# **FOSTER YOUTH JOIN FOREVER FAMILIES AT ADOPTION DAY**

CASA of Passaic and Union Counties

On a recent fall morning, five youth ranging from three to 10 years old entered the courtrooms of Superior Court Judges Gavin Handwerker, Paul Nieves and Chanel Hudson as foster youth and, shortly after, emerged as official members of their new families.

Adoption Day is eagerly anticipated by many at Union County's Family Court, as ample smiles fill the courthouse – a juxtaposition to the daily navigation of complex issues fraught with loss or discord. This year, county dignitaries presented

families with proclamations and certificates, and festivities included performances by 30 high school students from Elizabeth's Thomas Jefferson Arts Academy A Cappella Choir; a former foster youth sharing her personal journey and adoption story; a roaming balloon artist; sheriff's officers dressed as superheroes and a Batmobile outside for visiting; furry greetings from Kenilworth's David Brearley Middle High School mascot bear; personalized cupcakes; and ice cream, face painting, and friendship-bracelet making stations.

CASA of Passaic and Union Counties presented family fun-themed gift baskets made possible in part from donations by David Brearley Bears That Care program and the Union County Bar Association. Baskets were given to all those finalizing on Adoption Day, as well as several families who adopted earlier in the year.

Cynthia Evans of Scotch Plains was among the CASA volunteers to attend the ceremonies for their assigned children. "The day was a long time

coming for these sisters, and it was amazing," she said. "I've been their advocate since 2020. Between their adoptive families and all involved, embraces and cheers were aplenty. My time as their CASA volunteer was both rewarding and challenging. I'm thankful I could help ensure their needs were met and services were provided while in care."

Adoption Day is a national movement to raise awareness of children in foster care. Since its inception 23 years ago, nearly 60,000 children have found permanency. More than 437,000 youth in the United States are currently in the child welfare system awaiting a permanent home, and the average wait is four years. For more than 23,000 youth, that doesn't happen, and they age out of the system, facing life on their own.





# \$75M IN PROJECTS OF WHICH STATE PAYS \$19.6M

Cranford Public Schools has strategically planned for its bond referendum by proposing *must-needed* projects that qualify for *state aid to cover 26%* of the \$75 million in project costs.

If voters approve the bond referendum, the owner of a home assessed at Cranford Township's average of \$185,824 would see an estimated impact of approximately *\$34 per month* in school debt taxes.





Beyond the fashion show, an additional twenty WSL volunteers set up a boutique on the premises where items such as jewelry, toys, scarves, handbags, hats and gloves, and holiday décor were purchased. Almost all items were \$5.00 or less. Barbara Cantor and Patti Tata cochair this part of the event and work with the volunteers to sell the merchandise.

"This event is wonderful on so many levels. The seniors have fun, they can buy holiday gifts for their families and something for themselves, and we raise money for the non-profits that the WSL supports," said Barbara Cantor.

"This year, there was a special treat for the seniors. Each senior attendee received a gift — a Swarovski crystal bracelet — courtesy of Martin Jewelers in Cranford," said Patti Tata.

"A huge thank you to Martin Jewelers for the gifts they provided to the residents," said Cindy Rabinowitz, Executive Director, Cranford Senior Housing praised the WSL. "I am so grateful to the Westfield Service League for having their fashion show here for the fourth year. It gives residents a joyous afternoon of camaraderie and seeing beautiful fashion."

The WSL Thrift & Consignment Shop is located at 114 Elmer Street in Westfield. All proceeds from the fashion show, the boutique, and the shops are given out in grants to local non-profits that the WSL supports. Last year, the WSL donated \$70,000 to 29 organizations.








# SANTA DELIVERS THOUSANDS OF EARLY SMILES ACROSS CRANFORD

Santa Claus came early to Cranford again this year by way of the Cranford Jaycees' Santa Deliveries and Toy Drive. Over the course of two nights, Santa made stops at almost 1,000 homes to deliver a total of 2,339 presents, both records, often escorted by flashing lights from a Cranford Police or Fire Department vehicle and a team of elves.

The visits were part of an annual toy collection drive where parents donate a present for families in need throughout the region. The parents can then have a wrapped present delivered by Santa to their home on a weekend night. The drive netted almost 3,000 toys, filling two U-Haul trucks, that were distributed to Cranford residents and several local organizations: Cranford Family Care, the New Jersey Community Development Corporation in Paterson, and Union County Social Services.

The program is a longtime Cranford tradition

that has nearly doubled in size in recent years. More than 60 Jaycee members volunteer to support the event, from organizing presents by region and loading delivery cars to planning traffic routes and suiting up as Santa Claus. Eight teams, each with a Santa and elf helpers, delivered the presents each night.

The Jaycees credit the Cranford Police & Fire Departments and the Cranford Police Auxiliary for their support with this year's deliveries, as well as Steve Robertazzi from the Cranford Recreation and Parks Department for the use of the Community Center as the staging location.

"Every year it's a massive undertaking, but it's also our favorite event to see the joy when Santa pulls up to the houses," said Mike Bond, who cochairs the event for the Jaycees with Cameron Andre. "We thank all the people who donated toys so we can spread that joy across our community and give more families a happy holiday."



# **IMAGINE, A CENTER FOR COPING WITH LOSS**

As the staff at Imagine prepared to launch a new program year in September, it quickly became evident that the demand for Imagine's grief support groups had grown. Imagine began its new program year offering three in-person Nights of Support at their Mountainside location, one Night of Support at their Newark location and a virtual option. Though each Night of Support (NOS) can accommodate up to 60 families, it became clear that a new night was needed to support all of the new families that had reached out to Imagine seeking support following the death of someone close to them.

The first step in launching a new NOS is to train new volunteers to facilitate each support group. Imagine held a training session November 3-5th, training 10 new facilitators for the new NOS that will meet on alternate Mondays beginning in November. The ten new facilitators were joined by new Imagine staff who participated in the training as well.

In addition to the story sharing and support for one another that's part of Imagine's training, the group had an opportunity to gain knowledge and skills regarding Alan Wolfelt's Companioning Model for grief support that's practiced at Imagine. Many of the participants in Imagine's training program find the training experience to be meaningful and life changing. One participant shared: "The training was truly amazing and inspiring. I am so honored to have had the opportunity to participate in it." Another said: "The Imagine Staff are amazing. I so appreciate all the knowledge they shared and the encouragement they gave to me and the other participants." The staff at Imagine are so pleased to welcome this new group to their wonderful team of volunteers!

Imagine has been providing free peer support groups for children and families for over 10 years and relies on both the generosity of volunteer facilitators who donate their time, and the generosity of donors who help fund Imagine's programs. 
