5TH ANNUAL IN-HOUSE ROBOTICS COMPETITION

Berkeley Heights Public Schools

Columbia Middle School recently held its 5th annual in-house robotics competition to determine the teams that would go on to represent the middle school at the regional qualifier event in mid-November. Five teams from CMS competed: The Tech Team, The Motor-Vators, The I Don't Knows, The Cyber Tigers and the Odd Ones Out. Chatham Middle School and Deerfield Middle School also joined the event in order to learn from one another and practice in a competitive setting prior to regionals.

Each team had to present a project to a panel of judges in which they identified a problem and designed a solution related to this year's theme, "using the arts and technology to communicate your passions to a wide audience". Teams also faced off during 3 rounds of robotics games in which they had to code their robot to autonomously navigate as many board challenges

the GL Robotics team were also in attendance to act as judges and referees. Coach Michael Maresca of the GL team took time to speak with the middle school students about the high school program and encouraged them to continue to participate in robotics in the future.

Earlier in the school year former CMS Science Teacher Tommy Clayton coordinated an event

In his new role as K-5 STEAM teacher he is very excited to help build a robotics program that extends over all the BHPS schools. LOOK BACK FROM THE FUTURE

Have you ever wondered what the house your parents grew up in looked like? What about the house where your grandparents lived? Was it a private house, an apartment in a city housing project, or an apartment above a store. Did they own or rent? Did they have a yard to play in or have a playground? Maybe there was an empty lot next door, or they played in the street. Was the building new or already old when they lived in it. Have you ever wondered? Do you think your children would wonder when they grow up, and would their children wonder?

The Historical Society of Berkeley Heights is starting off 2024 with a Look Back From The Future campaign to photograph every building in the Township as it looks today so your children and grandchildren, and people who will live in the town a century from now, will be able to see Berkeley Heights as you see it.

History does not stand still. Very little of Springfield Avenue looks today as it did at the turn of the century, only one generation ago. How many remember what the Kings Supermarket, the Berkeley Cinema and the Berkeley Plaza looked like? Or the Pizza Hut where the CVS now stands? How many remember the Auberge Swiss Restaurant? History starts anew every second, and if it is not recorded it is lost, one second at a time

The Look Back From The Future campaign is intended to record Berkeley Heights of today, before too many seconds go by. All that is requested is just one house photograph from each household. It can be a stark B&W documentary or colorful holiday decorated picture of your house. How would you want your grandchildren to see it? Of course, additional town photographs would be appreciated, but, if we received just one of each home by the end of the year, we would

STUDENTS PARTICIPATE IN THANKSGIVING TRADITION

Students at William Woodruff School enjoyed an annual tradition in advance of the Thanksgiving holiday.

The second grade "Woodruff's Thanksgiving Day Parade" was started at Woodruff in November of 2019. The activity begins with a read aloud of the book, 'Balloons Over Broadway: The True Story of The Puppeteer of Macy's Parade'. The students learn about Tony Sarg and the history and evolution of his role in designing puppets - then balloons - in the very first Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade.

Students then take a virtual tour of the workshop where the Macy's Parade balloons, floats, and balloonicles are created and

assembled. They then explore the balloon line-up for the current year's Macy's parade.

Then the real fun begins! Students design their own double-sided "balloon". "Balloons" are made from paper and are then stuffed with crumbled up newspaper so that they appear to be inflated.

On the Wednesday before Thanksgiving the kindergarten and first grade classes line the sides of the hallways and the second graders parade past them; proudly displaying their balloons above their heads. The parade spectators cheer and clap while marching band music plays over the school loudspeaker. The activity continues to be a favorite amongst the second-grade students!

The Coccia Foundation offers many opportunities to students and professionals of Italian Language and Cultural Studies. This annual contest aims to identify the achievements and impact of any one Italian or Italian American who has had a rich influence, nationally or locally, in any field.

According to Ms. Emilia Nuvola, Italian Teacher at CMS, "Italian students at CMS were encouraged to choose an individual that personally interested them and to exercise creative license (costumes, visuals, video editing, delivering the performance from first POV, etc.) for a compelling and engaging presentation."

In their announcement of Joe's successful first

place win, the Board of Trustees of The Coccia Foundation stated, 'The Board of Trustees was very impressed with his video presentation on Supreme Court Justice Antonin Scalia. There is something to be learned. Thank you for encouraging Joseph to submit a video and enter our Italian Heritage Contest.'

DOCUMENTING NJ'S REVOLUTIONARY WAR VETERANS

Elizabeth Snyder-Continental Chapter DAR

Two local women are helping create a new database of New Jersey Revolutionary War Soldiers. A project of the Daughters of the American Revolution (DAR), the database will be the most comprehensive produced to date utilizing a wide variety of sources.

"The hope is that this database will not only allow us to recognize and honor these veterans, but also help their descendants and researchers to learn about them," said DAR volunteer Holly Dunbar. Working on Somerset County, Dunbar has compiled information on more than 1,700 individuals to date.

Project volunteers aim to find and record as much information about each patriot as possible. This includes dates and locations of birth, enlistment, death and burial; service record with rank and unit, battles, if wounded, taken prisoner or killed; family with names of spouses, parents and children; and the sources of this information. A special effort is being made to include women, African Americans and Native Americans.

"We are starting with the current DAR database, but also using church records, county and local histories, surviving military and pension records, newspapers, and more," said Dunbar, who is a member of Elizabeth Snyder-Continental Chapter in Green Brook.

Another chapter member, Ruth Ryno, is working on Essex County, which also includes present-day Union and part of Passaic County. ""I look forward to helping prepare this database in honor of our New Jersey patriots as our country prepares to celebrate America's 250th anniversary in 2026." When the project is completed, the database will cover all of New Jersey and will be made available to the public.

DAR is a nonprofit nonpolitical service organization open to women 18 and older who can prove lineal descent from a patriot of the American Revolution. Elizabeth Snyder-Continental Chapter is based in Green Brook and serves areas in Somerset, Middlesex and Union counties. New members are welcome. 

SZABO AND GORKER EARN SILVER AWARDS

Girl Scouts are dedicated to making a lasting difference in their communities strengthening their leadership skills. Cecelia Szabo and Emerson Gorker, Berkeley Heights Girl Scouts from Troop 40950, recently earned the Girl Scout Silver Award, the highest recognition for achievement in Girl Scouting for Cadette level scouts. To earn this award, they individually dedicated over 50 hours to their

For Cecelia's Silver Award project, she created Children's Activity Theater Kits (CAT KITs) to provide a free and flexible option for younger children to explore the performing arts. Each CAT Kit includes a story book, color coded scripts that adapt the story book to a play, props to help put on a play, a parent letter to guide parents on how they can use the kit with their child(ren), and an activity card with warms ups and additional theater games/activities. The kits provide structure for parents who might not be used to or comfortable with dramatic arts but also allow for flexibility so they can be used in various ways for those who want the freedom to be creative. The kits are available to check out from the Berkeley Heights Library.

When asked about what she learned from doing the project, Cecelia stated, "One of the great things I learned is that kids do not need to be involved in a full show or acting class to experience the fun and benefits of acting. The kids who have used the kits had a positive experience and expressed interest in doing more acting. Working on my Silver Award also helped me improve my time management, flexibility, planning, and problem solving skills." She went on to say, "I hope the kits are enjoyed by children for years to come and give young kids the chance to experience some of the benefits of performing arts."

For their Silver Award project, Emerson chose to address the mistreatment of small mammal

pets and misinformation about what caring for small mammal pets really requires. To broadly share accurate information to people caring for or considering getting a small mammal pet, Emerson conducted in-depth research and then created a comprehensive but easy to navigate website on how to care for hamsters, guinea pigs, rabbits, and rats. In addition to educating pet store employees about the website and care guidance, flyers advertising the website and with a QR code to easily access it were hung in multiple pet stores so people looking to purchase small mammal pets could access the resource.

In reflecting on the experience, Emerson noted, "I learned how to build a website, how to make a brand attractive with an interesting name so people would be inclined to actually use the site, how to research projects, how to talk to management and have the confidence to do that, and how small mammal pets need to be cared for." When asked about their hope for the website, Emerson responded, "Many people want to treat small pets right, but do not know how to,


