Plains Baptist Church and the hope is that relatives and friends can be in attendance.

The remaining five veterans are to be honored during Memorial Day events next year.

Kon Zoganas, chair of the Veterans Advisory



Board and a retired colonel in the U.S. Marines Corps, said: "It is becoming increasingly difficult to track down the information about these veterans and any remaining family relatives who can attend the ceremony."

Zoganas said the committee uses Ancestry.com and other online tools to find descendants. "We continue to look to honor any person or families who fit the guidelines," he added, noting the Veterans Advisory Board can be contacted through the Township's administrative offices, reaching Margaret Heisey at mheisey@scotchplainsnj.com, or 908-322-6700 ext 314.

Councilwoman Elizabeth Stamler, liaison to the Veterans Advisory Board, said Zoganas and other local veterans should be commended for their efforts to honor and remember fallen soldiers from wars that occurred generations ago. "Even though these heroes from our community died in battle some 80 years ago, their time for recognition is now," Stamler said. "They should remain an ever-present reminder of patriotism and their willingness to make the ultimate sacrifice in the name of freedom."

Mayor Josh Losardo added that the stories of these fallen soldiers should also serve as a learning tool for the youngest residents of Scotch Plains. "Our children should learn there are no real winners in war," the mayor said. "It should not be glorified, especially during these turbulent times. Instead, the brave men and women from Scotch Plains who served and sacrificed should be remembered for their courage, dedication and true love of country."

Initiated during World War I, the title "Gold Star" distinguishes a family member who lost a loved one in military service. Today, immediate family members (parent, sibling, spouse, or child) receive a Gold Star from the U.S. Department of Defense to honor those who made the ultimate sacrifice.

In a wide-ranging conversation, Ford covered what drew her to advocacy, her experiences and vast responsibilities at Inroads. Ford is dedicated to the success of each participant and noted that Inroads is one of the most diverse workplaces to be employed.

During National Autism Awareness Month, Inroads expands their already robust outreach to increase awareness for individuals with autism who are seeking employment. Ford mentions 45% of Inroads participants that transition from their school to work program are on the autism spectrum, but yet in the employment world 85% of people with autism and other disabilities are unemployed. This is a huge statistic and obstacle that Inroads seeks to turn around.

According to Ford, "Our participants bring such an enrichment to our setting...we really need employers to open their doors just for practice, just to let someone come in and try." Exposure is necessary for these prospective employees to have a better understanding of their work environment and the expectations of their potential job.

WESTFIELD ROTARY RECYCLES BICYCLES

The Rotary Club of Westfield collected 69 bicycles and 4 sewing machines to send to the developing world. The collection, held on Saturday, October 7, 2023, will be divided between Togo in West Africa, or Belize, in Central America.

This program was started by an American working with the Peace Corps in Ecuador. He noticed that a carpenter with a bicycle was a lot more productive than another carpenter who had to walk and carry his tools everywhere. This gave him the idea to start shipping used bikes to the third world. A bicycle will enable a person to get to work easier or produce more, if they run a small business. Children may be able to ride longer distances in order to attend school. When a person gets a sewing machine, they could start their own small business, and be able to support a family.

Bicycles will change an individual person's life for the better, plus many bikes will help raise the GDP of a country, bikes do not produce air pollution, and a shipment of 500 bikes creates jobs, since now the village will need a bike shop to do repairs, fix flats, and trade bikes. When the bikes arrive in the country, they are sold for a small amount to give them value. From the donations, road bikes go to countries with paved roads and mountain bikes go to countries with

dirt roads.

Americans purchase 50 million bikes per year, and dispose of 20 million perfectly good bikes in landfills every year.

The Westfield Rotary Club joined this program in 2007. Rotarian Warren Rorden has been the committee chair for 26 years. Warren states that we have collected over 2,500 bikes and 100 sewing machines in that time. The club works with a non-profit organization, Pedals For Progress, website p4p.org which collects and ships the bikes. We also ask for a monetary donation in addition to the bikes to help pay for shipping costs.

Twelve Rotarians came to the event to process the bikes, plus four more non-Rotarian volunteers, including a high school student Lydia Wright, and a High School Rotary Exchange student from France, Serena. People donating bikes came from all over: Westfield; Scotch Plains: Cranford; Randolph; and Sparta. One Rotarian brought 14 bikes.

The Rotary Club of Westfield meets the first three Tuesdays of each month for lunch at noon, at Limani Seafood Grill on North Ave. Guests are always welcome.
