From October 2, 2023, through October 6, 2023, students and staff from Angelo L. Tomaso (ALT) School, Central School (CS), Mt. Horeb School (MHS), Warren Middle School (WMS), and Woodland School (WS) participated in the annual tradition of The Week of Respect in coordination with the Anti-Bullving Bill of Rights Act-the daily activities recognize the importance of creating a safe and respectful learning environment.

The students and staff are encouraged to participate in spirit days to illustrate the meaning of the Week of Respect.

Monday, October 2 - Week of Respect Kick Off, "We All Belong." Students and staff were encouraged to wear their school colors.

Tuesday, October 3 - Put Conflict to Bed -Students and staff dressed in their favorite

Wednesday, October 4 - Team up for Inclusion - Students and staff sported a jersey from their favorite team.

Thursday, October 5 - Superhero Day - Help your friends respect others. Students and staff were invited to wear Superhero costumes.

Friday, October 6 - Being a Friend is No Sweat - Students and staff were invited to wear athletic attire.

In addition to the daily themes, the School Counselors, Mrs. Kelly Blessings-Maire (ALT), Ms. Alyssa Pech (CS), Dr. Kelly Stankiewicz (MH), Mrs. Lauren Systo (WMS), Mrs. Helen Scully (WMS), Ms. Jenna Rotella (WMS), and Mrs. Alexandra McWilliams (WS) planned special lessons and activities to emphasize the importance of students respecting their families, friends, community, school, and most importantly, themselves. The lessons are part of the district's character education curriculum and focus on the district's initiative to encourage a sense of belonging.

Pech met with a class of grade three Central School students on the afternoon of Wednesday, October 5, to discuss conflict resolution and the definition of bullying. The students gathered comfortably on the classroom carpet, eager to participate in a special lesson. To begin with, Pech asked the students to raise their hands and give examples of what they perceived to be bullying behavior.

Pech then shared a short video with the students that defined bullying as unwanted, aggressive behavior among school-aged children that involves a real or perceived power imbalance. The behavior is repeated or has the potential to be repeated over time.

Pech paused the video to help the students

break down the definition by acting out scenarios with the group of children. The video went on to help clearly define bullying by using the BOO acronym. The B stands for 'Being Mean'. The video explained the difference between friendly teasing and the harmful effects of bullying. The O stands for 'On Purpose'. The students learned that mistakes can be made, but what matters most is what we do about it. If someone is intentionally being mean without taking ownership and changing their behavior, that can be a form of bullying. The second O stands for 'Over and Over again.' The message that the students received is bullying behavior is being mean, on purpose, over and over again.

McWilliams, Woodland School Counselor, is working with all students to create a school-wide puzzle focusing on unity, kindness, belonging, and inclusion. Each child will decorate their puzzle piece, and McWilliams will put the puzzle together and display it in the coming weeks.

According to McWilliams, although the week of events has ended, lessons learned will be reinforced throughout the school year. "During the Week of Respect, students and staff members participated in engaging theme days and activities that promoted a sense of belonging, kindness, and inclusion. Students learned to demonstrate respect towards their peers, families, school, and community, which is part of ongoing efforts to promote a positive school climate and culture."

All Warren elementary schools will participate in "A Week of Making Good Choices" during the week of October 23 in recognition of School Violence Awareness and National Red Ribbon Week. Students will be encouraged to make healthy choices for their minds and bodies and strengthen social connections.

## **ALISHA LI EARNS NORTHEAST FENCING CONFERENCE ALL-STARS RECOGNITION**

Westley College Fencing

The Northeast Fencing Conference (NFC) announced its Conference All-Stars in the varsity division for the 2023-24 season following the conclusion of the NFC Conference Meet held recently. Wellesley College fencing sophomore Grace Xu (Toronto, Ontario) was named to First Team in epee, first year Phoebe Li (Palo Alto, Calif.) made the First Team in foil, and first year Alisha Li (Warren, N.J.) earned Second Team honors in epee.

Xu put together a 15-3 (83.33%) NFC Conference fencing record this season with the highest winning percentage of any individual in epee. Xu's highlights included going 6-0 against Division I Brown and Boston College, and four total wins against Division III ranked Brandeis and Tufts. Xu was previously named to the NFC Conference All-Stars Second Team for the 2022-23 season.

Phoebe Li went 14-4 (77.78%) in NFC competition to earn First Team status in foil. P. Li had 3-0 shutouts of Brandeis, Sacred Heart, and Vassar, while earning two wins against Tufts and Boston College.

Alisha Li made the Second Team in epee with a 14-5 (73.68%) record at the NFC meet. Alisha Li swept Tufts 3-0, and had a pair of wins against Boston College, Sacred Heart, and Vassar. Alisha Li earned at least one victory in all eight matches for the Blue.

Founded in 1992, the Northeast Fencing Conference's mission is to support intercollegiate fencing in and around New England. The league organizes a round-robin schedule of dual meet competitions for the fencing programs at all member institutions. The member institutions are a mix of both NCAA varsity programs and student-organized club programs.

## **LT. ROBERT FERREIRO NEXT CHIEF OF POLICE**

#### Warren Township

As the result of a selection process conducted on October 24, 2023, the Warren Township Committee selected Lt. Robert Ferreiro as the next Chief of the Warren Township Police Department (WTPD).

Lt. Ferreiro will replace Chief William Keane who will be retiring on December 31, 2023. He was one of three Lieutenants and a Captain who participated in the selection process authorized by Resolution 2023-227.

Lt. Ferreiro has served the WTPD since January 2007, having graduated from the Somerset County Police Academy in December 2006. He has had an impressive career in law enforcement that includes serving in the following positions in the Warren Township Police Department: Patrol Sergeant, Operations Lieutenant, along with Deputy Coordinator, and then Coordinator, of the Warren Office of Emergency Management, and President of the Warren Township PBA 235. Additionally, Ferreiro has worked as a Task Force Officer on an FBI Task Force and conducts training for law enforcement officers at conferences throughout North America on a wide range of law enforcement topics.

Mayor Gary DiNardo stated that, "The Township is fortunate to have such talented officers in police administration from which to select our future Chief, and I look forward to

working with Robert Ferreiro as he assumes the ensuring that the Warren Police Department is mantle of leadership."

Lt. Ferreiro's vision as Chief, as presented to the Township Committee during this process, is to implement the Warren Police Department's "FIRST" plan that he described as representing the following values: Family, Innovation, Respect, Resiliency, Standards and Trust in Teams. His plan will include improving recruitment of future officers in order to respond to Warren's development, ensuring a healthy environment for officers, collaborating with other law enforcement agencies, institution of an alumni officer, a peer-to-peer program, and development and implementation of a strategic plan for the Department.

Committeeman and Police Liaison Victor Sordillo commented that "Robert Ferreiro has the skills, experience, and vision to lead the WTPD into the future and will carry on the tradition of

the finest Police Department in the State of New Jersey.

Lt. Ferreiro stated, "I am beyond thankful for being trusted to serve as the next Chief of Police. and I want to offer my commitment that Warren PD will remain ever vigilant to providing a service based in both pride and professionalism."

He further stated, "I am proud to be the first Hispanic Chief of the WTPD. With a sense of eager anticipation, I again wish to express my gratitude and display my desire to start on this journey!"

Robert Ferreiro is a resident of Warren Township where he resides with his wife and daughter. He will assume office on December 31, 2023. The Township Committee will determine salary and other contract conditions prior to Ferreiro assuming the duties of Police Chief.

## **CERT VOLUNTEERS COMPLETE BASIC TRAINING**

Somerset County

Somerset County's Office of Emergency Management graduated 21 local residents from their Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) Basic Training program. These volunteers spent twenty-six hours over the month of October learning how to support their community and first-responders when disasters strike through a coordinated, team effort at the municipal or county level.

"We've seen over the last decade and more how important CERT teams are to disaster response in Somerset County," said Somerset County Deputy Director Doug Singleterry, liaison to the Office of Emergency Management. "The people of Somerset County owe a debt to these volunteers who have committed through training and joining their local and County CERT team to be there when needed for their family, neighbors, and community."

October's CERT class included residents of Somerset, Hillsborough, Warren, Branchburg, Franklin, Franklin Park, Raritan, Bridgewater, Flemington and Gladstone.

Following their month of training in Disaster Preparedness, CERT Organization, Light Search and Rescue, Disaster Psychology, Terrorism, Fire Medical Operations, Safety, Sheltering Operations, and Stop the Bleed each participant

must complete a written exam and practical exercise to graduate. The CERT members conducted cribbing exercises during their final practical exercise along with a search and rescue simulation.

Local CERT programs train and organize teams of volunteers to assist their families, neighbors, co-workers, and other community members during emergencies when professional responders may not be immediately available to provide assistance.

Before, during, and after disasters, CERT volunteer teams perform basic response activities, including checking in on neighbors, distribution of information to the public, supporting emergency operations centers, and helping to manage traffic and crowds. The deployment of CERT volunteers to perform these activities frees up professional responders to focus efforts on more complex, essential, and often life-saving tasks. CERT volunteers also support their communities by organizing, promoting, and participating in emergency preparedness events, activities, and projects.
