

NEW DIRECTOR, ADULT LIBRARIAN FOR 2024

Long Hill Township Library has appointed Albie Ashbrook as its next director, effective in 2024.

Ashbrook, who currently serves as the library's adult services librarian and assistant director, has worked in New Jersey libraries since 2019, when she received her library degree from Rutgers University. She previously worked in the international development field, leading field offices in Ukraine and Romania, and later worked in international school libraries in Hong Kong and Munich.

"We want Long Hill Township Library to continue to be the go-to place in the community for adults and kids looking to read, learn, and play," Ashbrook said of her plans for the library in the year ahead. "We aim to provide a space where everyone is welcome to grow as readers, people, and community members."

Current library director Marygrace Luderitz will retire at the end of 2023. Luderitz has worked at Long Hill Township Library since 2011, serving as adult services librarian, assistant director, and interim director on multiple occasions before becoming the permanent director in February 2021.

Luderitz supervised the library's reopening during the global pandemic and oversaw a makeover project that included repainting the library, reupholstering chairs, and adding patio furniture to the library's exterior.

"I have loved working alongside Marygrace over the past few years," said Ashbrook, praising Luderitz for bringing her "unique blend of fun and function" to the library during her tenure as director.

"She and I have had fun brainstorming new activities, like mini-golf, scavenger hunts, and story walks," Ashbrook continued. "She showed me that a library doesn't have to be too serious to do serious work."

Luderitz said she can't wait to see what Ashbrook does in the position.

Suzanne Kosempel will replace Ashbook as Long Hill's new adult services and community engagement librarian. Kosempel joins the library after seven years at Raritan Valley Community College working as an academic librarian.

"Suzanne's librarian experience at the college level will benefit all of us, especially our teen and young adult patrons," said Ashbrook.

Kosempel was previously a marketing specialist at Prudential. She has also served on the Library's Library Board of Trustees for seven years, most recently as its president, and is the secretary of the Long Hill Community Center Board of Directors.

She called joining Long Hill Township Library in her new role a "full circle moment," having worked at the library at its previous location in Stirling when she was in high school. "I am a strong believer in the power of libraries to enrich our lives and open our minds, and I look forward to serving the Long Hill community."

In addition to offering books, audiobooks, movies, and even ukuleles for patrons to borrow, the library hosts a diverse array of children's and adult programming and will continue to do so in 2024. These programs include book groups, kids' story times, technology help, arts and crafts, language groups, dance and meditation classes, and author talks, as well as special events such as dinosaur parades and parties featuring a chocolate fountain.

"We look forward to welcoming familiar faces and new patrons in the next year," said Ashbrook. "And to breaking out our chocolate fountain again soon."

WHO PAYS FOR THE EVENTS?





NJ MOM CELEBRATING 10-YEAR ANNIVERSARY OF LIVER TRANSPLANT

Renee Reilly, a resident of Madison, NJ, is celebrating an incredible milestone as she marks the 10-year anniversary of her life-saving liver transplant. Renee, 52, has not only cherished every moment of her life since her successful transplant but is also passionate about advocating

for NJ Sharing Network, the nonprofit organization responsible for the recovery and placement of donated organs and tissue for transplant in the Garden State. She actively shares her story with others to encourage more people to register as organ and tissue donors.

"I continue to feel overwhelmed, humble, and grateful," said Renee. "Giving someone a second chance as an organ and tissue donor is such a special and amazing gift of love."

Renee's journey began when she was 16 years old and was diagnosed with Polycystic Kidney Disease (PKD). Her father, who also battled PKD, had received a life-saving kidney transplant that gave him an additional 35 years of life. Renee later developed Polycystic Liver Disease (PLD) after giving birth to her two boys. She was added to the liver transplant list in 2009.

"Waiting for the liver transplant phone call, I felt hopeless at times, tired, anxious, and I didn't think I would ever get 'the call," said Renee.

The pivotal moment in Renee's journey arrived unexpectedly on a day filled with emotional turmoil. Her father had been in the hospital for weeks due to complications from a previous surgery. Renee had just visited him when she received 'The Call' from the transplant center.

"I began to cry because I was filled with emotions, from joy and excitement to worry about my family and guilt about receiving such a precious gift. But my husband, John, and my sons, Ian and Brendan, served as a source of

strength and kept me focused because they were excited to know that I was going to get a liver transplant," said Renee.

On August 6, 2013, Renee's liver transplant surgery was a success, giving her a new lease on life. In 2017, Renee's kidneys started to fail. Fortunately, she received a kidney transplant in 2018, sparing her from the hardships of dialysis treatments.

The transformation in Renee's life posttransplants has been remarkable. She now enjoys all of her favorite hobbies, including gardening, knitting/crocheting, sewing, and spending time with her family.

"Thanks to my organ donors and the miracle of transplantation, I have been there for unforgettable moments like my boys' graduations. I am now able to give hugs again without any pain due to my enlarged liver," said Renee. "Now, I am focused on sharing my story to give hope for those waiting for the gift of life and inspire everyone to register as organ and tissue donors.

According to United Network for Organ Sharing (UNOS), there are over 100,000 Americans – nearly 4,000 of whom live in New Jersey – waiting for a life-saving transplant. One organ and tissue donor can save eight lives and enhance the lives of over 75 others. IMAGINE, A CENTER FOR COPING WITH LOSS

As the staff at Imagine prepared to launch a new program year in September, it quickly became evident that the demand for Imagine's grief support groups had grown. Imagine began its new program year offering three in-person Nights of Support at their Mountainside location, one Night of Support at their Newark location and a virtual option. Though each Night of Support (NOS) can accommodate up to 60 families, it became clear that a new night was needed to support all of the new families that had reached out to Imagine seeking support following the death of someone close to them.

The first step in launching a new NOS is to train new volunteers to facilitate each support group. Imagine held a training session November 3-5th, training 10 new facilitators for the new NOS that will meet on alternate Mondays beginning in November. The ten new facilitators were joined by new Imagine staff who participated in the training as well.

In addition to the story sharing and support for one another that's part of Imagine's training, the group had an opportunity to gain knowledge and skills regarding Alan Wolfelt's Companioning Model for grief support that's practiced at Imagine. Many of the participants in Imagine's training program find the training experience to be meaningful and life changing. One participant

shared: "The training was truly amazing and inspiring. I am so honored to have had the opportunity to participate in it." Another said: "The Imagine Staff are amazing.
