FLAG CONTINUES TO DELIVER COMMUNTIY SERVICE

FLAG of MSH (Front Line Appreciation Group of Millburn Short Hills) started as a pandemic initiative and has since grown to new heights as it continues to secure government funded grants to help so many local Millburn restaurants and food pantries. As of this writing FLAG of MSH has contributed \$643,000 to Millburn businesses.

FLAG of MSH was founded in April 2020 by the Cross and D'Souza families of Short Hills to engage the support of the local community and recognize front line workers for their efforts during the pandemic. Initially, all funding came from the generous donations of township residents and fundraising initiatives. In a few months over \$92,000 was raised that helped provide almost 10,000 meals to hospital front line workers who put their own lives at risk to help those affected during the pandemic.

Over 15 Millburn restaurants have been beneficiaries of FLAG of MSH efforts; Saigon Cafe, Cara Mia, Mariachi, Oscar's Deli, Moonshine Supper club, Rock n Joes, Vinnies Pan Pizza, Thai House, Basilicos, Brooklyn Pizza, La Strada, Playa Bowls, Goldbergs & Ms. Lin amongst others.

In addition to hospitals, FLAG fueled local organizations with hot meals including the Millburn Police Force, Millburn Short Hills Volunteer First Aid Squad, Millburn Fire Department, the Department of Public Works, the Department of Education and the teachers of Millburn Schools.

Noticing that the local restaurants still needed help, FLAG of MSH applied for the New Jersey Economic Development Association (NJEDA) Sustain and Serve Grants. Over the last 2 years FLAG of MSH received an additional \$553,480 in grant funding enabling the organization to source and deliver over 60,000 meals since inception. In total FLAG of MSH has channeled \$643,000 to help support Millburn businesses.

With this additional funding and through partnerships with MEND (Meeting Each Need with Dignity) and Table to Table Food Rescue,





FLAG of MSH has been able to support food pantries, reaching many communities and individuals with food insecurities.

True to its mission, FLAG of MSH continues to seek ways to support the Millburn Short Hills business community and food pantries. FLAG is spearheaded by Nina D'Souza, President; Kyle D'Souza, Logistics & Fund Raising and Aiden D'Souza, Database Administrator. FLAG has successfully completed 3 years of service and is going strong.

MILLBURN CHESS PLAYERS BRING HOME NATIONAL TITLE

Congratulations to four chess players representing Millburn Middle School (MMS) who have once again won the National K-12 Grade Chess Team Championship held in Orlando, Florida in December, 2023.

A record-breaking number of almost 2,500 of the nation's best scholastic chess players from 45 states competed in the largest and most important chess event from December 15th to 17th.

Four MMS 7th graders, Bobby Qian, Ryan Zhu, David Zhang, and Raymond Wang went through seven rounds of intensive competitions in three days. As a team, they defeated 29 other teams from across the country and won the 7th Grade National Team Championship trophy for Millburn Middle School!

In addition, Bobby Qian won the 7th Grade National Co-Championship with the highest tournament score of 6/7! Ryan Zhu and David Zhang both achieved the 2nd highest score of 5.5/7 among all 7th grade chess players.

It is worth noting that this is the FOURTH National team championship trophy these chess players have brought back to Millburn. They have won the 5th and the 6th Grade National Chess Team Championships in previous years and the National Middle School Chess Championship in April.

experience: "The training was truly amazing and inspiring. I am so honored to have had the opportunity to participate in it." Another shared: "The Imagine Staff are amazing. I so appreciate all the knowledge they shared and the encouragement they gave to me and the other participants."

Participants in Imagine's training programs often describe the experience as "life-changing". In addition to story sharing and the opportunity to support one another, training participants gain knowledge and skills regarding Alan Wolfelt's Companioning Model for grief support that's practiced at Imagine. Participants often walk away with a new understanding of themselves, and a new capacity for supporting the people in their lives. They bring this understanding to their role as facilitators in Imagine's peer support group program where children, youth, young adults and adults come together to share their grief experiences and receive and give support.

Imagine's volunteer facilitators come from all walks of life and no special background is required other than a willingness to listen, a heart inclined to serve, and the ability to be with children and adults in grief without trying to fix, solve or give advice. No prior experience is necessary. Volunteers must be 18 years or older. Bilingual (Spanish speaking) volunteers are needed as well. Volunteers serve as companions and loving listeners for those who are grieving and help create a space where participants can share tears and embrace the joys of life.

If you'd like to join us for Imagine's next facilitator training, it will be held Saturday, Feb. 17th through Monday, February 19th from 9 am-5 pm each day at Imagine's Newark Center at 570 Broad Street in Newark, and we ask that our new volunteers attend the entire training. Our new Newark center is located downtown in the Chase building with parking available directly behind the building. It's also close to public transportation. We're hoping those completing the training will be able to facilitate groups held every other week at our Newark center. We have Imagine a world where no child grieves alone



ot support that we're planning to launch a new Night of Support in Newark. We're also looking for a few new facilitators for our Mountainside location.

MISSY RODRIGUEZ RECOGNIZED DURING THE 2024 ROSE PARADE

Missy Rodriguez of Short Hills, NJ, was part of the world's most visible campaign to inspire organ and tissue donation as she served as a float rider on OneLegacy's Donate Life Rose Parade float in Pasadena, CA. Missy was selected to ride on the float by NJ Sharing Network, the federally designated non-profit organization responsible for the recovery of donated organs and tissue for transplant in the Garden State.

"Being part of the Rose Parade was an overwhelming experience. I was honored to meet countless incredible people and spread our message about the power of organ and tissue donation and transplantation," said Missy. "I felt my donor angel proudly watching from above as I rode on the float, sharing our message loud and clear. My own journey drives me to advocate for this cause. It's about giving hope to those waiting for the gift of life."

ABOUT MISSY RODRIGUEZ

At the age of ten, Missy Rodriguez received a successful life-saving liver transplant. Today, Rodriguez is approaching the fortieth anniversary of her transplant - a milestone that will make her one of the longest liver transplant survivors in history. She thrives in her professional, social, and athletic pursuits.

Rodriguez went to great lengths to keep her medical history a secret for most of her life. However, in 2015, Rodriguez had a dramatic change of heart after she underwent emergency surgery. She decided it was "her turn to give rather than receive." Since then, Rodriguez has turned her passion into purpose as an advocate for organ donation. She serves as a mentor, priding herself as a resource for pre- and posttransplant patients.

Rodriguez is a certified volunteer for NJ Sharing Network and principal for Missy's Miracle Scholarship Fund. This Sharing Network Foundation program supports initiatives that raise awareness for organ and tissue donation and provides scholarships for high school students touched by the Foundation's life-saving mission. To date, she has raised over \$120,000.

Rodriguez is a well-recognized community volunteer and advocate for donation and transplantation. She has been featured in dozens of television and print news media spotlights and acknowledged for her charitable efforts by local neighborhood businesses, alliances, and religious institutions. Her efforts have also been publicly recognized by the Township of Millburn, NJ, with an official proclamation. Rodriguez also participates in the Sharing Network Foundation's 5K Celebration of Life and has won gold medals in tennis at the Transplant Games of America as a member of Team Liberty.

Rodriguez resides in Short Hills, NJ, with her husband, Brett, and their three sons, Jesse, Reece, and Mack.

For over 20 years, OneLegacy's Donate Life Rose Parade® float has inspired people worldwide to save and heal lives with the powerful message of organ and tissue donation.

On New Years Day, liver transplant recipient The 2024 float, Woven Together: The Dance of Life, showcased the culture of the Hopi, native to the American Southwest. Transplant recipients (including Missy Rodriguez) rode on the float and living donors walked alongside it. Memorial floragraphs honoring organ and tissue donor heroes were also displayed on the float. The floragraphs were made entirely of flowers, seeds, and organic materials.

NJ MOM CELEBRATING 10-YEAR ANNIVERSARY OF LIVER TRANSPLANT

celebrating an incredible milestone as she marks the 10-year anniversary of her life-saving liver transplant. Renee, 52, has not only cherished every moment of her life since her successful transplant but is also passionate about advocating for NJ Sharing Network, the nonprofit organization responsible for the recovery and placement of donated organs and tissue for transplant in the Garden State. She actively shares her story with others to encourage more people to register as organ and tissue donors.

"I continue to feel overwhelmed, humble, and grateful," said Renee. "Giving someone a second chance as an organ and tissue donor is such a special and amazing gift of love."

Renee's journey began when she was 16 years old and was diagnosed with Polycystic Kidney Disease (PKD). Her father, who also battled PKD, had received a life-saving kidney transplant that gave him an additional 35 years of life. Renee later developed Polycystic Liver Disease (PLD) after giving birth to her two boys. She was added to the liver transplant list in 2009.

"Waiting for the liver transplant phone call, I Renee Reilly, a resident of Madison, NJ, is felt hopeless at times, tired, anxious, and I didn't think I would ever get 'the call,'" said Renee.

The pivotal moment in Renee's journey arrived unexpectedly on a day filled with emotional turmoil. Her father had been in the hospital for weeks due to complications from a previous surgery. Renee had just visited him when she received 'The Call' from the transplant center.

"I began to cry because I was filled with emotions, from joy and excitement to worry about my family and guilt about receiving such a precious gift. But my husband, John, and my sons, Ian and Brendan, served as a source of strength and kept me focused because they were excited to know that I was going to get a liver transplant," said Renee.

On August 6, 2013, Renee's liver transplant surgery was a success, giving her a new lease on life. In 2017, Renee's kidneys started to fail. Fortunately, she received a kidney transplant in 2018, sparing her from the hardships of dialysis treatments.

The transformation in Renee's life posttransplants has been remarkable. She now enjoys all of her favorite hobbies, including gardening, knitting/crocheting, sewing, and spending time with her family.

"Thanks to my organ donors and the miracle of transplantation, I have been there for unforgettable moments like my boys' graduations. I am now able to give hugs again without any pain due to my enlarged liver," said Renee. "Now, I am focused on sharing my story to give hope for those waiting for the gift of life and inspire everyone to register as organ and tissue donors."

According to United Network for Organ Sharing (UNOS), there are over 100,000 Americans – nearly 4,000 of whom live in New Jersey - waiting for a life-saving transplant. One organ and tissue donor can save eight lives and enhance the lives of over 75 others. An active presence in the jazz world since the 1970s, Reid has recorded over 500 albums and can be heard on recordings with Dexter Gordon, Andrew Hill, The Thad Jones/Mel Lewis Quartet, Kenny Barron, Stan Getz, J.J. Johnson, Lee Konitz, and Jack DeJohnette, among others. His reputation as an educator is equal to that of his musical achievements. Reid's book, The Evolving Bassist

(Myriad Limited, 1974), remains the industry standard for double bass methodology.
