

On a recent fall morning, five youth ranging from three to 10 years

old entered the courtrooms of Superior Court Judges Gavin Handwerker, Paul Nieves and Chanel Hudson as foster youth and, shortly after, emerged as official members of their new families.

Adoption Day is eagerly anticipated by many at Union County's Family Court, as ample smiles fill the courthouse – a juxtaposition to the daily navigation of complex issues fraught with loss or discord. This year, county dignitaries presented families with proclamations and certificates, and festivities included performances by 30 high school students from Elizabeth's Thomas Jefferson Arts Academy A Cappella Choir; a former foster youth sharing her personal journey and adoption story; a roaming balloon artist; sheriff's officers dressed as superheroes and a Batmobile outside for visiting; furry greetings from Kenilworth's David Brearley Middle High School mascot bear; personalized cupcakes; and ice cream, face painting, and friendship-bracelet making stations.

CASA of Passaic and Union Counties presented family fun-themed gift baskets made possible in part from donations by David Brearley Bears That Care program and the Union County Bar Association. Baskets were given to all those finalizing on Adoption Day, as well as several families who adopted earlier in the year.

Cynthia Evans of Scotch Plains was among the CASA volunteers to attend the ceremonies for their assigned children. "The day was a long

time coming for these sisters, and it was amazing," she said. "I've been their advocate since 2020. Between their adoptive families and all involved, embraces and cheers were aplenty. My time as their CASA volunteer was both rewarding and challenging. I'm thankful I could help ensure their needs were met and services were provided while in care."

Adoption Day is a national movement to raise awareness of children in foster care. Since its inception 23 years ago, nearly 60,000 children have found permanency. More than 437,000 youth in the United States are currently in the child welfare system awaiting a permanent home, and the average wait is four years. For more than 23,000 youth, that doesn't happen, and they age out of the system, facing life on their own.

Atlantic") distributed \$50,000 in grant funding to five local nonprofit organizations through the Federal Home Loan Bank of New York Small Business Recovery Grant Program ("SBRG"). The SBRG is designed to support the financial security and health of organizations that have faced economic challenges due to the rate environment, inflation, supply-chain constraints, and/or rising energy costs.

The SBRG began in 2017 in response to hurricanes in Puerto Rico and the U.S. Virgin Islands. The Program relaunched in 2020 and was made available again in 2021 to aid small businesses and nonprofit organizations facing challenges due to the Coronavirus pandemic. By participating in the SBRG this year, The Atlantic was able to grant \$10,000 each to Bianca F.L.O.W.E.R.S. Inc. in Plainfield, Jewish Family Service of Central New Jersey, Mobile Meals of Westfield, St. Joseph Social Service Center in Elizabeth, and The SHARE Alliance in Springfield.

"Thank you to the Federal Home Loan Bank of New York for their partnership and the opportunity to extend recovery grants within the communities we serve," shared The Atlantic Federal Credit Union Chief Executive Officer Anthony Mero. "The SBRG funding will help our deserving recipients continue their selfless work throughout Essex and Union counties ensuring community members in need have crucial resources through the holiday season and beyond."



THE HISTORY OF THE WESTFIELD AREA YMCA

Marla Itzkin, the Associate Director for Communications and Development of the Westfield Area YMCA, recently spoke to the Rotary Club of Westfield about the history of the • 1993 Weldon Room added YMCA in Westfield over the past 100 years.

The Rotary Club of Westfield was 3 years old when the YMCA Board decided to build the structure on Clark Street. The Rotary Club helped raise the funds to build the YMCA and met there for probably about 80 years. The Rotary Club has a close relationship to the YMCA and provides community grants to them every year.

The service area for the Westfield Area YMCA includes Westfield. Garwood, Mountainside and Cranford. They are currently developing a Cranford YMCA. No one with financial hardship is turned away due to inability to pay. The Y strengthens our community through 3 areas of impact: youth development; healthy living; and social responsibility.

Here are some highlights of the history of the Westfield Area YMCA.

- 1921 Rotary Club of Westfield established
- 1923 Established the YMCA Board of Director and Trustees.
- 1924 Acquired the land on Clark Street for \$18,000.
- 1929 New building is dedicated with a pool and bowling alley
- 1930 YWCA established for women and girls
- 1931 Bowling League is formed
- 1943 Most numbers and staff are serving in the Military, the building relied on part time help of teachers and salesmen
- 1947 Y's Men club first annual Christmas Tree Sale
- 1950 Day Camp begins
- 1960 Wallace Pool opens
- 1965 Bill Bradley dedicates gymnasium
- 1970 Y offers dog obedience classes • 1973 50th annual Dinner held at
- Shackamaxon Country Club • 1975 First woman joins the Board of Directors
- 1982 First preschool opens


The first Y appeared in London in 1844, when a farmer started a place for young men to seek escape from pressing social challenges. The first American Y was established in 1851 at the Old South Church in Boston. Then YMCAs sprang

up all over the country. Now the YMCA serves 2 million people in the United States, and 65 million in 120 countries.

The Y has many firsts: the invention of Basketball in 1891; Volleyball in 1895; Racquetball in 1950; Hallmark cards; the Negro Baseball League; Father's Day; Night School; Adult Education; and Work- Study programs. The YMCA and YWCA helped start the USO in WWII.

In 1946 the Nobl Peace Prize was awarded jointly to John Mott, a leader of the Y movement in America, for increasing global understanding and humanitarian efforts.

"This event is wonderful on so many levels. The seniors have fun, they can buy holiday gifts for their families and something for themselves, and we raise money for the non-profits that the WSL supports," said Barbara Cantor.

"This year, there was a special treat for the seniors. Each senior attendee received a gift a Swarovski crystal bracelet - courtesy of Martin Jewelers in Cranford," said Patti Tata.

"A huge thank you to Martin Jewelers for the gifts they provided to the residents," said Cindy Rabinowitz, Executive Director, Cranford Senior Housing praised the WSL. 

community, The Woman's Club of Westfield is passing on their legacy to the Rotary Club of Westfield to continue their longstanding scholarship program.

The Woman's Club of Westfield started in 1895 with 40 women members. Miss Emma Bridges was the first president. In 1896, the Club joined the New Jersey State Federation of Woman's Clubs and the General Federation of Woman's Clubs. They purchased a building in Westfield on Euclid Avenue for their meetings in the 1950's but sold it in the 1990's as membership began to decline.

Financial Advisor Jayson Astel of Edward Jones, and Rotary Club Secretary Dr. D. Michael Hart met with the club members in the Spring of 2023. Michael brought his 97-year-old mother, Dr. Marilyn Hart to the meeting. She had received a scholarship from the Westfield Woman's Club in 1962, which changed her life. Marilyn was valedictorian of her high school class, but back in the 1940's very few people went to college, and even fewer women. Marilyn started night school, while working during the day and raising 3 children, and eventually earned a Ph.D., becoming a college professor at Kean University, teaching

After more than 125 years of service to the Educational Psychology. This is an illustration of how scholarships can change people's lives for the better.

> The Westfield Woman's Club transferred a substantial portion of their assets to the Rotary which will fund six \$5,000 college scholarships to Westfield High School women students every year, in perpetuity. In addition, grants will be offered to five specific charities every year as outlined in the agreement with the Woman's Club. The scholarships and grants will be administered through the Westfield Rotary Club Foundation, a 501(c)(3) organization. Westfield High School students apply for scholarships through the Guidance Department.

> The Rotary Club of Westfield and its Foundation, which was started in 1921, has awarded \$3.5 million in scholarships to 1,800 students to date. The Club's signature scholarship fundraising event, Breakfast With the Bands is scheduled for Saturday, March 2, 9 a.m. to noon.
