#### Historic Preservation Commission

Westfield's Historic Preservation Commission (HPC) presented the 2023 Devlin Awards for outstanding efforts in King, Jr. Association and the Friends of Brightwood Park for preservation to a full house on Thursday night, November 2, in the Community Room of Town Hall. Over fifty attendees, including property owners, architects, builders, and guests, were on hand to recognize the eight commercial and residential winners and three honorary recipients. Commercial/Institutional properties recognized included Mimi & Hill Design Studio for their storefront at 150-152 E. Broad Street; St. Paul's Episcopal Church for their steeple restoration; and the Town of Westfield for the restored train station kiosk.

Residential property honorees included Lisa Colone and Curtis Tao for 100 W. Dudley Avenue (Sensitive Addition), Eric and Meredith Bridge for 601 Lenox Ave. (Restoration and Painting); Gregory and Shannon Crooks for 612 Elm Street and David Villane for 121 Effingham Place (Restoration and Addition), and Thomas and Christina Walsh for 256 W. Dudley

Ave. (New Construction Sensitive to the Area).

Special Achievement Awards went to the Dr. Martin Luther outstanding effort in raising awareness of historic properties linked to African-American residents, sites and events. Sherry Cronin, former executive director of the Downtown Westfield Corp., received the Chairman's Choice Award, the Commission's highest honor, for her longtime dedication to preserving the architectural heritage of the central business district.

"This was a great night for preservation," said HPC Chair Maria Boyes." While these awards may highlight the beautiful historic properties in this town, it's really about the people. The stories we hear as each recipient stands at that podium are priceless."

#### **MARCHING BLUE DEVILS FINISH SEASON STRONG**

Westfield Public Schools

The Westfield High School Marching Band wrapped up its 2023 season with impressive performances in back-to-back competitions.

The WHS Marching Blue Devils competed on October 29 in the New Jersey Marching Band Directors Association (NJMBDA) State Championships at The College of New Jersey (TCNJ), placing 2nd in Class AAAA for the 3rd consecutive year.

"The band won best music and had the 2nd highest score of the 35 bands attending state championships this year," noted band directors Christopher Vitale and Gabriel Batiz.

The WHS marching band also finished as one of only 2 high schools in New Jersey to be named a Bands of America Regional Finalist for the 6th time.

On October 28, in the Bands of America regional competition of top bands from New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Massachusetts, Virginia, and North Carolina, the WHS Marching Blue Devils placed 9th in the preliminary competition, before placing 7th in the evening finals performance at Rutgers University.

The previous weekend, the Marching Blue Devils earned several 1st place recognitions at an NJMBDA competition at East Brunswick High School

"The band won Class 4A, received awards for best overall music and best overall effect, and was named Grand Champion of the event, with the highest score of 14 attending bands with a score of 90.7," Vitale said.





## PROGRAM FOR AUTISTIC RESIDENTS

The Blue Envelope Program is accessible to all Union County residents on the Autism Spectrum. Residents can obtain a Blue Envelope at their local police departments throughout the county.


The Blue Envelope Program introduces a simple yet effective tool that contains essential information for drivers with Autism Spectrum Disorder. This includes a copy of their driver's license, vehicle registration, insurance details, and an emergency contact card. Additionally, the envelope provides clear instructions to drivers on how to navigate a traffic stop and interact with law enforcement officers in a manner that promotes clarity and safety.

Key features of the Blue Envelope Program include:

- Specialized Training: Every officer in Union County, including local officers in all 21 municipalities, will undergo specialized training to develop a deeper understanding of Autism Spectrum Disorder and the best practices for engaging with individuals during traffic stops.
- Communication Facilitation: Drivers with Autism Spectrum Disorder can present the blue envelope to the officer upon being stopped, allowing officers to quickly recognize the situation and adapt their approach accordingly.
- Essential Information: The envelope includes guidance for officers to simplify requests and minimize the risk of misunderstandings or potential escalation. Additionally, officers are advised to contact the person listed on the emergency contact card for assistance if needed
- Verbal or Nonverbal Indication: A checked-off box on the envelope indicates whether the driver is verbal or nonverbal, which aids officers in communicating effectively.

"Every single police department in Union County is proud to be a part of this initiative," said Elizabeth Police Chief Giacomo Sacca and President of the Union County Police Chief's Association. "Our officers have undergone thorough briefings and trainings to ensure they are well-versed in the proper protocols, and they are eager to put their training into action."





The Westfield Town Bell originally hung in the Prospect Street School from 1869 to 1921 where it also served as the town's fire bell. The bell rang at armistice and at the end of WW I. From 1922-1985, it hung in the Madison Avenue Presbyterian Chapel's steeple and subsequently became property of the Presbyterian Church which later donated it to the Westfield Historical Society. During 1993-1994, it was restored with funds raised by the Westfield Historical Society (with the help of Jack R. Panosh (Town Bellmaster), Ralph H. Jones (Town Historian) and Richard Edge, of the Westfield DPW) for the Westfield Bicentennial in 1994. It was originally made by Vickers Sons & Co. Limited, Sheffield

[England] in 1869 of cast steel.

For many years, the bell was displayed and rung during the Westfield Memorial Day parade and stored by the Westfield Historical Society. In 2019, a stone monument was erected by Alexander McGrail for his Eagle Scout Award project. The monument currently displays the bell on the grounds of the Reeve House. A roof and column structure has since been built by the Society to protect the bell for future generations to enjoy.





## KNITTING TOGETHER WHILE MAKING NEW FRIENDS

The Gates Avenue Knitters celebrated their 23-year anniversary in April. The group has been meeting at the Long Hill Township Library, located at 917 Valley Road, Gillette, every Monday from 1p.m. to 3 p.m. Everyone is welcome to join in.

In the month of April in the year 2000, Gates Avenue, Gillette resident Arlene Kaplan, started a knitting group along with 4 friends. Twenty-three years later the group, now called the Gates Avenue Knitters, are still knitting together, including 4 of the 5 original knitters who still live in town.

Eighteen to twenty ladies show up on any given meeting day. Their skills range from beginner to experienced knitters (and crocheters). They help each other get past problems with patterns, and they are excited and willing to teach beginners to knit.




